A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to electrical safety and fire prevention;
- 2 updating references; clarifying duties of the state fire
- 3 marshal and cities and revising experience requirements for
- 4 limited technician and low voltage technician licenses;
- 5 extending local inspection bodies authority over appeals as
- 6 specified; providing for rulemaking; and providing for an
- 7 effective date.

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9 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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- 11 **Section 1.** W.S. 16-6-501(a)(intro) and (b) through
- 12 (d), 16-6-502, 35-9-102(a)(xi) and (xiii), 35-9-121(d) and
- 13 35-9-126(a) are amended to read:

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- 15 **16-6-501**. Building plans and specifications; required
- 16 facilities; elevators; curb ramps; inspections; exceptions.

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2 (a) The plans and specifications for the construction 3 of or additions to all buildings for general public use 4 built by the state or any governmental subdivision, school district or other public administrative body within the 5 state, shall provide facilities and features conforming 6 with the specifications set forth in the publication 7 entitled "American Standard Specifications for Making 8 Buildings and Facilities Accessible to and Usable by the 9 10 Physically Handicapped" (U.S. Patent No. A117.1-1961) as approved October 31, 1961, by the American Standards 11 12 Association, now called the American National Standards 13 Institute, Inc 2010 Americans with Disabilities Act 14 standards for accessible design. Elevators shall conform to these standards and shall be installed in multiple-story 15 16 buildings to serve all levels normally used by the general 17 public. Elevators shall have the following features:

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(b) Every curb or sidewalk to be constructed or reconstructed in Wyoming, where both are provided and intended for public use, whether constructed with public or private funds, shall provide a ramp at points of intersection between pedestrian and motorized lines of

travel and no less than two (2) curb ramps per lineal 1 2 block. Design for curb ramps shall be in accordance with rules and regulations promulgated by the Wyoming department 3 4 of transportation and shall take into consideration the needs of all physically handicapped persons including blind 5 pedestrians. Existing design standards will be available 6 from the governor's committee for employment of the 7 8 handicapped. If future improvements in the curb ramp design 9 will benefit handicapped and elderly persons, designs 10 stipulated in this article may be altered after full 11 hearings on the proposed changes by the administrator of 12 the division of vocational rehabilitation, the program 13 manager of the governor's committee on employment of people 14 with disabilities and the state fire marshal. 15 16 Except as provided in this subsection, the state (C) fire marshal or city engineer shall inspect any structure 17 described in subsection (a) of this section at the request 18 19 of any person. Curb ramps shall be inspected by the city at

the request of any person and shall be modified or

reconstructed by the contracting authority to meet the

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requirements of W.S. 16-6-501 through 16-6-504.

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(d) Exceptions for good cause may be granted by the 1 2 state fire marshal in consultation with the administrator 3 of the division of vocational rehabilitation, the program manager of the governor's committee on employment of people 4 5 with disabilities, and the occupational health and safety 6 commission chairman for any structure described in subsection (a) of this section or by the city for curb 7 8 ramps. 9 16-6-502. Building plans and specifications; state 10 11 fire marshal; review and approval. 12 13 All plans and specifications for the construction of or additions to buildings for general public use, built by the

14 state or any governmental subdivision, school district or 15 16 other public administrative body within this state, shall be submitted for review and approval by the state fire 17 18 marshal, who shall approve if he finds the plans provide 19 facilities which conform to the specifications set forth in 20 "American Standard Specifications for Making Buildings and 21 Facilities Accessible to and Usable by the Physically Handicapped" (U.S. Patent No. A117.1-1961) as approved 22 23 October 31, 1961, by the American Standards Association,

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10 **35-9-121.** Local enforcement.

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12 (d) A municipality or county which has enforcement 13 authority under this section shall create its own appeals 14 boards to determine the suitability of alternate materials 15 and types of construction and to interpret and grant 16 variances from adopted codes or standards. The boards shall be appointed and removed by the governing body of the 17 18 municipality or county, but the person making the decision 19 upon which the appeal is based shall not be a member of the

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appeal board.

22 **35-9-126.** Licensing of master electricians,

23 journeymen electricians, low voltage technicians, limited

1 technicians; temporary permits; reciprocal licenses; master

electrician of record for only 1 electrical contractor; 2

3 technician of record for only 1 low voltage or limited

4 electrical contractor.

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(a) Applicants for master electrician, journeymen electrician, low voltage technician and limited technician 7 8 licenses shall apply to the chief electrical inspector on a form furnished by the department and accompanied by the 9 required examination fee. 10 The form shall state the 11 applicant's full name, his address, the extent of his 12 experience and other information required by 13 department. An applicant who complies with the rules of the department, is qualified, successfully completes the 14 examination and pays the required license fee shall be 15 issued the proper license by the chief electrical inspector 16 17 which bears the date of issue. A master license, low 18 voltage technician license and limited technician license 19 shall expire on July 1 in the third year following the year 20 of issue. A journeyman license shall expire on January 1 21 in the third year following the year of issue. $\frac{A}{A}$ 22 voltage technician license shall expire on July 1 in the 23 third year following the year of issue. A limited

1 technician license shall expire on July 1 in the third year 2 following the year of issue. Credit for time spent in any 3 electrical school shall be given to master electricians, 4 journeyman electricians, low voltage technicians or limited 5 technicians for time spent in classes up to a total of two (2) years, or four thousand (4,000) hours, on the work 6 experience requirements. 7 8 9 **Section 2.** W.S. 16-6-501(a)(i) through (v) and 10 35-9-126(e) through (g) are repealed. 11 12 Section 3. This act is effective July 1, 2015. 13
