1 AN ACT relating to electrical safety and fire prevention;

2 updating references; removing requirements relating to

3 elevators in buildings as specified; clarifying duties of

4 the state fire marshal and cities and revising experience

5 requirements for limited technician and low voltage

6 technician licenses; extending local inspection bodies

7 authority over appeals as specified; providing for

8 rulemaking; and providing for an effective date.

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10 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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12 **Section 1.** W.S. 16-6-501(a)(intro) and (b) through

13 (d), 16-6-502, 35-9-102(a)(xi) and (xiii), 35-9-121(d) and

14 35-9-126(a) are amended to read:

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1 16-6-501. Building plans and specifications; required facilities; elevators; curb ramps; inspections; exceptions. 2 3 4 (a) The plans and specifications for the construction of or additions to all buildings for general public use 5 built by the state or any governmental subdivision, school 6 district or other public administrative body within the 7 state, shall provide facilities and features conforming 8 9 with the specifications set forth in the publication 10 entitled "American Standard Specifications for Making Buildings and Facilities Accessible to and Usable by the 11 12 Physically Handicapped" (U.S. Patent No. A117.1-1961) as 13 approved October 31, 1961, by the American Standards 14 Association, now called the American National Standards Institute, Inc. Elevators shall be installed in multiple-15 16 story buildings to serve all levels normally used by general public. Elevators shall have the following 17 features: accessibility and supplemental accessibility 18 19 requirements of the 2012 edition of the International 20 Building Code. 21 22 Every curb or sidewalk to be constructed or 23 reconstructed in Wyoming, where both are provided and

intended for public use, whether constructed with public or 1 shall provide 2 private funds, a ramp at points of 3 intersection between pedestrian and motorized lines of 4 travel and no less than two (2) curb ramps per lineal block. Design for curb ramps shall be in accordance with 5 rules and regulations promulgated by the Wyoming department 6 of transportation and shall take into consideration the 7 8 needs of all physically handicapped persons including blind 9 pedestrians. Existing design standards will be available 10 from the governor's committee for employment of the 11 handicapped. If future improvements in the curb ramp design 12 will benefit handicapped and elderly persons, designs stipulated in this article may be altered after 13 hearings on the proposed changes by the administrator of 14 15 the division of vocational rehabilitation, the program 16 manager of the governor's committee on employment of people 17 with disabilities and the state fire marshal.

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Except as provided in this subsection, the state fire marshal or city engineer, or their designee, shall inspect any structure described in subsection (a) of this section at the request of any person. Curb ramps shall be inspected by the city at the request of any person and

1 shall be modified or reconstructed by the contracting 2 authority to meet the requirements of W.S. 16-6-501 through 3 16-6-504. 4 5 Exceptions for good cause may be granted by the state fire marshal in consultation with the administrator 6 7 of the division of vocational rehabilitation, the program 8 manager of the governor's committee on employment of people 9 with disabilities, and the occupational health and safety 10 commission chairman for any structure described in 11 subsection (a) of this section or by the city for curb 12 ramps. 13 14 16-6-502. Building plans and specifications; state 15 fire marshal; review and approval. 16 17 All plans and specifications for the construction of or additions to buildings for general public use, built by the 18 19 state or any governmental subdivision, school district or 20 other public administrative body within this state, shall 21 be submitted for review and approval by the state fire 22 marshal, who shall approve if he finds the plans provide 23 facilities which conform to the specifications set forth in

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"American Standard Specifications for Making Buildings and 1 2 Facilities Accessible to and Usable by the Physically 3 Handicapped" (U.S. Patent No. A117.1-1961) as approved 4 October 31, 1961, by the American Standards Association, 5 now called the American National Standards Institute, Inc., and W.S. 16-6-501, subject however to the waiver specified 6 above the accessibility and supplemental accessibility 7 8 requirements of the 2012 edition of the International 9 Building Code. 10 35-9-102. Definitions. 11 12 13 (a) As used in W.S. 35-9-101 through 35-9-130: 14 15 (xi) "Limited technician" means person 16 licensed by the department who has two (2) years experience met the minimum experience requirements as prescribed by 17 18 board rules and regulations in the portion of the electrical wiring industry covered by his limited license. 19 20 and The limited technician shall have technical knowledge 21 to install and supervise the installation of electrical 22 equipment associated with the type of limited electrical

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license held in accordance with the National Electrical 1 2 Code and city, county and state ordinances and regulations; 3 4 (xiii) "Low voltage technician" means a person licensed by the department who has two (2) years experience 5 met the minimum experience requirements as prescribed by 6 board rules and regulations in the portion of the 7 8 electrical wiring industry covered by his low voltage 9 license. and The low voltage technician shall have 10 technical knowledge to install and supervise the 11 installation of electrical equipment associated with the 12 type of low voltage electrical license held in accordance 13 with the National Electrical Code and city, county and 14 state ordinances and regulations; 15 35-9-121. Local enforcement. 16 17 18 (d) A municipality or county which has enforcement 19 authority under this section shall create its own appeals 20 boards to determine the suitability of alternate materials 21 and types of construction and to interpret and grant

variances from adopted codes or standards. The boards

shall be appointed and removed by the governing body of the

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- 1 municipality or county, but the person making the decision
- 2 upon which the appeal is based shall not be a member of the

3 appeal board.

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- 5 35-9-126. Licensing of master electricians,
- 6 journeymen electricians, low voltage technicians, limited
- 7 technicians; temporary permits; reciprocal licenses; master
- 8 electrician of record for only 1 electrical contractor;
- 9 technician of record for only 1 low voltage or limited
- 10 electrical contractor.

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- 12 (a) Applicants for master electrician, journeymen
- 13 electrician, low voltage technician and limited technician
- 14 licenses shall apply to the chief electrical inspector on a
- 15 form furnished by the department and accompanied by the
- 16 required examination fee. The form shall state the
- 17 applicant's full name, his address, the extent of his
- 18 experience and other information required by the
- 19 department. An applicant who complies with the rules of the
- 20 department board, is qualified, successfully completes the
- 21 examination and pays the required license fee shall be
- 22 issued the proper license by the chief electrical inspector
- 23 which bears the date of issue. A master license, low

1	voltage technician license and limited technician license
2	shall expire on July 1 in the third year following the year
3	of issue. A journeyman license shall expire on January 1
4	in the third year following the year of issue. A low
5	voltage technician license shall expire on July 1 in the
6	third year following the year of issue. A limited
7	technician license shall expire on July 1 in the third year
8	following the year of issue. Credit for time spent in any
9	electrical school shall be given to master electricians,
10	journeyman electricians, low voltage technicians or limited
11	technicians for time spent in classes up to a total of two
12	(2) years, or four thousand (4,000) hours, on the work
13	experience requirements.
