- 14 preschool children with disabilities who are five (5) years

8 (a) Every parent, guardian or other person having

9 control or charge of any child who is a resident of this

10 state and whose seventh birthday falls on or before

11 September 15 August 1 of any year and who has not yet

12 attained his sixteenth birthday or completed the tenth

13 grade shall be required to send such child to, and such

14 child shall be required to attend, a public or private

15 school each year, during the entire time that the public

16 schools shall be in session in the district in which the

17 pupil resides; provided, that the board of trustees of each

18 school district may exempt any child from the operation of

19 this article when:

21 21-4-301. Schools to be free and accessible to all

22 children; minimum school year.

Except as otherwise provided by law, the public schools of 1 each school district in the state shall at all times be 2 3 equally free and accessible to all children resident 4 therein of five (5) years of age as of September 15 of the 5 applicable school year August 1 of the year in which they may register in kindergarten as provided in W.S. 6 21-4-302(b) and under the age of twenty-one (21), subject 7 8 to regulations of the board of trustees. Each school district shall operate its schools and its classes for a 9 10 minimum of one hundred seventy-five (175) days each school 11 year unless an alternative schedule has been approved by 12 state board. Prior to submission of a proposed alternative schedule to the state board, the board of 13 trustees shall hold at least two (2) advertised public 14 meetings within the district, at which the board shall 15 16 present the proposed alternative schedule and respond to 17 questions and comments. Any school public district operating under an alternative schedule shall annually 18 19 evaluate the effectiveness of that schedule in meeting the 20 educational goals and purposes for which the schedule was 21 adopted.

- 4 (a) A pupil may register in the first grade in the 5 public schools of this state in the year in which his sixth
- 6 birthday falls on or before September 15 August 1.

- 8 (b) A pupil may register in kindergarten in the
- 9 public schools of this state in the year in which his fifth
- 10 birthday falls on or before September 15 August 1.

- 12 (c) The board of trustees of a school district may
- 13 permit the enrollment of pupils in a part-time preschool
- 14 program with a curriculum based on developmentally
- 15 appropriate practices funded by the district. The school
- 16 district may:

- 18 (ii) Establish a minimum attendance age for the
- 19 program, but a pupil must have attained at least his third
- 20 birthday on or before September 15 August 1 of the year in
- 21 which that pupil enrolls. A pupil who enrolls in such a
- 22 preschool program shall not be included within the
- 23 district's average daily membership (ADM) for purposes of

- 1 receiving state funds or within any other school funding
- 2 formula for purposes of receiving funds from the state,
- 3 unless the pupil has attained the minimum age for
- 4 registration in kindergarten as provided in subsection (b)
- 5 of this section;

- 7 21-13-315. Costs of court ordered placement of
- 8 children in private residential treatment facilities, group
- 9 homes, day treatment programs and juvenile detention
- 10 facilities.

- 12 (k) Except as otherwise provided by law, this section
- 13 applies to children who are at least five (5) years of age
- 14 as of September 15 of the applicable school year August 1
- 15 of the year in which they may register in kindergarten as
- 16 provided in W.S. 21-4-302(b) but who are under twenty-one
- 17 (21) years of age.

- 19 **Section 2.** The change in the age requirement for
- 20 registering in the first grade as provided in this act
- 21 shall not apply to students who were registered to attend
- 22 kindergarten in the public schools of this state during
- 23 school year 2020-2021.
