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- 7 **Section 1.** W.S. 21-2-704, 21-3-110(a) by creating a
- 8 new paragraph (xxxvii), 21-4-102(a)(intro), 21-4-301,
- 9 21-4-302(a), (b) and (c)(ii) and 21-13-315(k) are amended

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12 **21-2-704.** School district responsibility.

- 1 Notwithstanding any other provisions of this act, any
- 2 preschool children with disabilities who are five (5) years
- 3 of age on or before <u>August 1 or</u> September 15 <u>if pursuant to</u>
- 4 <u>an agreement under W.S. 21-3-110(a)(xxxvii)</u> and who are
- 5 receiving services from a school district shall be the
- 6 responsibility of that school district.

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8 21-3-110. Duties of boards of trustees.

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- 10 (a) The board of trustees in each school district
- 11 shall:

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- 13 (xxxvii) Establish a process in policy to
- 14 approve or deny requests made by a pupil's parent or
- 15 guardian based on the pupil's kindergarten readiness
- 16 assessment score to assess whether the pupil is
- 17 sufficiently mature to be admitted to the applicable grade.

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- 22 (a) Every parent, guardian or other person having
- 23 control or charge of any child who is a resident of this

1 state and whose seventh birthday falls on or before August 1 or September 15 if pursuant to an agreement under W.S. 2 3 <u>21-3-110(a)(xxxvii)</u> of any year and who has not yet 4 attained his sixteenth birthday or completed the tenth 5 grade shall be required to send such child to, and such child shall be required to attend, a public or private 6 school each year, during the entire time that the public 7 8 schools shall be in session in the district in which the 9 pupil resides; provided, that the board of trustees of each 10 school district may exempt any child from the operation of

21-4-301. Schools to be free and accessible to all children; minimum school year.

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16 Except as otherwise provided by law, the public schools of 17 each school district in the state shall at all times be equally free and accessible to all children resident 18 19 therein of five (5) years of age as of August 1 or 20 September 15 of the applicable school year if pursuant to 21 an agreement under W.S. 21-3-110(a)(xxxvii) of the year in which they may register in kindergarten as provided in W.S. 22 23 21-4-302(b) and under the age of twenty-one (21), subject

1	to regulations of the board of trustees. Each school
2	district shall operate its schools and its classes for a
3	minimum of one hundred seventy-five (175) days each school
4	year unless an alternative schedule has been approved by
5	the state board. Prior to submission of a proposed
6	alternative schedule to the state board, the board of
7	trustees shall hold at least two (2) advertised public
8	meetings within the district, at which the board shall
9	present the proposed alternative schedule and respond to
10	public questions and comments. Any school district
11	operating under an alternative schedule shall annually
12	evaluate the effectiveness of that schedule in meeting the

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19 (a) A pupil may register in the first grade in the
20 public schools of this state in the year in which his sixth
21 birthday falls on or before August 1 or September 15 if
22 pursuant to an agreement under W.S. 21-3-110(a)(xxxvii).

1 (b) A pupil may register in kindergarten in the 2 public schools of this state in the year in which his fifth 3 birthday falls on or before <u>August 1 or</u> September 15 <u>if</u> 4 pursuant to an agreement under W.S. 21-3-110(a)(xxxvii). 5 (c) The board of trustees of a school district may 6 permit the enrollment of pupils in a part-time preschool 7 8 program with a curriculum based developmentally on 9 appropriate practices funded by the district. The school 10 district may: 11 12 (ii) Establish a minimum attendance age for the program, but a pupil must have attained at least his third 13 birthday on or before August 1 or September 15 if pursuant 14 to an agreement under W.S. 21-3-110(a)(xxxvii) of the year 15 16 in which that pupil enrolls. A pupil who enrolls in such a 17 preschool program shall not be included within the

20 formula for purposes of receiving funds from the state,

district's average daily membership (ADM) for purposes of

receiving state funds or within any other school funding

21 unless the pupil has attained the minimum age for

22 registration in kindergarten as provided in subsection (b)

Costs of court ordered placement 3 children in private residential treatment facilities, group 4 homes, day treatment programs and juvenile detention 5 facilities. 6 (k) Except as otherwise provided by law, this section 7 applies to children who are at least five (5) years of age 8 as of August 1 or September 15 of the applicable school 9 10 year if pursuant to an agreement under W.S. 21-3-110(a)(xxxvii) of the year in which they may register 11 12 in kindergarten as provided in W.S. 21-4-302(b) but who are 13 under twenty-one (21) years of age. 14 Section 2. The change in the age requirement for 15 16 registering in the first grade as provided in this act shall not apply to students who were registered to attend 17 kindergarten in the public schools of this state during 18 19 school year 2020-2021. 20 21 Section 3. This act is effective August 1, 2021.
