A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to vacancies in office; removing state and 2 county party central committees from process of filling vacancies in statewide and county elective offices 3 specified; providing for management council submission of 4 qualified nominees for vacancies in office of United States 5 6 senator or in any state office other than the office of justice of the supreme court and the office of district 7 court judge; providing for boards of county commissioners 8 to fill vacancies in county elective offices as specified; 9 and providing for an effective date. 10

12 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

- 14 **Section 1.** W.S. 18-3-524(a)(intro) and
- 15 22-18-111(a)(i) and (ii) are amended to read:

17 18-3-524. Appointments to fill vacancies; term.

2	(a) Within twenty (20) days after the office of any
3	county commissioner becomes vacant the remaining members of
4	the board shall declare a vacancy to exist and immediately
5	give notice of the vacancy in writing to the chairman of
6	the county central committee of the political party which
7	the member whose office is vacant represented at the time
8	of his election under W.S. 22 6 120(a)(vii), or at the time
9	of his appointment if not elected to office. The chairman
10	of the county central committee shall within twenty (20)
11	days after receipt of the notice call a meeting of the
12	county central committee. At the meeting the committee
13	shall select three (3) persons qualified to fill the
14	vacancy and transmit the names to the board of county
15	commissioners. The board of county commissioners shall fill
16	the vacancy within twenty (20) days after receiving the
17	list from the county central committee declaring the
18	<u>vacancy</u> by appointing one (1) of the persons whose names
19	are submitted by the county central committee qualified
20	person who is of the political party which the member whose
21	office is vacant represented at the time of his election
22	under W.S. 22-6-120(a)(vii), or at the time of his
23	appointment if not elected to office:

Any vacancy in any other elective office in the 4 5 state except representative in congress or the board of trustees of a school or community college district, shall 6 be filled by the governing body, or as otherwise provided 7 in this section, by appointment of a temporary successor. 8 9 The person appointed shall serve until a successor for the 10 remainder of the unexpired term is elected at the next 11 general election and takes office on the first Monday of the following January. Provided, if a vacancy in a four 12 13 (4) year term of office occurs in the term's second or subsequent years after the first day for filing 14 application for nomination pursuant to W.S. 22-5-209, no 15 election to fill the vacancy shall be held and the 16 17 temporary successor appointed shall serve the remainder of the unexpired term. The following apply: 18

20 (i) If a vacancy occurs in the office of United
21 States senator or in any state office other than the office
22 of justice of the supreme court and the office of district
23 court judge, the governor shall immediately notify in
24 writing the chairman of the state central committee of the

political party which the last incumbent represented at the 1 time of his election under W.S. 22 6 120(a)(vii), or at the 2 3 time of his appointment if not elected to office management 4 council of the legislature. The chairman shall call a 5 meeting of the state central committee management council to be held not later than fifteen (15) days after he 6 receives notice of the vacancy. At the meeting the state 7 central committee management council shall select and 8 9 transmit to the governor the names of three (3) persons of the political party which the last incumbent represented at 10 the time of his election under W.S. 22-6-120(a)(vii), or at 11 the time of his appointment if not elected to office who 12 13 are qualified to fill the vacancy. If the incumbent who 14 has vacated office did not represent a political party at the time of his election, or at the time of his appointment 15 if not elected to office, the management council shall 16 17 select and transmit to the governor the names of three (3) persons qualified to fill the vacancy. Within five (5) 18 19 days after receiving these three (3) names, the governor shall fill the vacancy by temporary appointment of one (1) 20 of the three (3) to hold the office; . If the incumbent who 21 22 has vacated office did not represent a political party at 23 the time of his election, or at the time of his appointment 24 if not elected to office, the governor shall notify in

1 writing the chairman of all state central committees of parties registered with the secretary of state. The state 2 3 central committees shall submit to the governor, within 4 fifteen (15) days after notice of the vacancy, the name of 5 one (1) person qualified to fill the vacancy. The governor shall also cause to be published in a newspaper of general 6 circulation in the state notice of the vacancy in office. 7 8 Qualified persons who do not belong to a party may, within 9 fifteen (15) days after publication of the vacancy in 10 office, submit a petition signed by one hundred (100) 11 registered voters, seeking consideration for appointment to the office. Within five (5) days after receiving the names 12 13 of qualified persons, the governor shall fill the vacancy by temporary appointment to the office, from the names 14 15 submitted or from those petitioning for appointment;

office, except as provided in W.S. 18-3-524, the board of county commissioners of the county in which the vacancy occurs shall, immediately notify in writing the chairman of the county central committee of the political party which the last incumbent represented at the time of his election under W.S. 22-6-120(a)(vii), or at the time of his appointment if not elected to office. The chairman shall

call a meeting of the county central committee to be held 1 not later than fifteen (15) days after he—the board 2 receives notice of the vacancy, . At the meeting the county 3 4 central committee shall select and transmit to the board of 5 county commissioners the names of three (3) persons qualified to fill the vacancy. Within five (5) days after 6 receiving these three (3) names, the board of county 7 commissioners shall fill the vacancy by appointment of one 8 9 (1) of the three (3) person to hold the office who is of the political party which the last incumbent represented at 10 11 the time of his election under W.S. 22-6-120(a)(vii), or at the time of his appointment if not elected to office. If 12 13 the incumbent who has vacated office did not represent a political party at the time of his election, or at the time 14 of his appointment if not elected to office, the county 15 commissioners shall publish in a newspaper of general 16 circulation in the county, notice that within fifteen (15) 17 days after publication any qualified person may make 18 application directly to the county commissioners for 19 appointment to fill the vacancy. Within twenty (20) days 20 21 after the publication of the vacancy in office the county 22 commissioners shall fill the vacancy by appointment of one 23 (1) person qualified from those submitting applications;
