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1 It is a discriminatory or unfair employment (a) 2 practice: 3 4 (v) For an employer to: 5 (A) Seek, orally or in writing, personally or 6 7 through an agent, the salary history information of a 8 prospective employee; 9 10 (B) Rely on the salary history information of a prospective employee as a factor in determining whether to 11 12 offer employment to the prospective employee or what salary to offer the prospective employee; 13 14 15 (C) Nothing in this paragraph shall prohibit 16 a prospective employee from voluntarily and without prompting 17 disclosing salary history information to an employer, in which case this paragraph shall not prohibit the employer 18 from considering or relying on that salary history 19 20 information in determining whether to offer employment to the prospective employee or what salary to offer the prospective 21 22 employee.

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1 (d) As used in this section: 2 3 (i) "Qualified disabled person" means a disabled 4 person who is capable of performing a particular job, or who 5 would be capable of performing a particular job with reasonable accommodation to his disability: 6 7 (ii) "Salary history information" includes 8 9 compensation and benefits but shall not include information 10 disclosable to the public pursuant to federal or state law, including the federal Freedom of Information Act, 5 U.S.C. § 11 552, as amended, or W.S. 16-4-201 through 16-4-205. 12 13 14 Section 2. This act is effective July 1, 2019. 15
