1 AN ACT relating to the emergency expenses of government; 2 providing definitions; providing appropriations; amending and repealing prior appropriations of COVID-19 relief 3 4 funds; specifying conditions on the appropriation and expenditure of COVID-19 relief funds; amending prior 5 conditions on the reduction and prioritization of COVID-19 б 7 relief funds; providing for the reversion of unexpended 8 funds; authorizing emergency government programs; 9 authorizing rulemaking; requiring reporting; specifying 10 applicability; providing for priority of appropriations; 11 and providing for an effective date.

13 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 14

15 **Section 1**.

16

1 (a) As used in this act: 2 3 (i) "Agency" means any governmental unit or 4 branch of government receiving an appropriation under this 5 act; 6 7 (ii) "Appropriation" means the authorizations granted by the legislature under this act 8 to make 9 expenditures from and to incur obligations against the funds 10 as specified; 11 12 (iii) "ARPD" means American Rescue Plan Act direct funds, which are any unexpended, unobligated funds 13 14 received by the state of Wyoming through the Coronavirus 15 State Fiscal Recovery Fund established under section 602 of title VI of the federal Social Security Act, as created by 16 section 9901 of the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, P.L. 17 117-2. "ARPD" shall not include expenditures authorized 18 19 under the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, P.L. 117-2, 20 section 602(c)(1)(C) for revenue replacement for the provision of government services to the extent of the state 21 of Wyoming's reduction in revenue; 22 23

This appropriation to the governor's office is for purposes of 18 responding to the COVID-19 public health emergency. 19 20 2. (a) This appropriation to the governor's office is for distribution 21 to or through the Wyoming business council, department of workforce 22 services, University of Wyoming or Wyoming community college commission 23 and community colleges for: 24 25 (i) Pre-apprenticeships and apprenticeships; 26 27 (ii) Targeted healthcare workforce programs; 28

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1	(iii) Targeted early childhood workforce programs;
2	
3	(iv) Dislocated and underemployed talent transition
4	programs;
5	
6	(v) Workforce development for targeted populations who do
7	not qualify for other assistance, including prisoners released on
8	parole;
9	
10	(vi) Assistance to former Wyoming residents who have intent
11	to return to Wyoming for careers;
12	
13	(vii) Economic development training for state, local and
14	private economic development professions.
15	
16	(b) No funds from this appropriation shall be expended on post-
17	secondary education other than for career and technical education
18	programs determined by the governor to be critical to the Wyoming
19	workforce.
20	
21	3. This appropriation to the department of state parks and cultural
22	resources is for products, projects and grants in response to the COVID-
23	19 public health emergency that qualify as ARPD expenditures.
24	

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4. This appropriation to the department of state parks and cultural
 resources, office of outdoor recreation, is for qualifying ARPD
 expenditures.

4

5 5. This appropriation to the department of transportation is for 6 qualifying ARPD state or local government expenditures related to the 7 WyoLink statewide public safety interoperable radio communications 8 system, hardware and network. This appropriation is for purposes of 9 assisting Wyoming's continued response to the COVID-19 public health 10 emergency and improved connectivity of first responders.

11

12 6. This appropriation to the department of health is for purposes of 13 providing emergency funding for staff retention and for attracting 14 employees to health and human services provider groups. The department 15 of health shall provide priority for funding under this footnote to 16 employees who care for vulnerable populations and at risk populations.

17

18 7. This appropriation to the department of health is for purposes of 19 providing grants for health and human services innovations in rural 20 health care, long-term care, provision of human services, community 21 behavioral health, mental health and health information technology and 22 digital medical innovation.

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1 8. This appropriation to the department of health is for the 2 establishment of emergency medical dispatch statewide certification, 3 which could include training, hardware and other activities to improve 4 emergency response times and patient outcomes related to the emergency 5 response to the COVID-19 public health emergency. 6 7 9. This appropriation to the department of health is for purposes of 8 enhancing the capacity of the Wyoming 2-1-1 directory of resources to 9 provide comprehensive information and referrals to improve the emergency 10 response to the COVID-19 public health emergency. 11 12 10. This appropriation to the department of health is for purposes of 13 providing grants to stabilize emergency medical services. 14 15 11. This appropriation to the department of health is for purposes of 16 establishing an emergency medical services regionalization pilot 17 opportunity for the five (5) trauma regions across Wyoming and 18 investigating alternative options for emergency medical services that 19 improve access and reduce costs. Expenditure of this appropriation is 20 conditioned upon a match of funds.

21

12. This appropriation to the department of health, aging division, is
for the Wyoming home services program. This appropriation shall be used

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1 in lieu of expenditure of state general funds for any qualifying ARPD 2 expenditures for the Wyoming home services program.

3

4 13. This appropriation to the department of health is for purposes of 5 providing grants to health and human services providers to improve 6 existing infrastructure and to provide financial relief to providers who 7 are at imminent risk of closure. Grants shall be distributed to 8 providers as determined by the department.

9

10 15. This appropriation to the Wyoming community college commission is 11 for the Wyoming investment in nursing program. Notwithstanding the 12 source of funding for this appropriation, it is the intent of the 13 legislature that the standard budget of the Wyoming investment in 14 nursing program within the Wyoming community college commission be 15 requested from state general funds for the immediately succeeding fiscal 16 biennium.

17

18 16. (a) Of this appropriation to the office of state lands and 19 investments sixty-three million dollars (\$63,000,000.00)ARPD eighty-20 eight million dollars (\$88,000,000.00)ARPD shall be for purposes of 21 providing grants for qualifying health and human services infrastructure 22 and capital construction investments. Grants from this appropriation 23 shall be determined by the state loan and investment board. The

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1 following conditions shall apply to all grants provided under this
2 footnote:

3

4 (i) The maximum grant for any single project shall be ten
5 million dollars (\$10,000,000.00);

6

7 (ii) A needs analysis determination shall be conducted by 8 the state loan and investment board and may include a review of the 9 project sponsor's financial information, including but not limited to 10 revenue and other projections, budgets, financial statements and audits; 11

12 (iii) Expenditure of the grant by the recipient is 13 conditioned upon a match of funds in the ratio of one dollar (\$1.00) of 14 grant funds to not less than one dollar (\$1.00) from any other source, 15 including in-kind contributions to the project, except that the state 16 loan and investment board may modify this matching requirement upon 17 determination of need as provided in paragraph (a)(ii) of this 18 footnote;-

19

20 (iv) The state loan and investment board shall only 21 consider applications for grants available under this footnote that were 22 submitted on and before January 23, 2023 for grants under this footnote. 23

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1	(b) Of this appropriation to the office of state lands and
2	investments, seven million dollars (\$7,000,000.00)ARPD shall be for the
3	purpose of providing grants to community mental health center regional
4	crisis stabilization facilities and women's substance use disorder
5	facilities.
6	
7	(c) Of this appropriation to the office of state lands and
8	investments, fifteen million dollars (\$15,000,000.00)ARPD shall be for
9	the purpose of providing grants to rural health clinics. Grants from
10	this appropriation shall be determined by the state loan and investment
11	board. The following conditions shall apply to this appropriation:
12	
13	(i) Up to thirteen million dollars (\$13,000,000.00)ARPD may
14	be expended to provide grants related to costs incurred by rural health
15	clinics for qualifying infrastructure and capital construction
16	investments;
17	
18	(ii) Up to two million dollars (\$2,000,000.00)ARPD may be
19	expended to provide grants for rural telehealth pilot projects.
20	
21	(d) Of this appropriation to the office of state lands and
22	investments, fifteen million dollars (\$15,000,000.00)ARPD shall be for
23	the purpose of providing supplemental grants for projects approved in

24 2022 by the state loan and investment board under subsection (a) of

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this footnote. These supplemental grants shall only be for purposes of inflation related costs. The maximum supplemental grant for any single project under this subsection shall be five million dollars (\$5,000,000.00).

5

б 17. (a) This appropriation to the office of state lands and 7 investments is for administrative costs and merit based allocations of 8 competitive grant funding to cities, counties and tribal governments to 9 address the COVID-19 public health emergency or its negative economic 10 impacts. Applications for eligible water and wastewater projects shall 11 receive a lower priority from this appropriation than other eligible 12 applications. Subject to the limitations provided in this footnote, the 13 allocations of the competitive grant funding shall be determined by the 14 state loan and investment board.

15

16 (b) Of this appropriation to the office of state lands and 17 investments, five million dollars (\$5,000,000.00)ARPD shall be for the 18 purpose of providing grants to cities, counties and tribal governments 19 in Wyoming for unmet affordable housing needs through infrastructure, 20 including utilities.

21

22 18. (a) This appropriation to the office of state lands and 23 investments is for the allocation of competitive grant funding to 24 cities, counties, special districts and tribal governments for eligible

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1	water and wastewater projects. The allocation of the competitive grant
2	funding shall be determined by the state loan and investment board. The
3	following conditions shall apply to all grants provided under this
4	footnote:
5	
б	(i) The maximum grant for any single project shall be seven
7	million five hundred thousand dollars (\$7,500,000.00);
8	
9	(ii) Expenditure of the grant by the recipient is
10	conditioned upon a match of funds in the ratio of eighty-five cents
11	(\$0.85) of grant funds to not less than fifteen cents $($0.15)$ from
12	matching funds provided by the project sponsor <u>;</u> .
13	
14	(iii) The state loan and investment board shall only
15	consider applications for grants available under this footnote that were
16	submitted on and before January 23, 2023 for grants under this footnote.
17	
18	19. This appropriation to the University of Wyoming is for the family
19	medical residency program.
20	
21	20. This appropriation to the University of Wyoming WWAMI medical
22	education program is to be expended solely for student tuition and fees
23	if determined in writing by the Wyoming attorney general to be
24	permissible under state and federal law. The Wyoming attorney general's

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written determination shall be provided to the state auditor's office before funds are released for the university from this appropriation.

4 21. This appropriation to the department of corrections is for purposes
5 of resolving the substance use disorder treatment backlog created by the
6 COVID-19 public health emergency.

7

8 22. (a) This appropriation to the Wyoming business council is for 9 purposes of increasing broadband connectivity to improve access to and 10 meet the increased need for reliable high-speed internet service. In 11 administering funds distributed and expended under this footnote, the 12 Wyoming business council shall:

13

14 (i) Include performance requirements in its contracts with 15 grant recipients, which performance requirements shall, at a minimum, 16 require the grant recipient and any successor in interest to offer and 17 provide continuous service to broadband customers during at least the 18 first seven (7) years after substantial completion of the relevant 19 project for which grant funds were expended;

20

(ii) Strive to increase the availability of broadband services available in Wyoming rural, unserved and underserved areas in Wyoming cities, towns and counties;

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1 (iii) For middle-mile broadband projects as defined by W.S. 2 9-12-1501(h)(ii) that receive or expend funds from this appropriation, 3 require project recipients to allow last-mile broadband providers access 4 to those middle-mile conduits at a reasonable rate as determined by the 5 council;

б

7 (iv) For any projects that receive or expend funds from 8 this appropriation, implement buildout requirements that include 9 milestones and network performance testing requirements, as determined 10 by the council.

11

12 (b) Of the appropriation in subsection (a) of this footnote, 13 expenditure of fifteen million dollars (\$15,000,000.00)ARPD is 14 conditioned upon a match of funds in the ratio of one dollar (\$1.00) of 15 appropriated funds to not less than fifty cents (\$0.50) of private 16 sector matching funds from project participants. Private sector matching 17 funds provided under this subsection shall be accounted for in the 18 aggregate of appropriated funds expended and not on a per project basis. 19 Private sector matching funds provided under this subsection shall 20 include future maintenance commitments that will be expended within the 21 first three (3) years of the life of the project and any other allowable 22 expense authorized by the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act, P.L. 23 117-58.

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(c) It is the intent of the legislature that the appropriation in subsection (a) of this footnote leverage additional federal funds for broadband connectivity under the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act, P.L. 117-58 to the maximum extent possible and not less than one dollar (\$1.00) of appropriated funds to four dollars (\$4.00) of federal matching funds. 23. This appropriation to the supreme court is for the implementation

9 of electronic filing of court documents in the Wyoming circuit courts 10 and for associated maintenance and support as a mechanism to employ 11 technology to limit the number of members of the public who are present 12 in courthouses as a mitigation strategy to slow the spread of COVID-19.

13

14 24. This appropriation to the supreme court is for purposes of 15 implementing COVID-19 mitigation measures including, but not limited to 16 acquisition of personal protective equipment to slow the spread of 17 COVID-19. The supreme court may expend any funds not expended on COVID-18 19 mitigation measures for the study, planning and design of 19 diversionary treatments and systems of care for defendants with mental 20 and substance abuse illnesses.

21

22 25. This appropriation to the department of transportation is to 23 provide aid to commercial air providers to mitigate financial hardship, 24 including supporting payroll costs, lost pay and benefits for returning

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1 employees, support of operations and maintenance of existing equipment 2 and facilities.

3

4 26. This appropriation to the department of health is to procure5 twenty-four (24) hours per day suicide prevention services.

6

7 28. This appropriation to the department of health is for the purpose 8 of training one hundred three (103) mental health first aid trainers 9 across the state to include two (2) trainers in each county, one (1) 10 trainer in each school district, one (1) trainer in each community 11 college district and one (1) trainer in the University of Wyoming. This 12 appropriation is intended to increase access to mental health first aid 13 trainers for purposes of training community members to assist residents 14 experiencing mental health or substance abuse challenges due to the 15 COVID-19 pandemic.

16

17 29. (a) This appropriation to the department of health is for the 18 purpose of establishing a grant program for emergency medical service 19 providers and county and municipal law enforcement agencies to deliver 20 and improve access to mental health services for first responders as 21 defined by W.S. 27-14-102(a)(xxxi) and law enforcement officers. An 22 emergency medical service provider or county or municipal law 23 enforcement agency seeking a grant under this footnote shall apply to 24 the department detailing the provider's or agency's grant proposal on

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1 an application provided by the department. Grant proposals shall be 2 evaluated by the department and prioritized for grant funding based on 3 the following criteria:

4

5 (i) The degree to which the proposal will reasonably 6 achieve the intent of this program;

7

8 (ii) The adequacy of the proposal's approach to ensuring 9 that any mental health programming funded through the receipt of a 10 grant can be independently sustained by the emergency medical service 11 provider or county or municipal law enforcement agency into the future.

12

13 30. This Of this appropriation to the department of family services, 14 two hundred twenty-five thousand dollars (\$225,000.00)ARPD is for the 15 purpose of planning a system to maximize state and local food 16 distribution and minimize waste of donated and publicly purchased food 17 to feed needy children, families and elderly persons with the intent to 18 identify best practices and opportunities for enhancement and 19 improvement. Of this appropriation, three million twenty-five thousand 20 dollars (\$3,025,000.00) ARPD is to provide one (1) time grant funds to 21 Wyoming organizations and entities to implement recommendations from 22 the assessment and evaluation of the food distribution system to 23 Wyoming citizens who face food insecurity.

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1 31. This appropriation to the University of Wyoming's college of 2 health sciences is for purposes of setting up and developing an 3 accredited physician assistant training program capable of educating 4 and training cohorts of five (5) Wyoming physician assistant students 5 per year. The program shall work and align as closely as possible with б current medical education and training programs. The physician 7 assistant program may allow students to participate remotely from any 8 Wyoming community college as practicable.

9

10 32. This appropriation to the supreme court is for purposes of 11 assisting with the provision of civil legal needs of low-income 12 individuals, clients with special needs and other vulnerable populations 13 and improving access to legal services during the COVID-19 pandemic 14 through equal justice Wyoming. This appropriation shall be used by the 15 supreme court to implement a common case management system for nonprofit 16 civil legal aid providers, create an online triage portal for low-income 17 individuals allowing for increased access to civil legal services, 18 broaden access for limited English proficient individuals to the court 19 system through remote interpretation and upgrade the equal justice 20 Wyoming website, which serves as the central information repository for 21 clients seeking legal assistance.

4 2. This appropriation to the department of family services is to 5 provide educational, behavioral health, child welfare and juvenile 6 delinquency services to children who have profound and complex diagnoses 7 including mental health, intellectual disabilities and severe behavioral 8 issues.

9

10 3. (a) This appropriation to the department of workforce services is 11 for distribution to or through the Wyoming business council, department 12 of workforce services, University of Wyoming or Wyoming community 13 college commission and community colleges for:

14

15 (i) Pre-apprenticeships and apprenticeships; 16 17 (ii) Targeted healthcare workforce programs; 18 19 (iii) Targeted early childhood workforce programs; 20 21 (iv) Dislocated and underemployed talent transition 22 programs;

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1 (v) Workforce development for targeted populations who do 2 not qualify for other assistance, including prisoners released on 3 parole; 4 5 (vi) Assistance to former Wyoming residents who demonstrate 6 an intent to return to Wyoming for careers; 7 8 (vii) Economic development training for state, local and 9 private economic development professions. 10 11 (b) No funds from this appropriation shall be expended on post-12 secondary education other than for career and technical education 13 determined by the governor to be critical to the Wyoming workforce. 14 15 4. This appropriation to the department of family services is to 16 develop an integrated case management model for clients who are among 17 the most difficult to employ and whose barriers have kept them from re-18 entering the workforce after the COVID-19 pandemic. 19 20 5. This appropriation to the supreme court is to implement, expand and 21 improve court supervised treatment programs within the judicial branch. This appropriation shall only be effective if 2023 Senate File 0023 is 22 23 enacted into law. 24

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6. This appropriation to the department of family services is for the
 purposes of developing a program to provide grants, collect and monitor
 data and provide technical assistance to communities to establish or
 strengthen family resource centers.

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б 7. This appropriation to the office of state lands and investments is 7 for administrative costs and merit based allocation of competitive 8 grant funding to cities, counties and tribal governments in Wyoming for 9 capital development of community facilities that can serve as a meeting 10 area that can accommodate at least four hundred (400) persons in the 11 event of an emergency and that are located in a designated urban 12 renewal or redevelopment area that was impacted by the COVID-19 13 pandemic to address the COVID-19 public health emergency or its 14 negative economic impacts. The maximum grant for any single project 15 shall be four million dollars (\$4,000,000.00). Subject to the 16 limitations provided in this footnote, the allocations of the 17 competitive grant funding shall be determined by the state loan and 18 investment board.

1 Section 4. 2 3 4 (a) Funds appropriated under this act may be expended or obligated by the executive branch or judicial branch 5 6 subject to the following conditions: 7 8 (i) It is the intent of the legislature that the appropriations in this act not be included in the respective 9 10 agencies' standard budget for the immediately succeeding fiscal biennium, unless otherwise specifically provided; 11 12 13 (ii) The appropriations in this act shall not be 14 revised, changed, redistributed or increased pursuant to 15 W.S. 9-2-1005(b)(ii) and (iii); 16 (iii) The appropriations in this act shall not be 17 transferred or expended for any purpose other than the 18 19 purpose for which they are appropriated. 20 (b) No expenditure of funds shall be made under this 21 act except in accordance with state and federal laws, 22 23 regulations and orders.

14 Section **7.** To the the extent total sum of appropriations made under any law enacted through the 2023 15 16 general session exceed the amount of unexpended, unobligated American Rescue Plan Act direct funds available 17 18 for expenditure, the appropriations made under this act and 19 2022 Wyoming Session Laws, Chapter 50, Section 2, Section 20 400 as amended by section 2 of this act, shall be given 21 precedence.
