1 AN ACT relating to human trafficking; specifying 2 requirements for arrest and conviction of minors engaged in commercial sex acts; providing that a minor charged as a 3 result of engaging in a commercial sex act is rebuttably 4 presumed to be a victim of human sex trafficking; providing 5 6 that a minor who engages in any commercial sex act is a 7 neglected child in need of supervision; amending a definition; and providing for an effective date. 8

Victim defenses; vacating convictions. 2 3 (a) A victim of human trafficking is not criminally 4 liable for any commercial sex act or other criminal acts committed as a direct result of, or incident to, being a 5 victim of human trafficking in violation of W.S. 6-2-702 6 through 6-2-707. A minor who engages in a commercial sex 7 8 act: 9 10 (i) Shall not be subject to arrest or prosecution for violating W.S. 6-4-101 or other criminal 11 12 acts as a result of engaging in the commercial sex act 13 unless there is probable cause to believe that the minor was not subject to coercion and was not providing forced 14 services when engaging in the act; 15 16 17 (ii) Shall be rebuttably presumed to be a victim of human trafficking in any criminal charge as a result of 18 19 engaging in the commercial sex act, regardless of whether 20 any other person is identified or prosecuted as a result of 21 engaging in the commercial sex act. The presumption shall be overcome only by establishing beyond a reasonable doubt 22

that the minor was not subject to coercion and was not
