(a) A person who has pled guilty or nolo contendere
to or been convicted of a misdemeanor may petition the
convicting court for an expungement of the records of
conviction, subject to the following limitations:
(i) At least <u>five (5) three (3)</u> years have

7 passed for nonstatus offenses and at least one (1) year has 8 passed for status offenses as defined by W.S. 9 7-1-107(b)(iii) since the expiration of the terms of 10 sentence imposed by the court, including any periods of 11 probation or the completion of any program ordered by the 12 court;
