County road construction-competitive bidding-2.

A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to county road construction; increasing  
2 limit of projects not requiring competitive bidding; and  
3 providing for an effective date.

5 *Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:*

7 **Section 1.** W.S. 24-2-110(a) is amended to read:

9 **24-2-110. Cooperation with counties in construction**  
10 **and maintenance of county roads; allocation of costs;**  
11 **state-county road construction account established.**

13 (a) The board of county commissioners of each county  
14 shall establish a separate road construction and

1 maintenance fund solely for the construction and  
2 maintenance of county roads, bridges and culverts. Work  
3 using funds from the road construction and maintenance fund  
4 of a county shall be performed under contract awarded after  
5 competitive bidding if the estimated cost of the work  
6 exceeds ~~fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000.00)~~ one hundred  
7 thousand dollars (\$100,000.00). All work shall be performed  
8 under the immediate control and supervision of the board of  
9 county commissioners or its authorized representative and  
10 in accordance with county road standards as established by  
11 the Wyoming county road standards committee. The road  
12 construction and maintenance fund program is a supplement  
13 to federal aid, primary and secondary road programs in each  
14 county. The term "construction and maintenance" as used in  
15 this section means construction, reconstruction, surveys,  
16 mapping, right-of-way costs, bridges, culverts, general  
17 road maintenance and fencing. The county shall use existing  
18 grades, bridges and other physical items or facilities in  
19 order to minimize or avoid more costly relocation.

21 **Section 2.** This act is effective July 1, 2015.
