1 AN ACT relating to elections; amending procedures for 2 filling vacancies in specified federal and state offices; 3 requiring special elections as specified; making conforming amendments; and providing for an effective date. 4 5 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: б 7 8 **Section 1.** W.S. 9-1-212, 9-1-802(e), 9 22-2-101(a)(iii), 22-2-110(a), 22-2-111(a), 22-18-103, 22-18-105 through 22-18-109, 22-18-111(a)(intro) and 10 11 (iii)(intro) and 28-1-106 are amended to read: 12 13 9-1-212. 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2 Whenever the powers and duties of the office of the 3 governor of the state of Wyoming devolve upon any other 4 person as provided in W.S. 9-1-211(a), the person acting as governor shall continue to act as governor until the end of 5 the term of the governor if the office is assumed less than б sixty (60) days before the next general election. If the 7 8 office is assumed more than sixty (60) days before a 9 general election the person acting as governor shall issue 10 an additional proclamation calling for the election of a 11 governor to fill the unexpired term, which election shall 12 take place at the same time as the general election, and the election, together with the returns and canvass 13 thereof, shall be conducted in all respects as though it 14 was an original election for governor. When the state 15 16 canvassing board canvasses the vote of the election and 17 declares a person at the election to be elected as governor, the person call for a special election as 18 19 provided in W.S. 22-18-103 through 22-18-109. The 20 candidate issued a certificate of election pursuant to W.S. 21 22-18-109 shall, within thirty (30) days after the canvass of issuance of the certificate, or as soon thereafter as 22 23 possible, qualify and assume the duties and powers of

7	(a) Except for special elections to fill vacancies
8	for a congressman under W.S. 22-18-105 through 22-18-109,
9	periods of time are computed by excluding the specific day
10	and counting the prescribed number of days, including
11	Saturdays, Sundays and full legal holidays. If the first
12	day of a time period falls on a Saturday, Sunday or full
13	legal holiday, the preceding day which is not a Saturday,
14	Sunday or full legal holiday shall be used. If the last day
15	of a time period falls on a Saturday, Sunday or full legal
16	holiday, the next day which is not a Saturday, Sunday or
17	full legal holiday shall be used. All days, except the
18	specific day, but including the last day, shall be used to
19	compute the time limits established under W.S. 22-18-105
20	through 22-18-109 unless the last day of a time period
21	falls on a Saturday, Sunday or full legal holiday in which
22	case the next day which is not a Saturday, Sunday or full
23	legal holiday shall be used.

Employees time off to vote. 3 4 (a) Any person entitled to vote at any primary or general election or special election to fill a vacancy in 5 the office of representatives in the congress of the United б States under W.S. 22-18-103 through 22-18-109 is, on the 7 day of such election, entitled to absent himself from any 8 9 service or employment in which he is then engaged or 10 employed for a period of one (1) hour, other than meal hours, the hour being at the convenience of the employer, 11 12 between the time of opening and closing of the polls. Such 13 elector shall not, because of so absenting himself, lose 14 any pay, providing he actually casts his legal vote. 15 16 22-18-103. Filling vacancies in federal and state 17 offices; generally. 18 19 A vacancy in the office of <u>United States senator</u>, 20 representative in congress, member of the state legislature 21 or an elected state official shall be filled for the 22 unexpired term at a special election called for the purpose 23 by the governor, provided the vacancy does not occur within

4	office specified in this section.

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1 (c) If the Tuesday falls on a full legal holiday, in which case the special election shall occur on the next 2 3 Tuesday which is not a full legal holiday. 4 5 (d) The governor or acting governor pursuant to W.S. 6 <u>9-1-211 and 9-1-212</u> shall declare the <u>a</u> vacancy and issue the <u>a</u> writ of election within five (5) days after the 7 vacancy occurs. The writ shall be issued to the county 8 clerk of each county voting for the office and to the 9 10 secretary of state. The writ shall specify the day of the 11 election. 12 22-18-106. 13	independent status, if declared.

The candidate who receives a plurality of the votes at a 12 special election shall be issued a certificate of election 13 14 as provided by law. 15 16 22-18-111. Vacancies in other offices; temporary 17 appointments. 18 19 (a) Any vacancy in any other elective office in the 20 state except representative in congress or the offices 21 specified in W.S. 22-18-103 or the board of trustees of a school or community college district, shall be filled by 22 23 the governing body, or as otherwise provided in this

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section, by appointment of a temporary successor. The 1 2 person appointed shall serve until a successor for the remainder of the unexpired term is elected at the next 3 4 general election and takes office on the first Monday of 5 the following January. **Provided** Except as provided in W.S. <u>22-18-105</u>, if a vacancy in a four (4) year term of office 6 occurs in the term's second or subsequent years after the 7 8 first day for filing an application for nomination pursuant 9 to W.S. 22-5-209, no election to fill the vacancy shall be 10 held and the temporary successor appointed shall serve the 11 remainder of the unexpired term. The following apply: 12 13 (iii) Notwithstanding W.S. 22-18-103 through 14 22-18-109, if a vacancy occurs in the office of a member of the state legislature not more than forty-five (45) days 15 16 before the first day of the general or budget session of 17 the legislature: 18 19 28-1-106. Resignation of office. 20 (a) Resignation of the office of a member of the 21 senate or house of representatives shall be made to the 22

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1	governor, who shall immediately notify the following of the
2	resignation:
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4	(i) The secretary of state who shall notify the
5	county clerks of the counties in which the legislative
6	district is located;

8	(ii) The presiding officer of the house of which
9	the person is a member;

11	(iii) If the resignation occurs in the time
12	periods specified in W.S. 22-18-111(a)(iii), the state
13	central committee of the party which the member represented
14	at the time of his election under W.S. 22-6-120(a)(vii), or
15	at the time of $\frac{his}{his}$ appointment if not elected to office.
16	of the resignation. If the resigning member did not
17	represent a political party at the time of his election, or
18	at the time of his appointment if not elected to office,
19	the governor shall notify the appropriate boards of county
20	commissioners who shall proceed in accordance with W.S.
21	22-18-111(a)(iii)(C).

1 (b) For purposes of this section a person shall be considered to "represent" a political party if he the 2 3 person was a nominee of that political party when elected 4 to office or when appointed to fill a vacancy in office. 5 б Section 2. W.S. 22-18-104 and 22-18-111(a)(i) are 7 repealed. 8 9 Section 3. This act is effective immediately upon completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law 10 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming 11 Constitution. 12 13 14 (END)
