A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to transportation and wildlife; providing for 2 the distribution of revenue to the wildlife conservation account; authorizing and requiring a study of motor vehicle 3 4 collisions with big game animals on highways as specified; 5 requiring a study of big game animals killed or injured along 6 railroads as specified; authorizing wildlife conservation 7 efforts related to the transportation system as specified; 8 authorizing expenditure of funds; providing an appropriation; 9 and providing for an effective date.

11 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

13 **Section 1.** W.S. 9-4-601(a)(iii) is amended to read:

1 9-4-601. Distribution and use; funds, accounts, cities

2 and towns benefited; exception for bonus payments.

4 (a) All monies received by the state of Wyoming from 5 the secretary of the treasury of the United States under the provisions of the act of congress of February 25, 1920 (41 6 Stat. 437, 450; 30 U.S.C. §§ 181, 191), as amended, or from 7 lessees or authorized mine operators and all monies received 8 by the state from its sale of production from federal mineral 9 10 leases subject to the act of congress of February 25, 1920 11 (41 Stat. 437, 450; 30 U.S.C. §§ 181, 191) as amended, except 12 as provided by subsection (b) of this section, shall be 13 deposited into an account and the first two hundred million dollars (\$200,000,000.00) of revenues received in any fiscal 14 year shall be distributed by the state treasurer as provided 15 16 in this subsection. One percent (1%) of these revenues shall be credited to the general fund as an administrative fee, and 17 the remainder shall be distributed as follows:

    transportation shall study the collisions and accidents

3	(b) of this section, the department of transportation, in
4	consultation with the Wyoming game and fish department, shall
5	compile data regarding:

8	collisions involving big game animals occurring along the
9	sections of highways identified in subsection (b) of this

5	(d) The study required under subsection (b) of this
6	section shall end on June 30, 2023.
7	
8	(e) By July 1 of each year of the study, the department
9	of transportation, in consultation with the game and fish
10	department, shall use the data compiled in subsection (c) of
11	this section:

13	(i) To prepare maps of accident locations for the
14	highways identified in subsection (b) of this section;
15	
16	(ii) To develop a priority list of locations along
17	the highways identified in subsection (b) of this section
18	that are at the highest risk for accidents and collisions
19	between motor vehicles and big game animals.
20	
21	(f) The department of transportation shall use the
22	priority list required under paragraph (e)(ii) of this
23	section to develop wildlife conservation projects related to

- 1 the highways identified in subsection (b) of this section.
- 2 Projects may include signage, wildlife corridors, wildlife
- 3 crossings and game fences. No project completed under this
- 4 section shall include any unnecessary decoration or aesthetic
- 5 feature unless the feature is funded by private monetary or
- 6 in-kind donations to the department of transportation.

- 8 (g) Beginning July 1, 2019 and ending June 30, 2022,
- 9 the game and fish department, in consultation with the
- 10 department of transportation, shall document the number of
- 11 big game animals killed or injured along the section of
- 12 railroad line beginning in Granger, Wyoming that runs roughly
- 13 parallel to U.S. Highway 30 and proceeding northwesterly to
- 14 the Idaho state line, subject to the following:

15

- 16 (i) The game and fish department shall document
- 17 the date, location, number and species of each big game animal
- 18 killed or injured between October 1 and April 15 of each study
- 19 year;

- 21 (ii) The game and fish department and the
- 22 department of transportation shall review fencing along the
- 23 right-of-way of the section of railroad specified in this

- 1 subsection to ensure fencing complies with the laws of this
- 2 state, provided that there shall be no entry onto private
- 3 land without the consent of the landowner;

- 5 (iii) The compilation of data and review of
- 6 fencing required under this subsection shall be conducted in
- 7 a manner not inconsistent with federal law.

- 9 (h) Not later than October 1 of each year of the studies
- 10 authorized in subsections (b) and (g) of this section, the
- 11 department of transportation and the game and fish department
- 12 shall report their findings to the joint transportation,
- 13 highways and military affairs interim committee. The report
- 14 shall include a summary of the data required to be compiled
- 15 under this section.

- 19 (a) After funds are distributed to the wildlife
- 20 conservation account under W.S. 9-4-601(a)(iii) for fiscal
- 21 year 2020, there is appropriated five million dollars
- (\$5,000,000.00), or as much thereof as is available from the
- 23 wildlife conservation account to the department of

- 1 transportation for the period beginning July 1, 2019 and
- 2 ending June 30, 2024. Notwithstanding any other provision of
- 3 law, funds appropriated under this section shall not be
- 4 transferred or expended for any other purpose and any
- 5 unexpended, unobligated funds remaining from this
- 6 appropriation shall revert as provided by law on June 30,
- 7 2024.

- 9 (b) For the period beginning July 1, 2021 and ending
- 10 June 30, 2027, from federal funds received by the state
- 11 pursuant to 23 U.S.C. § 148 that are not required to be
- 12 otherwise expended, the department of transportation shall
- 13 expend one million dollars (\$1,000,000.00) each fiscal year
- 14 as provided in subsection (c) of this section, subject to
- 15 receipt of matching funds required in that section.

- 17 (c) Funds appropriated or authorized for expenditure
- 18 under this section shall only be expended subject to the
- 19 following conditions:

- 21 (i) Funds shall only be expended to provide for
- 22 wildlife conservation efforts related to the transportation

1	system, including signage, wildlife corridors, wildlife
2	crossings and game fences;

4	(ii) The department of transportation and the game
5	and fish department shall develop a priority list as required
6	in section 2(f) of this act;
7	
8	(iii) Funds appropriated or authorized for
9	expenditure under this section shall only be expended on
10	identified projects upon receipt of funds from the following
11	entities in the minimum matches specified:
12	
13	(A) Five percent (5%) of the total project
14	cost by a city, town, county, political subdivision or any
15	other public or private entity;
16	
17	(B) Twenty percent (20%) of the total project
18	cost by the game and fish department from any funds under the
19	department's authority.
20	
21	(iv) Projects shall be selected from the priority
22	list prepared under section 2(f) of this act based on

contributions under section 3(c)(iii)(A) of this act on a
first-come, first-served basis.

Section 4. This act is effective July 1, 2019.
