1 AN ACT relating to agriculture, livestock and other

- 2 animals; codifying federal animal identification methods
- 3 for Wyoming livestock as specified; providing exclusion;
- 4 providing rulemaking authority; and providing for effective
- 5 dates.

7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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- 9 **Section 1**. W.S. 11-18-117(a), (b), by creating new
- 10 subsections (c) and (d) and by amending and renumbering (c)
- 11 and (d) as (e) and (f) is amended to read:

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13 11-18-117. Confidentiality of livestock premises and

14 identification records; penalties.

2	(a) Except as provided by subsection (b) of this
3	section, all records, data and information collected by the
4	state, recorded or otherwise, for the purposes of a
5	national—livestock identification program shall be
6	confidential and are not public records for purposes of
7	W.S. 16-4-201 through 16-4-205. The records, data and
8	information shall be released only upon order of the
9	Wyoming livestock board to appropriate governmental
10	agencies for the purposes of a national livestock
11	identification program, disease outbreak or law enforcement
12	investigation. The board shall not release any records,
13	data or information to a federal agency until the agency
14	confirms in writing that it will maintain the records, data
15	and information as confidential and that they are not
16	subject to the federal Freedom of Information Act, 5 U.S.C.
17	§ 552, as amended. Upon release by the board of any
18	information to any other governmental entity, the board
19	shall notify the person to whom the information refers or
20	pertains that the release has been made, the name of the
21	entity to whom the information was released and shall
22	provide a copy or summary of the information contained in
23	the release. The records, data and information shall not

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1 be subject to discovery or introduction into evidence in 2 any civil action. 3 4 (b) The Wyoming livestock board release may information collected for the purposes of a national 5 livestock identification program related to the ownership 6 and location of individual animals to the extent the 7 8 information is useful in controlling or preventing a disease outbreak or to show particular animals or herds are 9

10 not involved in a disease outbreak. The information

11 released may be a public release or may be limited to

12 specific individuals with a need to know the information,

13 as the livestock board deems the circumstances require.

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15 (c) For the purposes of this section, Wyoming
16 livestock owners may choose to identify animals using any
17 methods set forth in 9 C.F.R. part 86, as adopted on
18 January 9, 2013, as well as any additional methods that are
19 later approved by the federal government as "official

20 <u>identification".</u>

1 (d) Nothing in this section shall be construed to limit or amend the brucellosis surveillance or testing 2 3 program administered by the state. 4 5 knowingly provides (c)(e) A person who false information to the Wyoming livestock board for purposes of 6 a national livestock identification program shall be guilty 7 8 of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of up to one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00), imprisonment for up to six (6) months, 9 10 or both. 11 12 (d)(f) A person who refuses to provide to the livestock board information that is required under the 13 authority of the livestock board for purposes of a 14 mandatory national livestock identification program shall 15 16 be quilty of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of up to 17 one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00), imprisonment for up to six (6) months, or both. 18

20 **Section 2.** The Wyoming livestock board and state 21 veterinarian shall promulgate any rules necessary to 22 implement this act.

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3 (a) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this

4 section, this act is effective July 1, 2021.

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6 (b) Sections 2 and 3 of this act are effective

7 immediately upon completion of all acts necessary for a

8 bill to become law as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of

9 the Wyoming Constitution.
