School safety and security.

## A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to school safety and security; establishing supplemental financial assistance available to school 2 districts for school resource officers for protection and 3 safety of schools; specifying eligibility for 4 5 distribution of assistance and granting rulemaking 6 authority for program administration; establishing a task force through the department of education addressing school 7 safety and security planning; providing appropriations; and 8 9 providing for an effective date.

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11 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

13 Section 1.

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- 15 (a) For school year 2013-2014, supplemental financial
- 16 assistance shall be made available to school districts to

1 acquire school resource officers for enhancing the

2 protection and safety of students, faculty and staff

3 attending or employed within the schools of the district.

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5 (b) Each school district may apply to the department

6 of education for financial assistance under this section on

7 or before July 1, 2013 on a form and in a manner prescribed

8 by the department. Assistance shall be based upon prior

9 school year attendance reports. Application review shall

10 be in accordance with a process established by department

11 rule and regulation which at minimum, shall require

12 documentation of the following:

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14 (i) The district's safety and security plan,

15 identifying how the district would deploy supplemental

16 assistance under this section and describing the impact of

17 the program on school operations;

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19 (ii) Assurance that the district would restrict

20 expenditures of supplemental assistance to the costs of

21 employing school resource officers and not expend

22 assistance for safety and security equipment and other

2

23 related capital outlays;

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1 (iii) A report of any federal funds available to

2 the applicant district for the costs of employing school

3 resource officers or security aides within its schools.

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5 (c) On or before August 1, 2013, the department shall

6 notify each district of its eligibility to receive

7 financial assistance, together with an estimate of the

8 amount of assistance the eligible district would receive

9 during school year 2013-2014. The department shall

10 distribute assistance under this section to each eligible

11 district on or before October 15, 2013.

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13 (d) Financial assistance under this section shall be

14 based upon prior year attendance reports submitted by each

15 eligible school district pursuant to W.S. 21-13-309(m)(iv).

16 The amount of assistance shall be computed by the

17 department for the eligible applicant district as if the

18 education resource block grant model contained a component

19 for school resource officers generating one (1) FTE

20 position for a total district ADM of one thousand (1,000)

21 or less, and one (1) additional FTE position for each

22 additional one thousand (1,000) district ADM thereafter.

23 The FTE positions shall be funded at a salary equal to

24 forty-nine thousand five hundred dollars (\$49,500.00) per

1 school year, adjusted for regional cost differences as

2 determined for each district under W.S. 21-13-309(m)(v)(C),

3 but not adjusted for any other compensation-related

4 benefit. The amount received under this subsection shall

5 also be reduced by all federal funds received by the school

6 district for the purpose of funding salaries for school

7 resource officers. Each full-time equivalent position

8 generated under this subsection above the first FTE shall

9 be prorated up and down from the specified FTE position

10 level specified for each district similar to computational

11 operation of other components within the block grant model.

12 "FTE" and "ADM" as used in this section shall be as defined

13 in ATTACHMENT "A", as referenced in W.S.

14 21-13-101(a)(xvii).

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Financial assistance to each qualifying applicant 16 17 school district shall be made by the department from amounts appropriated by the legislature from the foundation 18 program account for purposes of the program established by 19 this section and shall be in addition to the foundation 20 21 program amount computed for that district under W.S. 21-13-309(p). If there is an insufficient amount within 22 program account 23 the school foundation from amounts

appropriated by the legislature for financial assistance

1 under this section, the department shall make a pro rata 2 in financial assistance payments reduction amonq all qualifying districts. District expenditures of 3 4 distributed under this section shall be solely for district 5 security resource officers in accordance with the safety security plan submitted by under 6 and the district subsection (b) of this section. 7 The department withhold or request repayment of a portion or the entire 8 9 amount to be distributed to any district under this section 10 for noncompliance with program documentation required to be 11 submitted by the applicant district. Any appropriated amounts not expended or encumbered under this section as of 12 13 1, 2014, including any amounts distributed 14 districts which are not spent by July 1, 2014, shall revert to the foundation program account. 15

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(f) Each district shall report to the department of education on expenditures of amounts distributed under this section together with additional information required by the department on use of school resource officers and an evaluation of the impact of these officers on the effectiveness of the district's school safety and security programs as documented by data. The department shall compile the information reported by districts under this

1 subsection and on or before October 1, 2014, report the

2 compilation to the joint education interim committee. In

3 addition and not later than December 31, 2013, the

4 department shall provide recommendations to the committee

5 on future program structure and funding.

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7 **Section 2.** For the school year commencing July 1,

8 2013, and ending June 30, 2014, two million three hundred

9 thousand dollars (\$2,300,000.00) is appropriated from the

10 school foundation program account to the department of

11 education to fund the safety and security supplemental

12 assistance program created under and subject to

13 requirements specified under section 1 of this act.

15 Section 3.

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17 The governor's office shall appoint a task force comprised of representatives of a variety of agencies 18 school district personnel, department 19 including of 20 education employees, local fire and law enforcement, 21 department of health, department of homeland security and 22 school facilities department to develop guidelines and protocols for the safety and security of students and staff 23

within school buildings. The task force shall provide

1 common components of school safety and security plans which

2 include but are not limited to:

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4 (i) Identification of building crisis teams and

5 provision of continual plan updating, including regular and

6 periodic testing and scheduled safety drills;

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8 (ii) Establishment of evacuation routes, on-site

9 safe areas within the building, off-site shelters,

10 communication methods and protocols, identification of and

11 access to supplies and equipment to assist staff in a

12 crisis and identification and location of school plans,

13 facility information and keys;

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15 (iii) Mechanisms for fully informing teachers

16 and staff of student risk behaviors that directly affect

17 school safety and security;

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19 (iv) Training programs for teachers and staff on

20 the school safety and security plan and the reporting of

21 unusual behavior to school leaders and proper authorities

22 for each school building;

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1 (v) Training programs for teachers and staff on

2 positive and proactive actions necessary to address

3 students displaying risky behavior and techniques for

4 meeting with parents regarding risky behavior and building

5 positive school environments;

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7 (vi) Protocols and actions for maintaining

8 control of building access during the time schools are in

9 operation;

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11 (vii) Mechanisms and procedures for the conduct

12 of periodic safety and security audits in consultation with

13 school resource officers and law enforcement agencies.

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15 (b) The task force appointed under subsection (a) of

16 this section shall assemble recommendations in sufficient

17 time for use by the department of education in conducting

18 workshops and other programs during school year 2013-2014

19 pertaining to school district safety and security planning

20 and other activities.

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22 (c) There is appropriated thirty thousand dollars

23 (\$30,000.00) from the general fund to the governor's

24 office. This appropriation shall be for the period

beginning with the effective date of this act and ending 1

2 June 30, 2014. This appropriation shall only be expended

3 for the purpose of funding mileage authorized for task

4 force members who are not state employees. Task force

5 members shall be entitled to receive mileage at the rate

authorized state employees in W.S. 9-3-103. Notwithstanding 6

any other provision of law, this appropriation shall not be 7

transferred or expended for any other purpose and any 8

9 unexpended, unobligated funds remaining from this

appropriation shall revert as provided by law on June 30, 10

11 2014. This appropriation shall not be included in the

office's 2015-2016 standard biennial budget request. 12

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Section 4. This act is effective immediately upon 14

completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law 15

as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the 16

Constitution. 17
