1 AN ACT relating to post secondary education; making legislative findings; authorizing community colleges to 2 3 confer baccalaureate degrees; providing for community college 4 commission approval of a limited number of baccalaureate 5 degree programs as specified; establishing a time-limited matching funds program to create community college 6 Hathaway 7 baccalaureate degree programs; conforming scholarship statutes; requiring a report; providing for an 8 9 appropriation as specified; and providing for an effective 10 date.

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1 2 (a) The legislature finds that: 3 4 (i) The availability of baccalaureate degree 5 programs in Wyoming directly impacts Wyoming's ability to promote and achieve the goals of the legislative and executive 6 branches' economic and education initiatives; 7 8 9 (ii) There exists a need to increase the 10 availability of baccalaureate degree programs in Wyoming to enable: 11 12 13 (A) Increased educational opportunity, particularly for students who must remain close to home for 14 reasons related to family, health or work while earning a 15 16 college degree; and 17 Increased skill development, which will 18 (B) 19 lead to economic expansion and diversification. 20 21 (iii) Increasing the availability of baccalaureate degree programs in the state will not diminish 22

Wyomingites' love for the University of Wyoming.

(c) A community college shall identify to 14 the 15 commission gifts for which the community college seeks to 16 receive matching funds. The commission shall only match gifts 17 that are irrevocably given to and received by the community college on or after July 1, 2019 and before June 1, 2020 for 18 19 the purpose of developing a baccalaureate degree program. For 20 purposes of this section, "gift" includes anything of value 21 that is deemed by the commission and the community college receiving the gift as consistent with the mission of the 22

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The commission shall evaluate all applications 2 (d) 3 received. The commission shall consider whether and to what 4 extent a community college's application meets the purposes 5 of this section. Subject to approval of the governor or his designee, by June 1, 2020, the commission shall announce 6 awards for matching funds and shall transfer awarded funds to 7 8 the applicable community college. The commission may award an 9 amount equal to a portion or all of a community college's 10 matching funds request as contained in its petition, however, 11 the commission shall not grant an award under this section at 12 a higher rate than a match of one dollar (\$1.00) to one dollar 13 (\$1.00).

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15 (e) The commission shall restrict matching funds
16 awarded pursuant to this section so that the funds may only
17 be used for the purpose of developing a baccalaureate degree
18 program.

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20 (f) Nothing in this section obligates the legislature 21 or the commission to match a gift received by a community 22 college for the purpose of developing a baccalaureate degree

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8 Section 4. The community college commission shall evaluate each baccalaureate program offered by a Wyoming 9 10 community college and report on the costs and benefits of 11 each program to the legislature by June 1, 2025. In its 12 report, the community college commission shall recommend 13 whether community colleges should continue to have the ability to offer baccalaureate degrees and report on any 14 15 recommended changes to this act.

On the effective date of this act there is appropriated one million dollars (\$1,000,000.00) or as much thereof as is available from the unexpended and unobligated funds within the Wyoming workforce development priority economic sector partnership subaccount to the community college baccalaureate program development subaccount.
