for

1 AN ACT relating to postsecondary education and economic 2 development; making legislative findings; authorizing community colleges to confer baccalaureate degrees; providing 3 4 for community college commission approval of a limited number 5 of baccalaureate degree programs as specified; conforming 6 Hathaway scholarship statutes; specifying certain programs 7 to be reviewed for inclusion by higher education institutions; providing for review of baccalaureate programs 8 provided by colleges; modifying duties of the economically 9 10 needed diversity options for Wyoming executive council to 11 include consideration of the need for postsecondary programs for continued economic development and diversification in 12 Wyoming; requiring reports; authorizing additional uses of 13 14 economically needed diversity options funds for required

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1 specifying date for approval of additional reviews; 2 baccalaureate programs; and providing for an effective date. 3 4 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 5 Section 1. 6 7 8 (a) The legislature finds that: 9 10 (i) The availability of baccalaureate degree 11 programs in Wyoming impacts Wyoming's ability to promote and 12 achieve the goals of the legislative and executive branches' 13 economic and education initiatives; 14 15 (ii) There exists a need to increase the 16 availability of baccalaureate degree programs in Wyoming to 17 enable: 18 19 (A) Increased educational opportunity, 20 particularly for students who must remain close to home for reasons related to family, health or work while earning a 21 college degree; and 22 23

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1 (B) Increased skill development, which will 2 lead to economic expansion and diversification. 3 4 (iii) Increasing the availability of baccalaureate degree programs in the state is compatible with 5 the continued legislative support of the University of 6 7 Wyoming. 8 9 **2**. W.S. Section 9-12-1402(a)(xii), 10 9-12-1404(a)(iii)(A) and (B), 21-16-1303(f)(iv), 11 21-16-1304(b), 21-16-1305(a)(iii), 21-18-102(a)(i), 12 21-18-202(b)(v), (d)(i) and (h)(ii) and 21-18-303(a)(xvi) are 13 amended to read: 14 9-12-1402. General powers and duties of the council; 15 16 economic diversification policy and strategy; authority of 17 governor. 18 19 (a) The ENDOW executive council shall: 20 21 (xii) In consultation with the University of Wyoming, community colleges, the department of education, 22

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1 department of workforce services and Wyoming business 2 council:7 3 4 (A) <u>R</u>eview existing career technical education programs and develop recommendations regarding 5 opportunities to better coordinate existing public and 6 private programs, and develop or acquire existing career 7 8 technical education facilities to further technical education 9 opportunities in the state . The 10 (B) Review existing, proposed and potential 11 12 baccalaureate degree programs which may be provided at a Wyoming community college to determine the need for the 13 program in light of the state's economic development and 14 diversification efforts and recommend specific baccalaureate 15 16 degree programs for consideration by the colleges and Wyoming 17 community college commission;

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19 <u>(C) Make r</u>ecommendations <u>regarding its</u> 20 <u>review under this paragraph. Recommendations</u> shall be 21 included in the council's twenty (20) year economic 22 diversification strategy and may be included in the council's

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- 1 four (4) year action plan as determined appropriate by the 2 council.
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9-12-1404. Economic diversification account created;
authorized expenditures.

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There is created an economic diversification 7 (a) account. All monies in the account are continuously 8 9 appropriated to the office of the governor to be used for the 10 purposes of this article and as otherwise specified by law, 11 including per diem, mileage and other administrative expenses 12 of the ENDOW executive council. Notwithstanding W.S. 9-2-1008 13 and 9-4-207, funds in the account or subaccounts of the account shall not lapse at the end of the fiscal period. 14 15 Interest earned on funds in the account shall be deposited to 16 the account or appropriate subaccount. Within the account 17 shall be subaccounts. For accounting and investment purposes only all subaccounts shall be treated as separate accounts. 18 19 The subaccounts are as follows:

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(iii) The Wyoming workforce development-priority
economic sector partnership subaccount. Funds within this
subaccount may be expended:

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1 2 (A) As approved by director of the department 3 of workforce services for administrative costs incurred by 4 the department of workforce services associated with 5 administration of the Wyoming workforce development-priority economic sector partnership program under W.S. 9-2-2609 6 7 through 9-2-2611; and 8 9 As approved by the governor or his (B) 10 designee: 11 12 (I) To provide funding for agreements 13 entered into pursuant to W.S. 9-2-2609 through 9-2-2611; and 14 15 (II) To fund expenses associated with the council's study under W.S. 9-12-1402(a)(xii) of education 16 17 programs and, as specified by law, to fund other studies regarding the potential expansion of educational programs to 18 19 support economic development and diversification efforts. 20 21 21-16-1303. Hathaway scholarship program; eligibility requirements. 22 23

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1	(f) Students meeting the requirements of this
2	subsection shall not be subject to the six (6) academic year
3	limitation on scholarships under this article, the
4	satisfactory academic progress requirements of W.S.
5	21-16-1304(c)(i) and 21-16-1305(b)(i) or the continuous
6	enrollment requirements of W.S. 21-16-1304(c)(ii) and
7	21-16-1305(b)(ii), but shall be subject to the following:
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9	(iv) Within the earlier of eight (8) years of
10	initial Hathaway scholarship eligibility or four (4) years of
11	last attending an eligible institution while receiving a
12	Hathaway scholarship, have enrolled at the University of
13	Wyoming <u>or a Wyoming community college</u> to complete a
14	baccalaureate of applied science degree and have applied for
15	reinstatement of the student's Hathaway scholarship;
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17	21-16-1304. Hathaway opportunity, performance and
18	honor scholarships.
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20	(b) Scholarships under this section shall be for a
21	maximum of the equivalent of eight (8) full-time semesters.
22	Except as specified under subsection (g) of this section, A
23	scholarship under this section shall be available for

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1 attendance at a Wyoming community college for not more than 2 a maximum of the equivalent of four (4) full-time semesters $_{L_{\tau}}$ 3 except as follows: 4 (i) As specified under subsection (g) of this 5 6 section; or 7 8 (ii) A scholarship for a student enrolled in a baccalaureate degree program at a Wyoming community college 9 10 shall be for a maximum of the equivalent of eight (8) 11 full-time semesters. 12 13 21-16-1305. Hathaway provisional opportunity scholarships. 14 15 16 (a) Any student who meets the criteria under W.S. 17 21-16-1303 is eligible to receive a Hathaway provisional 18 opportunity scholarship to pursue a certificate or degree as 19 follows: 20 21 (iii) A student who receives a scholarship under paragraph (i) of this subsection and who earns a certificate 22 from the community college with a minimum cumulative GPA of 23 HB0263

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1 2.25 may extend the provisional opportunity scholarship to 2 pursue either a certificate or a degree at a Wyoming community 3 college or if the student earns a degree from the community 4 college with a minimum GPA of 2.25, may extend the scholarship 5 to pursue a degree at the University of Wyoming if the student maintains a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.25 and otherwise 6 remains eligible for a scholarship under this article. A 7 8 student who receives a scholarship under paragraph (i) of this subsection, is enrolled in a community college 9 10 baccalaureate program and has received a minimum cumulative 11 GPA of 2.25 after four (4) full-time semesters may extend the 12 provisional opportunity scholarship for an additional four 13 (4) full-time semesters to complete the baccalaureate degree if the student maintains a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.25 and 14 otherwise remains eligible for a scholarship under this 15 16 article. The scholarship under this paragraph shall be for the same amounts and subject to the same limitations as 17 provided for scholarships under paragraph (a)(i) of this 18 19 section, except that the student may continue a baccalaureate 20 program or pursue either an additional certificate or a degree 21 and the student may use this scholarship while attending a Wyoming community college or the University of Wyoming. 22

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1 21-18-102. Definitions. 2 3 (a) As used in this act: 4 5 (i) "Academic program" means those programs approved by the commission which provide credits: 6 7 8 (A) Resulting in a two (2) year associate degree; 9 10 11 (B) Resulting in a baccalaureate degree; or 12 13 (C) Which may be transferred to an accredited 14 four (4) year college or university. 15 21-18-202. Powers and duties of the commission. 16 17 (b) The commission shall perform the following 18 19 coordination functions. In performing these coordination 20 functions all affected colleges and the commission shall be involved: 21 22

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1 (v) Coordinate the provision by of means 2 electronic internet or similar proprietary or common carrier 3 electronic system technology, by a community college or 4 several community colleges, the general education courses 5 necessary for completion of an educational program in the 6 field of nursing at a community college, including a baccalaureate degree if offered, or a baccalaureate degree 7 8 program in nursing at the University of Wyoming;

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10 (d) The commission shall perform the following approval 11 functions:

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(i) Approve all new programs, including baccalaureate degree programs, qualifying for state funding pursuant to the statewide community college strategic plan developed under subsection (h) of this section;

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(h) The commission shall prior to the beginning of each
biennial budget period, review, update and modify the
statewide college system strategic plan. The plan shall
clearly prescribe the components of the educational program
and attach program components to statewide system priorities.
This plan shall serve as the basis for state operational and

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1 capital construction budget requests and funding of the 2 statewide college system for the applicable biennial budget 3 period. In developing, reviewing and updating the strategic 4 plan, the commission shall: 5 6 (ii) Include mechanisms within the planning process which adhere to the state's interests in establishing 7 8 a statewide college system identified as assuring statewide 9 access to: 10 11 (A) Academic programs, including one (1) 12 baccalaureate degree program at each community college, and 13 an additional baccalaureate degree program at each community college if a community college demonstrates sufficient 14 15 community need; 16 17 (B) Career-technical education and training 18 programs<u>;</u> 19 20 <u>(C) D</u>ual and concurrent enrollment 21 programs; - and 22

1 (D) Remedial and continuing education 2 programs responding to needs of students, employers and the 3 state workforce, including program access through outreach or 4 coordinated electronic system technology. + 5 6 21-18-303. District board generally; powers; board 7 approved additional mill levy. 8 9 (a) The community college district board may: 10 11 (xvi) Confer degrees, including baccalaureate 12 degrees in programs approved by the commission, and certificates and grant diplomas as are usual for community 13 colleges and authorized under its accreditation by the 14 15 regional accrediting agency; 16 17 Section 3. 18 19 In consultation with the University of Wyoming and (a) 20 community colleges, the community college commission shall evaluate the funding, other implementation needs 21 and 22 appropriate timeframe to: 23

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(i) Establish health care provider programs at

2 community colleges. The commission may consider potential 3 undergraduate and postgraduate health care provider programs 4 under this paragraph; 5 (ii) Re-establish a career and technical training б program by the University of Wyoming as an outreach program 7 8 at Casper, Wyoming; 9 10 (iii) Establish baccalaureate program а in 11 education at Central Wyoming community college. 12 The community college commission shall consult with 13 (b) the department of workforce services, the department of 14 education, the economically needed diversity options for 15 16 Wyoming executive council and Wyoming business council 17 regarding the effect the programs specified in subsection (a) of this section could have on economic development and 18 19 diversification efforts in Wyoming. The community college 20 commission shall report the results of the study under 21 subsection (a) of this section, including any responses by the entities specified in this subsection and recommendations 22 of the community college commission, to the joint education 23

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interim committee not later than September 1, 2019. The joint
 education interim committee shall sponsor legislation
 implementing recommendations of the commission as it
 determines appropriate for consideration in the 2020 budget
 session of the legislature.

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7 (c) The governor or his designee may authorize funding
8 from the Wyoming workforce development-priority economic
9 sector partnership subaccount as provided by W.S.
10 9-12-1404(a)(iii)(B)(II) for purposes of the commission's
11 study under subsections (a) and (b) of this section.

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13 (d) The community college commission shall not approve 14 a baccalaureate program pursuant to this act prior to April 15 1, 2020. The community college commission shall review each 16 baccalaureate program offered by a Wyoming community college 17 and report on the costs and benefits of each program to the legislature by June 1, 2025. In its report, the community 18 19 college commission shall recommend whether community colleges 20 should continue to have the ability to offer baccalaureate 21 degrees and report on any recommended changes to this act.
