## A BILL

for

1 AN ACT requiring county and state health officers to grant

2 waivers to immunization requirements for K-12 students upon

3 request; requiring county and state health officers to

4 grant mask mandate waivers for K-12 students upon request;

5 and providing for an effective date.

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7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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9 **Section 1**. W.S. 21-4-309(a) and by creating a new

10 subsection (e) is amended to read:

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12 21-4-309. Mandatory immunizations for children

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13 attending schools and waivers; mask mandate waivers.

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1 (a) Any person attending, full or part time, any public or private school, kindergarten through twelfth 2 3 grade, shall within thirty (30) days after the date of 4 school entry, provide to the appropriate school official 5 written documentary proof of immunization. For purposes of this section, documentary proof of immunization is written 6 certification by a private licensed physician or his 7 8 representative or by any public health authority, that the 9 person is fully immunized. Documentation shall include 10 month, day and year of each required immunization received 11 against vaccine preventable disease as designated by the 12 state health authority. No school administrator shall permit a student to attend school for more than thirty (30) 13 calendar days without documentary proof of immunization. 14 If immunization requires a series of immunizations over a 15 16 period of more than thirty (30) calendar days, the child 17 shall be permitted to attend school while receiving continuing immunization if the school administrator 18 19 receives written notification by a private 20 physician or his representative or by a public health 21 official, specifying a written schedule for necessary immunization completion within the medically accepted time 22 Waivers to the administration of required 23 period.

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1 immunizations for preventable diseases shall be authorized 2 granted by the state or county health officer upon 3 submission of <u>a</u> written <del>evidence of religious objection or</del> 4 medical contraindication to the administration of any 5 vaccine—request by the child's parent, legal guardian or other adult person authorized to consent to medical 6 7 treatment of the child seeking the waiver. The state or 8 county health officer shall grant the requested immunization waiver within seven (7) business days of 9 10 receipt. In the presence of an outbreak of vaccine preventable disease as determined by the state or county 11 12 health authority, school children for whom a waiver has 13 been issued and who are not immunized against the occurring vaccine preventable disease shall be excluded from school 14 15 attendance for a period of time determined by the state or 16 county health authority, but not suspended from school as 17 provided in W.S. 21-4-305. Children excluded from school attendance under this section shall not be counted in the 18 19 aggregate number of pupils absent as defined in W.S. 20 21-13-101(a)(i).

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(e) The state or county health officer shall grant
waivers to any mask mandate imposed on any person

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- 2 <u>kindergarten through twelfth grade upon submission of a</u>
- 3 written request of the child's parent, legal guardian or
- 4 other adult person authorized to consent to medical
- 5 treatment of the child seeking the waiver. The state or
- 6 county health officer shall grant the requested waiver
- 7 within seven (7) business days of receipt.

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9 **Section 2.** This act is effective immediately upon

10 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law

11 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming

12 Constitution.
