These funds shall not be transferred or expended for any other purpose and any unexpended, unobligated funds remaining from this appropriation on June 30, 2012 shall revert to the budget reserve account. Not more than five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00) shall be expended for any one (1) appointee. Any funds expended for this purpose shall be reimbursed to the state by the appointee if the appointee is employed by the state for less than twelve (12) months.

9 2. Of this general fund appropriation, sixty thousand dollars (\$60,000.00) shall only be expended if there 10 is a change of governor as a result of the 2010 general election and then only for transition staff 11 salaries, travel and other related office expenses. Not more than ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00) of this 12 sixty thousand dollars (\$60,000.00) may be expended for expenses incurred in relocating from the governor's 13 mansion. These funds shall not be transferred or expended for any other purpose and any unexpended, 14 unobligated funds remaining from this appropriation on June 30, 2012 shall revert to the budget reserve 15 account.

The administration and information budget division in consultation with the 20 administration and information human resources division and the University of Wyoming, shall determine the 21 expenditure amount necessary to pay for the employer share of increased premium costs, within the limits 22 set forth in this footnote, and shall provide to the state auditor's office detailed expenditure 23 information. The auditor shall distribute these funds as directed by the department. These funds shall not 24 be transferred or used for any other purposes, and any unexpended amounts remaining on June 30, 2012 shall 25 revert to the budget reserve account.
