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5 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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- 7 **Section 1.** W.S. 23-1-703(b) and 23-2-101(m) are amended
- 8 to read:

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- 10 23-1-703. Limitation of number of big or trophy game
- animal licenses; reservation of certain licenses; reservation
- 12 of certain unused licenses.

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- 14 (b) Except as specifically provided under this
- 15 subsection, subsection (f) of this section or W.S.

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1 23-1-705(a), no person may apply for and receive more than 2 one (1) moose or one (1) ram bighorn sheep license in any 3 consecutive five (5) year period. Effective for the 1995 4 hunting season and each hunting season thereafter, licenses issued under this subsection shall be based upon the number 5 of points assigned to each applicant for a particular species. 6 7 Effective January 1, 2000, licenses issued under this 8 subsection shall be issued partially through a preference 9 point drawing and partially through a random drawing of all 10 remaining unsuccessful applicants for that year. The 11 department shall assign points to each license applicant for 12 a specific species by multiplying the number of years the applicant has unsuccessfully applied for a license times one 13 (1). The calculation used to assign points to an applicant 14 15 for a particular species under this subsection shall include 16 any year the applicant does not apply for a big or trophy 17 game animal hunting license for that species, provided in the case of a resident the applicant pays the fee specified in 18 19 W.S. 23-2-101(k) and in the case of a nonresident the 20 applicant pays the appropriate fee established by the 21 commission under W.S. 23-2-101(m). License applicants within each hunt area for a species shall be grouped according to 22 23 the number of assigned points for that species. Not less than

1 seventy-five percent (75%) of available licenses within any 2 hunt area shall be randomly selected through a preference 3 point drawing from among the group of applicants with the 4 largest number of assigned points and shall continue until all applicants within that group have been exhausted or until 5 all available licenses have been issued, whichever first 6 occurs. If any applicant grouping has been exhausted and 7 8 licenses remain available within that hunt area, selection 9 shall continue from among the group of applicants with the 10 next largest number of assigned points. After the selections 11 through the preference point drawing have been completed 12 within a hunt area, the remaining licenses available from that drawing and the licenses available for the random drawing 13 for that hunt area will be issued through a random selection 14 15 from among all applicants in the hunt area who were not 16 selected for issuance of a license for the species through the preference point drawing in that hunt area. For purposes 17 of assigning points under this subsection, any unsuccessful 18 19 license applicant failing to apply for a license, or pay the 20 applicable fee in lieu of applying, during the second calendar 21 year shall be considered to be a first year applicant for any 22 subsequent calendar year in which the applicant submits 23 license application for that particular species.

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2 23-2-101. Fees; restrictions; nonresident application fee; nonresident licenses; verification 3 of residency 4 required.

Subject to the provisions of this subsection, as part of any preference point program for nonresident 7 8 antelope, nonresident ram bighorn sheep, nonresident moose, nonresident deer or nonresident elk, the commission may 9 establish a nonrefundable fee to be either withheld from the 10 11 license fee remitted or submitted separately when application 12 for a license or preference point is made through electronic licensing, and may also establish a fee to be paid in lieu of 13 applying for licenses that are limited in quota. Retention 14 of the established fee or payment of the fee in lieu of 15 16 applying shall authorize the person to accumulate a preference point for future drawings for licenses that are 17 18 limited in quota for the applicable species in accordance 19 with rules of the commission. The rules may provide for the 20 loss of all accumulated points for persons failing to apply 21 or to pay the in lieu fee in two (2) consecutive calendar years. The fee for any program under this subsection for 22 23 antelope, deer or elk shall be established by rule and shall

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1 not exceed seventy-five dollars (\$75.00) per species. Payment 2 of the fee shall be made in compliance with application dates. 3 Nothing in this subsection authorizes the commission to 4 establish or retain a fee for resident moose or resident ram bighorn sheep license preference points in addition to the 5 fee established by subsection (k) of this section or to 6 establish rules for ram bighorn sheep or moose preference 7 8 point drawings in conflict with the provisions of W.S. 9 23-1-703 (b). For nonresident bighorn ram sheep 10 nonresident moose licenses, the commission may establish by 11 rule a nonrefundable preference point fee to be withheld from 12 either the license fee remitted or submitted separately when application for a license or preference point is made through 13 electronic licensing and may establish a fee in lieu of making 14 application in an amount greater than that established under 15 16 subsection (k) of this section, but neither fee shall exceed one hundred fifty dollars (\$150.00). Fees established under 17 18 this subsection may be set at lower amounts for youth license 19 applicants.
