7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

- 11 (a) The department of transportation and the
- 12 transportation commission shall administer a railroad quiet
- 13 zone program in conformity with the standards prescribed in
- 14 49 C.F.R. Part 222 for the establishment of quiet zones or
- 15 the installation of wayside horns to minimize the sounding

1 of locomotive horns in populated areas. Program projects

2 shall be prioritized in accordance with the 2009 Wyoming

3 Quiet Zone study conducted pursuant to 2008 Wyoming Session

4 Laws, Chapter 48, Section 335.

6 (b) The department of transportation and the

7 transportation commission shall arrange the assessed

8 valuation of each county in descending order by county and

9 shall require the following matching funds from counties:

10

(i) For the bottom seven (7) counties in the

12 list created, a two percent (2%) match is required;

13

14 (ii) For the middle eight (8) counties in the

15 list created, a thirteen percent (13%) match is required;

16

17 (iii) For the top eight (8) counties in the list

18 created, a thirty percent (30%) match is required.

20 (c) The department of transportation and the

21 transportation commission shall commit funds for the

22 projects based upon the prioritization list developed in

23 the 2009 Wyoming Quiet Zone study. If a sponsoring

1 governmental entity has not committed required funding to

2 undertake a project, the department of transportation and

3 the transportation commission may fund lower priority

4 projects as funds allow. For each project the funds shall

5 be utilized for the lowest cost, most feasible proposal as

6 determined by diagnostic review, or as otherwise

7 recommended by the 2009 Wyoming Quiet Zone study. Any costs

8 for improvements exceeding the lowest cost, most feasible

9 proposal or recommendation shall be paid entirely by the

10 sponsoring government entity.

12 (d) Any unexpended, unobligated amounts remaining in

13 the railroad quiet zone account established under 2011

14 Wyoming Session Laws, Chapter 88, Section 45, Footnote 7 is

15 reappropriated to the railroad quiet zone account which is

16 hereby established and shall only be used for the purposes

17 of this act. Funds reappropriated in this section shall

18 not be transferred or expended for any other purpose and

19 any unexpended, unobligated funds remaining from this

20 reappropriation shall revert as provided by law on June 30,
