SIXTY-FOUR LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WYOMING 2016 BUDGET SESSION

AN ACT relating to the military department; extending the sunset date for the Wyoming national guard youth challenge program; amending provisions controlling the expenditure of appropriated funds; providing an appropriation; and providing for an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

**Section 1.** W.S. 19-9-702 and 19-9-704 are amended to read:

## 19-9-702. Funding.

To the extent available, for every sixty cents (\$.60) forty cents (\$.40) of federal funds appropriated to the national guard youth challenge program, the department may expend funds appropriated by this state for this program in an amount not to exceed forty cents (\$.40) sixty cents (\$.60), or such other minimum amount as necessary to qualify for the appropriation of federal funds. The state appropriate funding in excess of that necessary to qualify for federal funds and the department shall be authorized to expend such state funds only when all federal funds are exhausted. All monies appropriated for purposes of this article are continuously appropriated to the department and shall not lapse until the program is terminated as provided by W.S. 19-9-704.

## 19-9-704. Sunset.

W.S. 19-9-701 through 19-9-703 are repealed effective June 30,  $\frac{2017}{2025}$ .

Section 2. There is appropriated two million five hundred ten thousand four hundred eight dollars
