AN ACT relating to school district facilities; providing that a school risk retention program satisfies a school facility insurance requirement; and providing for an effective date.

*Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:*

**Section 1.** W.S. 21-3-129(d) is amended to read:

**21-3-129. Comprehensive liability insurance; waiver of governmental immunity; property insurance.**

(d) The board of trustees of each school district within the state shall procure a policy or policies for property insurance covering all education, administrative and transportation facilities owned or maintained by the school district in an amount adequate to cover against loss or damage to those facilities, and against loss consequential upon that loss or damage, other than noncontractual legal liability for that loss or damage. The board of trustees of a school district may elect not to provide property insurance coverage for any facility valued at fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000.00) or less upon a per facility determination that the cost of insurance for the facility is disproportionately high when compared to the value of the facility to the school district. Coverage provided by a school district joint powers board ~~as of February 1, 2017, pursuant to W.S. 1-39-118(c)(ii) and subsection (a) of this section~~ shall satisfy the insurance requirement of this subsection. ~~until July 1, 2018, if kept in force. The coverage may be modified as needed.~~
