Student data privacy and transparency.

A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to education; prohibiting school districts

2 from accessing students' digital information accounts as

3 specified; providing for criminal penalties; amending

4 requirements of state data security plan to ensure privacy

5 of student data collected; requiring policies for the

6 collection, access, security and use of student data by

7 school districts; accordingly imposing duties; and

8 providing for an effective date.

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10 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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12 **Section 1.** W.S. 21-3-132 is created to read:

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14 21-3-132. Student digital information privacy;

15 prohibited acts; exceptions; penalties.

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1 (a) No officer or employee of a school district 2 organized within this state shall: 3 4 (i) Require or request a student or prospective student to disclose or to provide access to a digital 5 information account through the student's or prospective 6 student's username, password or other means 7 of 8 authentication that provides access; 9 (ii) Require or request a student or prospective 10 11 student to access a digital information account in the 12 presence of any officer or employee of the school district in a manner that enables the officer or employee to observe 13 the contents of the digital information account; 14 15 16 (iii) Compel a student or prospective student to add anyone to the student's or prospective student's list 17 18 of contacts associated with a digital information account 19 or require, request or cause a student or prospective 20 student to change the privacy settings associated with a 21 digital information account; 22

1 (iv) Expel, discharge, discipline, fail or 2 refuse to admit or otherwise penalize or threaten a student 3 or prospective student for refusing to disclose information 4 or to take action specified in this section; 5 (v) Require or request a student or prospective 6 student to waive or limit any protection granted under this 7 8 section. 9 (b) Nothing in this section shall prohibit an officer 10 11 or employee of a school district from: 12 13 (i) Conducting an investigation, without requiring or requesting access to a digital information 14 account through username, password or other means of 15 16 authentication, for the purpose of ensuring compliance with applicable law or school policies against student 17 misconduct based on the receipt of specific information 18 19 about activity associated with a student's digital 20 information account; 21 22 (ii) Requesting or receiving written

electronic consent from a student or prospective student,

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1 if emancipated or eighteen (18) years of age or older, or

2 the student's or prospective student's parent or legal

3 guardian if the student or prospective student is an

4 unemancipated minor, to observe the contents of a digital

5 information account, without requiring or requesting access

6 to the account through username, password or other means of

7 authentication;

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9 (iii) Viewing, accessing or utilizing

10 information about a student or prospective student that is

11 publicly available.

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13 (c) Nothing in this section shall apply to an account

14 opened, created or provided by a school district if the

15 student has been provided advance notice that the account

16 may be monitored at any time by an officer or employee of

17 the school district.

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19 (d) This section does not create a duty for an

20 officer or employee of a school district to search or

21 monitor the activity of a student's or prospective

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22 student's digital information account.

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(e) Any officer or employee of a school district 1 violating the provisions of this section is guilty of a 2 3 misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not more than one 4 thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) for the first violation and two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500.00) for each 5 subsequent violation. 6 7 8 (f) For purposes of this section "digital information account" means an electronic service or account used to 9 10 communicate or store digital assets. 11 12 **Section 2.** W.S. 21-2-202(a) (xxxiv) (intro), (H), (J), by creating new subparagraph (K) and by creating a new 13 paragraph (xxxvii) and 21-3-110(a) by creating new 14 paragraphs (xxxv) and (xxxvi) are amended to read: 15 16 17 21-2-202. Duties of the state superintendent. 18 19 (a) In addition to any other duties assigned by law, 20 the state superintendent shall: 21 22 (xxxiv) With the department of enterprise technology services, establish criteria for the collection, 23

1	storage, management and reporting of department of
2	education data <u>related</u> <u>including</u> , <u>but not limited</u> to
3	teacher certification, statewide education accountability
4	and assessment and the administration of the school finance
5	system. In carrying out this paragraph, the state
6	superintendent and the department of enterprise technology
7	services shall develop a data security plan that includes:
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9	(H) Prohibition of the sale <u>or trade</u> of
10	student data to private entities or organizations; and
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12	(J) All personally identifiable student
13	information being reported to the department of education
14	or the department of enterprise technology by a student's
15	Wyoming student record identification and locator number as
16	issued by the department of education: and
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18	(K) Standards and protocols to remove
19	personally identifiable information to conduct data
20	collection and analysis without disclosing the identity of
21	the student whose data is being collected and used.
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1	(xxxvii) In consultation with the department of
2	enterprise technology, the department of audit and school
3	districts, establish and maintain guidelines for school
4	districts for the collection, access, security and use of
5	student data by school districts. The guidelines shall, at
6	a minimum, be in compliance with the federal Family
7	Educational Rights and Privacy Act and other relevant
8	federal and state laws and include the following:
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10	(A) Authorization and authentication
11	mechanisms for accessing student data;
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13	(B) Administrative, physical and logical
14	security safeguards, including employee training and data
15	encryption;
