- 2 modifying provisions regulating the practice of public
- 3 accounting; and providing for an effective date.

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5 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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- 7 **Section 1.** W.S. 33-3-102(a)(vi)(C), by creating a new
- 8 subparagraph (E) and (ix), 33-3-104, 33-3-105, 33-3-107,
- 9 33-3-108(a) by creating a new paragraph (vii), 33-3-109(d),
- 10 (f) and (k)(intro), 33-3-112(b), 33-3-118(b)(xiii)(A), (B)
- 11 and (xiv)(intro), 33-3-119, 33-3-120(b), 33-3-121(a)(ii), by
- 12 creating new paragraphs (xii) and (xiii), (c) and by creating
- 13 a new subsection (d), 33-3-124 and 33-3-132(a)(ii) and (iii)

3	(a) As used in this act:
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5	(vi) "Attest service" means any of the financial
6	statement services described in the following subparagraphs.

1 (ix) "Compilation service" means providing a 2 service to be performed in accordance with the statements on 3 standards for accounting and review services that is 4 presented in the form the objective of which is to assist 5 management in the presentation of financial statements, 6 information that is the representation of the client, the 7 client's management or owners and to report on that 8 information without undertaking to express obtain or provide 9 any assurance on that there are no material modifications 10 that should be made to the financial statements in order for them to be in accordance with the applicable financial 11 12 reporting framework; 13 14 33-3-104. Board chairman; board secretary; regulations; quorum; seal; records. 15 16 17 The board shall elect annually a chairman and a secretary 18 from its members. The secretary shall receive report to the 19 board regarding revenue receipts and account for review 20 reports of all fees and other money received by the board. A 21 majority of the board shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. The board shall have a seal which 22

shall be judicially noticed. The board shall keep records of

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its proceedings. The board may employ personnel and arrange 1 2 for any assistance it may require in the performance of its 3 duties. 4 5 33-3-105. month to the state treasurer according to policy set by the

3 accountants held by the Wyoming state treasurer on the

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11 (f) Persons holding a certificate issued under W.S. 12 33-3-109 or 33-3-116 but who do not practice public accounting 13 in Wyoming and have not lost the right to active status shall may place the certificate on an inactive status. A person 14 15 classified as with a certificate on inactive status shall pay 16 an annual inactive fee not exceeding one-half (1/2) the annual 17 fee charged to active certificate holders. All inactive status certificates shall expire on the last day of December 18 19 of each year and may be renewed annually for a period of one 20 (1) year. If the fee is not paid by December 31, a late fee 21 as set by board rule in accordance with W.S. 33-1-201, may be added to the annual fee. A person classified as inactive may 22 assume or use the title or designation "certified public 23

14 (a) After notice and hearing, the board may revoke,

15 refuse to renew, reprimand, censure, limit the scope of

16 practice, place on probation with or without terms,

17 conditions or limitations, or may suspend for a period not to

18 exceed two (2) years, any certificate issued under this act

19 or practice privilege or may revoke, suspend, limit the scope

20 of practice, or refuse to renew any permit issued under this

21 act or may censure the holder of a permit for any of the

22 following causes:

1	(ii) Dishonesty, fraud or gross negligence by a
2	certificate holder or individual granted practice privileges:
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4	(A) In the practice of public accounting; or
5	
6	(B) In the filing or failure to file the
7	holder's or the individual's own income tax return.
8	
9	(xii) Making any false or misleading statement or
10	verification in support of an application for a license filed
11	by another;

13	(xiii) Performance of any fraudulent act while
14	holding a license or privilege issued under this act or prior
15	version of this act.

17	(c) In lieu of or in addition to any disciplinary action
18	specifically provided in subsection (a) of this section, the
19	board may require a certificate, practice privilege or permit
20	holder to complete such continuing professional education
21	programs as the board may specify or undergo peer review or
22	preissuance review as the board may specify.

1	(d) The board may recover from a disciplined person any
2	of the following:

4	(i) Costs associated with an investigation that
5	leads to disciplinary action including a reasonable hourly
6	rate for the time devoted by board members or attorneys
7	investigating or prosecuting the matter and all reasonable
8	related travel costs;

10	(ii) Direct costs to the board of conducting a
11	disciplinary hearing that leads to disciplinary action.

13	33-3-124. Reinstatement of certificate or permit for
14	good cause shown.

16	(a) Upon written application and after a hearing
17	attended by the applicant or the applicant's legal
18	representative and for good cause shown, the board may do any
19	of the following:

21	(i) Issue a new certificate to a certified public
22	accountant the applicant whose certificate has been revoked:
23	or may

5 (iii) Restore an applicant's scope of practice,

6 practice privilege or permit which has been revoked or

7 suspended.

(b) If after service of notice of the reinstatement hearing the applicant or the applicant's legal representative fails to appear at the hearing, the board may proceed to hear evidence against the applicant and may enter an appropriate order, which shall be final unless the applicant petitions for review, provided that within thirty (30) days from the date of the order, upon a showing of good cause of the applicant's failure to appear, the board may set aside the order and schedule a new hearing on the written application.

(c) A certificate, practice privilege or permit suspended or restricted under W.S. 33-3-121(b) may be reissued without the hearing required under this section if the department of family services provides notice that the applicant has complied with the terms of the court order that

1 resulted in the suspension or restriction of the certificate, 2 practice privilege or permit. 3 4 (d) The applicant shall bear all costs related to a 5 reinstatement hearing before the board. 6 7 33-3-132. Practice monitoring program. 8 (a) As used in this article: 9 10 (ii) "Practice monitoring program" means a program 11 12 consisting of peer reviews which are conducted in conformity with standards promulgated by the peer review committees of 13 the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants or 14 successor organization; 15 16 17 (iii) "Reviewer" means a certified public 18 accountant active in public practice and fulfilling 19 requirements for peer reviewers as established by the 20 American Institute of Certified Public Accountants or 21 successor organization.
