## A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to school facilities; clarifying components
- 2 of the school facility annual evaluation and needs
- 3 prioritization process; requiring periodic review and
- 4 evaluation of the prioritization process by the school
- 5 facilities commission; and providing for an effective date.

7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

- 9 **Section 1.** W.S. 21-15-115(c) and 21-15-117(a)(intro),
- 10 (i), (b) and by creating a new subsection (e) are amended
- 11 to read:

- 21-15-115. Statewide standards for school building
- 14 and facility adequacy; adequacy assessment.

- 16 (c) The commission shall not less than once every
- 17 four (4) years, review and evaluate the building and

1 facility adequacy standards established under subsection 2 (a) of this section. Review and evaluation of the standards 3 shall include the identification of local enhancements to 4 buildings and facilities during this review and evaluation 5 period, and based upon criteria and procedures developed by the commission, a determination as to whether and how any 6 7 local enhancements should be incorporated into the statewide standards. The review and evaluation under this 8 9 subsection shall extend to components of the annual 10 evaluation of school buildings, the facility remediation 11 schedule and the needs prioritization process established by the commission under W.S. 21-15-117. Findings and 12 13 recommendations pursuant to this subsection shall be reported to the select committee on school facilities 14 before the next convening date of the legislative session 15 immediately following completion of the review 16 17 evaluation, and shall specifically address any need to 18 expand the needs assessment, or to conduct a reassessment 19 of building and facility adequacy or to modify the needs 20 prioritization process.

2	(a) Through the identification of school building and
3	facility conditions and needs provided by the assessment
4	conducted and maintained under W.S. 21-15-115, and a
5	comparison of the identified conditions and needs with the
6	established statewide building adequacy standards and the
7	district facility plans developed under W.S. 21-15-116, the
8	commission shall in coordination and cooperation with the
9	districts, evaluate the adequacy of school buildings and
10	facilities within local school districts, and based upon
11	this evaluation, establish a schedule for building and
12	facility remediation. Remediation shall bring all buildings
13	and facilities to conditions such that over time, only
14	routine maintenance is required to maintain building
15	adequacy. The schedule shall identify and prioritize
16	building and facility remedies on a statewide basis, based
17	upon a building condition score developed by the commission
18	subject to the following:

20 (i) Criteria <u>and measures</u> for <u>building capacity</u>,
21 building condition, <u>which incorporate</u> educational
22 suitability and technology readiness, <u>specifically taking</u>
23 <u>into consideration appropriate and up-to-date standards for</u>
24 air quality, illumination and appropriateness of the

1 student environment, as established by commission rule and

2 regulation, which over time bring statewide buildings and

3 facilities to targeted adequate levels prescribed by the

4 commission, reviewed annually, based upon assessment

5 results and findings, broken down by educational and

6 noneducational building category;

The commission shall for each building and 8 (b) 9 facility remedy scheduled under subsection (a) of this section, determine the most cost effective method of 10 11 remediation of building and facility needs to deliver quality educational services and ensure compliance with the 12 13 statewide adequacy standards. The commission shall only 14 request capital outlay for a building with capacity needs identified under paragraph (a)(iii) of this section after 15 consideration of all other remedies for that building, 16 17 including reorganization of schools within the district. For any scheduled remedy for which major building and 18 19 facility repair and replacement payments under W.S. 20 21-15-109 are not sufficient to remedy the scheduled need, 21 as determined by the commission, the commission shall

determine if the remedy requires capital outlay.
