## A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to state lands; requiring state agencies to
- 2 obtain the advice and consent of the board of land
- 3 commissioners before the receipt, acquisition, exchange,
- 4 sale or disposal of land; and providing for an effective
- 5 date.

7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

8

9 **Section 1.** W.S. 36-2-111 is created to read:

10

- 11 36-2-111. Advice and consent for the sale, exchange
- 12 or acquisition of land.

13

- 14 No state agency, board, commission, department, division or
- 15 other instrumentality or officer shall receive, acquire,

1 exchange, sell or otherwise dispose of land without first

2 receiving the advice and consent of the board.

4 **Section 2.** W.S. 11-10-107, 19-7-103(b)(x) through

5 (xii) and (xvi), 21-17-204(a)(iv), 23-1-302(a)(iii)(intro),

6 (iv) and (v), 24-2-102(a)(i)(intro) and (ii),

7 24-2-109(b)(ii), 33-19-106(b), 35-11-1205(a)(intro),

 $8 \quad 36-4-104(a)(i), \quad 36-4-106(a), \quad 36-4-107, \quad 36-4-108(a)$  and

9 41-2-114(a)(iv)(C) are amended to read:

11 11-10-107. Power of board to acquire land; authority

12 to make rules and regulations; renting and use of

13 fairgrounds; gambling and liquor prohibited.

14

15 Subject to W.S. 36-2-111, the board may acquire by donation

16 or lease in the name of the state any lands necessary for

17 conducting the state fair, and may make all rules and

18 regulations necessary for the conduct and government of the

19 exhibitions, the sale of privileges, and the proper

20 control, operation and conduct of the state fair not

21 inconsistent with the constitution and laws of this state.

22 The board may rent out or donate the use of the state

23 fairgrounds for stabling and training stock and holding

24 stock sales. The grounds may be used free of charge for

1 encampment grounds for the state militia under the

2 direction of the adjutant general of the state. The board

3 may permit the grounds and facilities to be used for other

4 purposes and may charge fees as it deems necessary to pay

5 the expenses of maintaining the grounds and facilities. The

6 board shall not permit any gambling device of any nature to

7 be operated on the grounds, or permit any unlawful betting,

8 or permit any intoxicating liquors to be sold thereon

9 except as provided by W.S. 12-4-505.

10

11 19-7-103. Adjutant general; appointment; rank;

12 removal; duties and qualifications.

13

14 (b) The adjutant general of Wyoming shall have powers

15 and duties and be paid a salary as follows:

16

17 (x) Subject to W.S. 36-2-111, he may purchase

18 for cash or upon contract or otherwise acquire lands within

19 Wyoming for use by the national guard or for the use of

20 other elements of the armed forces as an artillery and

21 target range and training and maneuvering area. He may

22 acquire lands for such purposes by eminent domain when the

23 state board of land commissioners gives its written

24 approval or consent;

1

2 Subject to W.S. 36-2-111, he may accept (xi) 3 gifts of land for the purposes provided by paragraph (x) of 4 this subsection and may lease, or accept payment in kind as 5 consideration for any lease, any of the acquired parcels of land or buildings during periods when the lands are not in 6 use for military purposes. He may acquire and install on 7 the land such permanent improvements, including fences, as 8 9 may be necessary for the full utilization of the land for the military purposes herein declared; 10

11

Subject to W.S. 36-2-111, he may dispose 12 (xii) 13 of lands, buildings or fixtures under the control of the department by sale, exchange or other transfer. He may 14 execute deeds for such transfers in the name of the state. 15 Money from such sale, exchange or transfer may be utilized 16 17 for the acquisition of additional lands, buildings or fixtures within the same budget biennium. Any such sale, 18 exchange or other transfer shall be conducted in accordance 19 20 with the provisions of W.S. 36-9-101, 36-9-102 and 36-9-104 21 through 36-9-120, except these provisions of W.S. title 36, 22 chapter 9 shall not apply when both the title to the land and to all buildings thereon is solely in the name of the 23 department or any division of the department and the 24

1 provisions of W.S. 9-2-1016(b)(viii) also shall not apply when both the title to the land and to all buildings 2 thereon is solely in the name of the department or any 3 4 division of the department. The sections of title 36 5 identified in this paragraph and W.S. 9-2-1016(b)(viii) also shall not apply when any such sale, exchange or other 6 transfer is to another governmental entity, state agency or 7 local government, as defined in W.S. 1-39-103, even if the 8 9 title to the land and to all buildings thereon are not solely in the name of the department or a division thereof; 10 11 12 (xvi) He shall control all armories that are owned, 13 erected, purchased, leased or provided by the 14 Subject to W.S. 36-2-111, he may acquire, in the name of the state of Wyoming, by purchase, donation or dedication 15 any property which may be used for military purposes. For 16 17 the control and management of armories described in this paragraph, he may establish armory boards whose personnel 18 shall serve without pay. Subject to his direction, armory 19 boards shall control, manage and supervise all activities 20 21 armories and may rent armories to persons 22 organizations not connected with the organized militia;

21-17-204. Additional powers and duties; sectarian or partisan instruction or test prohibited.

3

The board of trustees shall prescribe rules for 4 5 the government of the university and all its branches, elect the requisite officers, professors, instructors and 6 employees, a director of finance and budget 7 superintendent of buildings and grounds, any of whom may be 8 9 removed for cause, and fix the salary and term of office of each. The board of trustees shall prescribe the studies to 10 11 be pursued and the textbooks to be used, and determine the qualifications of applicants for admission to the various 12 13 courses of study. No instruction either sectarian in 14 religion or partisan in politics shall ever be allowed in any department of the university, and no sectarian or 15 partisan test shall ever be exercised or allowed in the 16 17 appointment of trustees or in the election or removal of professors, teachers or other officers of the university or 18 in the admission of students thereto, or for any purpose 19 whatsoever. 15 including land, water and improvements for any necessary

19 law.

1 (b) Pursuant to W.S. 24-2-102:

3 (ii) Subject to W.S. 36-2-111, the commission 4 shall have the authority to acquire by purchase or gift, 5 the parcel or parcels of property that may be severed or damaged as a result of the acquisition of the highway 6 right-of-way; provided, that the commission shall not 7 acquire any such parcel or parcels of land by purchase or 8 9 gift until full settlement has been made for the damages to 10 the landowner as otherwise provided by law;

12 33-19-106. Screening; relocation or removal of 13 junkyards; condemnation proceedings.

commission 15 (b) When the determines that the topography of the land adjoining the interstate or primary 16 17 systems will not permit adequate screening of junkyards, or that the screening would not be economically 18 feasible, the commission may require the 19 relocation, 20 removal or disposal of the junk and junkyard by negotiation 21 condemnation. Subject to W.S. 36-2-111, when the 22 commission determines that it is in the best interests of the state, it may acquire such land or interest in land as 23 24 necessary to provide adequate screening of the junkyards.

4 (a) <u>Subject to W.S. 36-2-111</u>, the state may acquire
5 any land, by purchase, donation or condemnation, which is
6 adversely affected by past coal mining practices if the
7 director, with the concurrence of the governor, finds that
8 acquisition of the land is necessary to successful

11 36-4-104. Powers; interpretive service agreements.

13 (a) The department of state parks and cultural 14 resources, in consultation with the commission, may, 15 subject to the provisions of this act:

(i) <u>Subject to W.S. 36-2-111</u>, acquire and accept title in the name of the state of Wyoming, by grant, dedication, gift, devise, donation, or demise, to any lands suitable as an outdoor recreation area or facility;

22 **36-4-106.** Plan for acquisition and development of 23 resources; authority of department; coordination of

1 activities; exceptions; agreements with United States;

2 state archaeologist.

(a) The department of state parks and cultural 4 5 resources, in consultation with the commission, prepare, maintain and keep up to date a comprehensive plan 6 for the acquisition and development of outdoor recreation 7 resources of the state. The department and the commission 8 9 shall prepare the comprehensive plan in accordance with subsections (e) and (f) of this section. 10 Subject to W.S. 11 36-2-111, authority is hereby granted to the department of state parks and cultural resources, in consultation with 12 13 the commission, to develop, operate and maintain outdoor recreation areas and facilities of the state and to acquire 14 pursuant to provisions of law, but not by the power of 15 eminent domain, land, waters and interest in land and 16 17 waters for such areas and facilities. Authority is hereby granted to the department, in consultation with 18 commission, to enter into contracts and agreements with the 19 20 United States, or any appropriate agency thereof, to keep 21 financial and other records relating thereto, and to 22 furnish to appropriate officials and agencies of the United States such reports and information as may be reasonably 23 necessary to enable such officials or agencies to perform 24

1 their duties under the provisions of Public Law 88-578 or

2 any other applicable federal statutes.

3

4 36-4-107. Authority to lease; exchange of lands and 5 contracts with United States.

6

The department, in consultation with the commission, shall 7 have the power and is hereby authorized to lease, grant or 8 9 operate any outdoor recreation area or facility belonging 10 to the state which is not subject to lease, grant or operation by another agency of the state. Subject to W.S. 11 36-2-111, the department, in consultation with 12 13 commission, may exchange state lands which are 14 appropriated to other use for United States outdoor recreation areas and facilities, and under contract with 15 the United States, may take over the management, leasing 16 17 and operation of any such area or facility. Where the department deems it to be in the best interest of the 18 19 state, it may, in consultation with the commission, contract with the United States 20 government or 21 authorized federal agency for the operation of any outdoor 22 recreation area or facility established by the department.

1 36-4-108. Acquisition and supervision of historical parks and sites.

3

Subject to W.S. 36-2-111, the department, 4 5 consultation with the commission, may receive or acquire, but not by use of the power of eminent domain, historical 6 parks and sites within the state. Nothing in this section 7 limits the authority of the department to receive, acquire 8 9 and to maintain, but not by use of the power of eminent domain, land for other outdoor recreation areas 10 11 facilities. The department shall be subject to the provisions of W.S. 36-4-106(e) and (f) when acting pursuant 12 13 to this section.

14

15 41-2-114. Development of water projects;
16 rehabilitation of water projects.

17

18 (a) The commission shall, on the basis of the state
19 water plan or as otherwise directed by the legislature and
20 after consultation with and advice from state agencies and
21 officials, other appropriate agencies and officials, the
22 joint business council of the Eastern Shoshone and Northern
23 Arapaho Indian tribes, the business council of the Eastern
24 Shoshone Indian tribe, the business council of the Northern

1 Arapaho Indian tribe and members of the public, identify

2 and select potential projects to be studied for inclusion

3 in the Wyoming water development program pursuant to the

4 following schedule:

(iv) Level III construction and operation plans 6 shall proceed as authorized and approved by the legislature 7 immediate direction and control 8 under the of the 9 commission.
