- 16 shall provide to each affected agency a list of existing

The report shall include: 2 3 4 (III) An explanation of why each fund amount did not revert and additionally—for each capital 5 outlay or information technology project for which funds did not revert, a description of the project; 7 8 **Section 2.** W.S. 9-4-207(e)(iii)(A) is repealed. 9 10 11 Section 3. This act is effective July 1, 2016. 12
