## A BILL

## for

1 AN ACT relating to water development projects; authorizing specified level I and level II studies; 2 providing 3 appropriations; requiring reports; providing for the reversion of unexpended funds; authorizing unobligated 4 5 funds to be used to complete other designated projects as 6 specified; extending reversion and study dates; transferring funds from water development account I to 7 8 water development account II; and providing for an 9 effective date.

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: [2021-2022 WATER PROGRAM]

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14 [AUTHORIZED LEVEL I AND LEVEL II STUDIES]

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1 Section 1. LEVEL I RECONNAISSANCE STUDIES - NEW DEVELOPMENT. The following sums of money are appropriated 2 3 from water development account I, as created by W.S. 4 41-2-124(a)(i), to the water development commission to be expended to conduct the following reconnaissance studies as 5 defined in W.S. 41-2-114. Funds appropriated under this б 7 section for a particular project which are in excess of the 8 actual amount necessary to complete the study may, subject to the review of the select water committee, be expended by 9 10 the commission to complete the reconnaissance study for any 11 other project listed in this section. Appropriated funds not obligated prior to July 1, 2024 shall revert to water 12 development account I. The commission shall submit a report 13 to the legislature on each of the following studies prior 14 15 to the 2023 legislative session:

Section 6. The Wyoming water development commission 14 15 is hereby authorized to transfer four million three hundred 16 thousand dollars (\$4,300,000.00) from water development created by W.S. 41-2-124(a)(i) to water 17 Ι account development account II created by W.S. 41-2-124(a)(ii) for 18 the LaPrele Irrigation District Rehabilitation, Phase II 19 20 study. The appropriation of funds for the LePrele Irrigation District Rehabilitation, Phase 21 II study in Section 4 of this act is contingent upon this transfer of 22 23 funds to water development account II.

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Section 7. This act is effective immediately upon completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming Constitution.
