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9	Section 1. W.S. 21-4-701 through 21-4-703 are created

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11 12	ARTICLE 7
12	ARTICLE 7 SCHOOL ATHLETICS SAFETY
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1 This article shall be known and may be cited as the "School 2 Athletics Safety Act." 3 4 21-4-702. Definitions. 5 (a) As used in the article: 6 7 8 (i) "Academic year" means as defined in W.S. 9 21-16-1301(a)(ii); 10 (ii) "Athletic coach or trainer" means any paid 11 or volunteer individual whose responsibilities include 12 coaching, athletic training or advising a school athletic 13 team or club; 14 15 16 (iii) "Head injury" means a trauma that leads to 17 an injury to the scalp, skull or brain; 18 19 (iv) "School athletic event" means athletic 20 activities sanctioned by the Wyoming high school activities 21 association and school sponsored athletic activities in 22 middle or junior high school which directly correspond to those high school activities sanctioned by the Wyoming high 23 school activities association; 24

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2 "Student athlete" means a junior high school (v) 3 or senior high school student who engages in, is eligible 4 to engage in or seeks to engage in a school athletic event. 5 21-4-703. Safety of student athletes; prohibition on 6 participation; training; rules; consent to participate. 7 8 9 An athletic coach or trainer shall not allow a (a) student athlete to participate in a school athletic event 10 11 on the same day that the student athlete meets one (1) or both of the following criteria: 12 13 14 (i) Exhibits signs, symptoms or behaviors consistent with a concussion or other head injury after a 15 coach or trainer, a school official or a student athlete 16 17 reports, observes or suspects that the student athlete exhibiting these signs, symptoms or behaviors has sustained 18 a concussion or other head injury; or 19 20 21 (ii) Has been diagnosed with a concussion or 22 other head injury. 23

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(b) An athletic coach or trainer may allow a student 1 athlete who has been prohibited from participating in a 2 3 school athletic event pursuant to subsection (a) of this section to participate in a school athletic event no sooner 4 5 than the day after the student athlete has received a blow to the head or body and only after the student athlete: 6 7 (i) No longer exhibits any sign, symptom or 8 9 behavior consistent with a concussion or other head injury; 10 and 11 (ii) Receives a medical release from a licensed 12 13 health care professional. 14 (c) Each school district shall ensure that each 15 athletic coach or trainer participating in school athletic 16 activities in the school district receives training 17 provided pursuant to subsection (d) of this section. 18 19 The state board of education shall consult with (d) 20 21 school districts and promulgate rules to establish: 22 consistent with 23 (i) Protocols and content current 24 medical knowledge and the guidelines of а

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1 nationally recognized high school athletics organization such as the national federation of high school associations 2 for training each athletic coach or trainer participating 3 4 in school athletic events to: 5 (A) Understand the nature 6 and risk of concussion and other head injuries associated with athletic 7 activity; and 8 9 10 Recognize signs, symptoms or behaviors (B) consistent with a concussion or other head injury when a 11 coach or trainer suspects or observes that a student 12 13 athlete has received a blow to the head or body. 14 (ii) The nature and content of concussion and 15 other head injury information forms and educational 16 17 materials for, and the means of providing these forms and materials to, athletic coaches 18 or trainers, student student athletes' 19 athletes and parents quardians or regarding the nature and risk of concussion and other head 20 21 injuries resulting from athletic activity, including the 22 risk of continuing or returning to athletic activity after 23 a concussion or other head injury.

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(e) At the beginning of each academic year, a school 1 2 district shall provide a concussion and other head injury 3 information form created pursuant to subsection (d) of this 4 section to a student athlete and the student athlete's 5 parent or guardian. The school district shall receive the concussion and other 6 signatures on head injury information form from the student athlete and the student 7 athlete's parent or guardian before permitting the student 8 9 athlete to begin or continue participating in school athletic events for that academic year. 10 11 Section 2. This act is effective July 1, 2011. 12 13
