15 21-4-701. School athletics safety; short title.

2 This article shall be known and may be cited as the "School

3 Athletics Safety Act."

5 **21-4-702.** Definitions.

6

7 (a) As used in the article:

8

9 (i) "Academic year" means as defined in W.S.

10 21-16-1301(a)(ii);

11

12 (ii) "Athletic coach or athletic trainer" means

13 any paid or volunteer individual whose responsibilities

14 include coaching, athletic training or advising a school

15 athletic team or club;

16

17 (iii) "Head injury" means a trauma that leads to

18 an injury to the scalp, skull or brain;

19

20 (iv) "School athletic event" means athletic

21 activities sanctioned by the Wyoming high school activities

22 association and school sponsored athletic activities in

23 middle or junior high school which directly correspond to

1 those high school activities sanctioned by the Wyoming high

2 school activities association;

4 (v) "Student athlete" means a junior high

5 school, middle school or senior high school student who

6 engages in, is eligible to engage in or seeks to engage in

7 a school athletic event.

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9 21-4-703. Safety of student athletes; prohibition on

10 participation; training; rules; consent to participate.

11

12 (a) An athletic coach or athletic trainer shall not

13 allow a student athlete to participate in a school athletic

14 event on the same day that the student athlete meets one

15 (1) or both of the following criteria:

16

17 (i) Exhibits signs, symptoms or behaviors

18 consistent with a concussion or other head injury after a

19 coach or trainer, a school official or a student reports,

20 observes or suspects that the student athlete exhibiting

21 these signs, symptoms or behaviors has sustained a

22 concussion or other head injury; or

1 (ii) Has been diagnosed with a concussion or 2 other head injury.

3

4 (b) An athletic coach or athletic trainer may allow a 5 student athlete who has been prohibited from participating 6 in a school athletic event pursuant to subsection (a) of 7 this section to participate in a school athletic event no 8 sooner than the day after the student athlete has received

a blow to the head or body and only after the student

12 (i) No longer exhibits any sign, symptom or 13 behavior consistent with a concussion or other head injury;

16 (ii) Receives a medical release from a licensed
17 health care professional.

18

19 (c) Each school district shall ensure that each
20 athletic coach or athletic trainer participating in school
21 athletic activities in the school district receives
22 training provided pursuant to subsection (d) of this
23 section.

The state board of education shall consult with 1 (d)

school districts and promulgate rules to establish: 2

(i) Protocols and content consistent with 4

5 current medical knowledge and the guidelines of a

nationally recognized high school athletics organization 6

such as the national federation of high school associations 7

for training each athletic coach or athletic trainer 8

9 participating in school athletic events to:

10

11 (A) Understand the nature and risk of

concussion and other head injuries associated with athletic 12

13 activity; and

14

(B) Recognize signs, symptoms or behaviors 15

consistent with a concussion or other head injury when a 16

17 coach or trainer suspects or observes that a student

athlete has received a blow to the head or body. 18

(ii) The nature and content of concussion and 20

21 other head injury information forms and educational

22 materials for, and the means of providing these forms and

materials to, athletic coaches or athletic trainers, 23

student athletes and student athletes' parents or guardians 24

1 regarding the nature and risk of concussion and other head

2 injuries resulting from athletic activity, including the

3 risk of continuing or returning to athletic activity after

4 a concussion or other head injury;

5

6 (iii) The definition of health care professional

7 for purposes of paragraph (b)(ii) of this section.

8

9 (e) At the beginning of each academic year, a school

10 district shall provide a concussion and other head injury

11 information form created pursuant to subsection (d) of this

12 section to a student athlete and the student athlete's

13 parent or guardian. The school district shall receive

14 signatures on the concussion and other head injury

15 information form from the student athlete and the student

16 athlete's parent or guardian before permitting the student

17 athlete to begin or continue participating in school

18 athletic events for that academic year.

Section 2. This act is effective July 1, 2011.
