1 AN ACT relating to the Wyoming Wildlife and Natural Resource Funding Act; providing for funding of 2 projects under that act; specifying large projects approved 3 4 for funding in 2022; specifying conditions for project funding; authorizing distributions from the Wyoming 5 6 wildlife and natural resource trust income account for 7 approved large projects; providing for the reversion of funds; repealing statutes previously authorizing large 8 9 projects that are completed; and providing for an effective 10 date.
