## A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to water development; providing amendments
- 2 to the water development program; providing for
- 3 contingencies; clarifying authority of the Wyoming water
- 4 development commission regarding specified interstate
- 5 projects and programs; and providing for an effective date.

7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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- 9 **Section 1.** W.S. 41-2-118(a)(xiii), (xiv) and by
- 10 creating a new paragraph (xv), 99-3-1106(a)(intro), (iii),
- 11 (vii), (b) (intro), (iii), (iv) and (vii) and
- 12 99-3-1304(j)(intro), (iii) and (vii) are amended to read:

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14 41-2-118. Powers, duties, salaries and expenses of

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1 (a) The commission shall:

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3 (xiii) Represent or advocate the state's
4 interests in negotiations and construction of water
5 projects assigned by the legislature or the governor; and
6

7 (xiv) Have authority to temporarily defer the 8 principal amount due on debt service payments for money loaned to an irrigation district, watershed improvement 9 district, conservation district or a conservancy district 10 11 for construction of water development projects whenever the 12 governor has declared that a drought emergency exists within the affected district's service area. The district 13 14 shall be eligible for the temporary deferral of the principal amount due, provided the interest payments on the 15 16 remaining principal amount are paid and current. 17 commission shall amend the amortization schedule to reflect the length of time from the date the affected district 18 19 seeks the temporary deferral to the date the governor 20 declares the emergency drought condition no longer exists; -

Upper Colorado River Basin Fund Memorandum 15 of Agreement. 16 17 (a) Pursuant to a Memorandum of Agreement entered into on January 24, 2011, by and among the states 18 19 of Colorado, New Mexico, Utah and Wyoming; the Colorado 20 River Energy Distributors Association, Inc. (CREDA); the 21 Department of the Interior, Bureau of Reclamation; and the Department of Energy, Western Area Power Administration, 22 23 the state of Wyoming has certain specified rights to apply

1 for and recommend the expenditure of a percentage of

2 collected revenues defined under section 5(e) of the

3 Colorado River Storage Project Act, codified beginning at

4 43 U.S.C. § 620, as amended and supplemented, identified in

5 the MOA as CRSPA. The MOA will expire on September 30,

6 2025, unless modified or extended.

7

8 (b) The MOA provides that each signatory state,

9 including the state of Wyoming, may apply for a percentage

10 of collected revenues, accounted for under the terms of the

11 MOA, as funding assistance for qualifying projects or

12 activities within the Upper Colorado River Basin.

13 Qualifying projects or activities are those which further

14 the purposes of CRSPA, as amended and supplemented, are

15 within the Bureau of Reclamation's authorities and are

16 recommended by the signatory states and CREDA. It is the

17 responsibility of each signatory state to prioritize and

18 recommend proposed projects or activities within the state

19 for participation under the MOA.

20

21 (c) The Wyoming water development commission shall

22 evaluate, prioritize and recommend to the Bureau of

1 Reclamation proposed qualifying projects within the state

2 of Wyoming for participation under the MOA.

3

4 (d) The commission shall establish criteria and

5 administrative procedures for the evaluation,

6 prioritization and recommendation of proposed qualifying

7 projects within the state of Wyoming for participation

8 under the MOA.

9

10 (e) The establishment of criteria and administrative

11 procedures for the evaluation, prioritization and

12 recommendation of qualifying projects under this section,

13 and the decisions of the commission relating to the

14 evaluation, prioritization and recommendation to the Bureau

15 of Reclamation of qualifying projects for participation

16 under the MOA, are specifically exempt from the provisions

17 of the Wyoming Administrative Procedure Act including

18 judicial review under W.S. 16-3-114 and 16-3-115.

19

20 (f) The authority granted to the commission under

21 this section and any criteria or administrative procedures

22 established pursuant to this section shall be effective

23 only so long as the MOA is in effect or collected revenues

1 remain available to fund qualifying projects, whichever is

2 later.

4 Section 3. BSP - Colorado River Basin States Salinity

5 Control Program.

6

7 (a) Congress created the Colorado River Basin 8 Salinity Control Program (Program) in 1974 with the

9 enactment of the Colorado River Basin Salinity Control Act,

10 Public Law 93-320. The Program is a cooperative effort

11 among water users in the Colorado River Basin, the seven

12 Colorado River Basin states, the USDA - Natural Resources

13 Conservation Service (NRCS), the Bureau of Reclamation and

14 the Bureau of Land Management to reduce the amount of salt

15 in the Colorado River and its impacts on water users.

(b) Section 205 of the Colorado River Basin Salinity

Control Act directs the Bureau of Reclamation to expend

funds from the Upper Colorado River Basin Fund and the

Lower Colorado River Basin Development Fund. The Basin

States Program (BSP) was created with the amendment of the

original 1974 Act and provides that cost share obligations

be met through an up-front cost share. Expenditures from

- 1 the BSP may be used to cost share in the implementation of
- 2 salinity control measures and the Bureau of Reclamation has
- 3 determined Wyoming, through the Wyoming Water Development
- 4 Commission, to be an appropriate partner in the BSP.

5

- 6 (c) Program project sponsors: Eligible public
- 7 entities in the Green River and Little Snake River
- 8 drainages in Wyoming; eligible private entities located in
- 9 the Green River or Little Snake River drainages in Wyoming
- 10 that qualify for on-farm federal assistance.

11

- 12 (d) Program purpose: Reduce salinity in the surface
- 13 waters of the Colorado River and its tributaries in
- 14 Wyoming.

15

- 16 (e) Project description: Cost effectively reduce
- 17 salinity and conduct planning studies for salinity control
- 18 activities.

19

- 20 (f) Program budget: Two million eight hundred
- 21 thousand dollars (\$2,800,000.00) total grant budget
- 22 authorizing the Bureau of Reclamation to provide
- 23 incremental grants for the Program.

1 2 (g) State appropriation: none. 3 4 (h) Special conditions: 5 (i) The Wyoming water development commission 6 shall accept, evaluate and rank proposed qualifying 7 projects within the state of Wyoming for participation in 8 the Program; 9 10 11 (ii) The commission shall recommend its ranking 12 proposed qualifying projects to the Bureau of Reclamation. The Bureau of Reclamation retains final 13 authority on all funding decisions; 14 15 16 (iii) With the concurrence of the Bureau of 17 Reclamation, the commission may award grants to eligible project sponsors; 18 19

20 (iv) Project sponsors shall substantiate the 21 public benefit that will accrue due to participation in the

22 Program;

1 (v) The commission shall establish criteria and

2 administrative procedures for the acceptance, evaluation

3 and ranking of qualifying projects within the state of

4 Wyoming for participation in the Program;

5

6 (vi) The establishment of criteria and

7 administrative procedures for the acceptance, evaluation

8 and ranking of qualifying projects under this section, and

9 the decisions of the commission relating to the acceptance,

10 evaluation and ranking of qualifying projects for

11 participation under the Colorado River Basin States

12 Program, are specifically exempt from the provisions of the

13 Wyoming Administrative Procedure Act including judicial

14 review under W.S. 16-3-114 and 16-3-115;

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16 (vii) The authority granted to the commission

17 under this section, and any criteria or administrative

18 procedures established pursuant to this section, shall be

19 effective only so long as the Colorado River Basin States

20 Program is in operation or there are still Program grant

21 dollars to be spent, whichever is later.

Section 4. This act is effective immediately upon completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming Constitution.
