## A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to boards and commissions; repealing the
- 2 advisory council for innovative education, the governor's
- 3 food safety council, and the Wyoming education, planning
- 4 and coordination council; and providing for an effective
- 5 date.

7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

- 9 **Section 1.** W.S. 21-2-201(c)(ii), 21-22-102(a)(i),
- 10 21-22-107(a), (d) through (g), 35-7-110(a)(xxxi),
- 11 35-7-115(a), 35-7-119(d) and 35-7-123(a)(iii) and (b)(ii)
- 12 are amended to read:

- 14 21-2-201. General supervision of public schools
- 15 entrusted to state superintendent.

1 (c) In addition to any other duties assigned by law,

2 the state superintendent shall:

- 4 (ii) Administer and implement the "teacher of
- 5 the year program," which shall include an unbiased,
- 6 objective process to annually select the individual most
- 7 deserving of the award; and capable of serving on the board
- 8 under W.S. 21 22 103;

Submitted 8 9 proposals shall be in a form provided and prescribed by the 10 department, which shall require the state minimum 11 information necessary to describe the proposal without unduly burdening the applicant, including target 12 populations and objectives, compliance with criteria 13 14 prescribed under W.S. 21-22-106 and proper grant expenditures including program budget and evaluation.

17 The state advisory council department shall award a grant authorized under this section to at least one (1) 18 district from each classification pursuant to subsection 19 (c) of this section. Nothing in this subsection shall 20 21 prohibit the advisory council state department from 22 awarding grants to more than one (1) district under each classification or more than one (1) grant to the same 23

1 school district under criteria established under W.S.

2 21-22-106.

(e) Subject to available funding, the state advisory 4 5 council for innovative department education shall select fulfill criteria determines best 6 those proposals it established under W.S. 21-22-106 and promote excellence in 7 public education. The advisory council state department 8 9 may use available funds to support innovative program 10 evaluation projects and may through the state department, 11 contract with the University of Wyoming to conduct program evaluations. 12
