A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to student and school safety and security;
- 2 modifying duties of the state superintendent of public
- 3 instruction and school district boards of trustees; amending
- 4 school safety drill requirements; providing an appropriation;
- 5 and providing for an effective date.

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7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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- 9 **Section 1.** W.S. 21-2-202(a) by creating a new paragraph
- 10 (xxxviii), 21-3-110(a) by creating new paragraphs (xxxvii)
- 11 and (xxxviii) and 35-9-505(b) are amended to read:

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21-2-202. Duties of the state superintendent.

- 15 (a) In addition to any other duties assigned by law,
- 16 the state superintendent shall:

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2 (xxxviii) Create model school safety and security 3 guidelines to assist school districts in developing 4 comprehensive safety and security plans, as required by W.S. 5 21-3-110(a)(xxxvii), in consultation with a school safety and security advisory committee assembled by the state 6 superintendent. The advisory committee may be comprised of 7 8 representatives from the governor's office, Wyoming school 9 districts, the attorney general's office, the division of 10 homeland security, the school facilities division of the state construction department, the department of health, the 11 12 department of education, the department of fire prevention 13 and electrical safety, the Wyoming national guard, law enforcement and first <u>responder agencies and parents and</u> 14 students. The advisory committee may assist the state 15 16 superintendent with other matters relating to school safety and security and may meet at the call of the state 17 18 superintendent.

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20 **21-3-110.** Duties of boards of trustees.

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22 (a) The board of trustees in each school district 23 shall:

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5 35-9-505. Applicability; fire and safety drills 6 required in schools; supervision of drills.

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8 In every public and private school in Wyoming, (b) 9 there shall be a fire drill at least once every month. Safety 10 drills may be used in lieu of fire drills if approved by and 11 coordinated with the local fire department provided fire 12 drills are conducted at each school not less than four (4) 13 times during any one (1) academic year and further provided the school's fire alarm is tested at each fire or safety 14 15 drill. A safety drill includes any organized response to a 16 potential threat to the health and safety of the student 17 population and drills contemplated by a school district's comprehensive safety and security plan developed in 18 19 accordance with W.S. 21-3-110(a)(xxxvii). The 20 administration shall supervise and administer this subsection 21 and shall determine the types of safety drills appropriate for each school. In localities where a paid fire department 22 23 is maintained, a fire department member shall be requested to

1 be in attendance at each fire or safety drill conducted within

2 a school for the purpose of instruction and constructive

3 criticism.

5 Section 2.

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(a) There is appropriated one hundred thousand dollars 7 8 (\$100,000.00) from the school foundation program account to 9 the department of education. This appropriation shall only be 10 expended for purposes of assisting school districts to 11 provide safety and security training to school district 12 staff. The department shall endeavor to provide funding to as 13 many school districts as possible. The appropriation provided in this section shall be for the period beginning July 1, 14 2019 and ending June 30, 2020. Notwithstanding any other 15 16 provision of law, this appropriation shall not be transferred 17 or expended for any other purposes and any unexpended funds shall revert to the school foundation program account on July 18 19 1, 2020. The department's standard budget request for fiscal 20 years 2021-2022 shall include a similar appropriation 21 request.

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| 1 | (b) There is appropriated twenty-five thousand dollars |
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| 2 | (\$25,000.00) from the school foundation program account to |
| 3 | the department of education. This appropriation shall only be |
| 4 | expended for the purpose of funding the school safety and |
| 5 | security advisory committee as provided under W.S. |
| 6 | 21-2-202(a)(xxxviii). This appropriation shall be for the |
| 7 | period beginning July 1, 2019 and ending June 30, 2020. |
| 8 | Notwithstanding any other provision of law, this |
| 9 | appropriation shall not be transferred or expended for any |
| 10 | other purpose and any unexpended, unobligated funds remaining |
| 11 | from this appropriation shall revert as provided by law on |
| 12 | July 1, 2020. The department's standard budget request for |
| 13 | fiscal years 2021-2022 shall include a similar appropriation |
| 14 | request. |

| 16 | (c) By July 1, 2019, a school district may apply to the |
| 17 | department for financial assistance to provide safety and |
| 18 | security training to school district staff. Application shall |
| 19 | be on a form and in a manner prescribed by the department. |
