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- 13 (a) From the legislative stabilization reserve
- 14 account created in W.S. 9-4-219 there is appropriated
- 15 ninety million dollars (\$90,000,000.00) to the office of

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(b) Funds appropriated in paragraph (a)(i) of this 22 section are to be distributed to cities and towns in two 23

1 (2) equal distributions on August 15, 2016 and on August

2 15, 2017, subject to the following:

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4 (i) From these distributions each city or town with a population of thirty-five (35) or less shall first 5 receive ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00) and each city or 6 town with a population over thirty-five (35) shall first 7 8 receive twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000.00). From the remainder each city and town shall receive amounts in 9 10 accordance with a municipal supplemental funding formula as 11 provided in this paragraph with each city or town receiving 12 amounts in the proportion which the adjusted population of 13 the city or town bears to the adjusted population of all cities and towns in Wyoming. The municipal supplemental 14 15 funding formula shall be calculated by the office of state 16 lands and investments as follows:

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(A) Calculate the per capita distribution of sales and use tax revenues for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2014 and ending June 30, 2015 to each county, including distributions to each city and town within that county, under W.S. 39-15-111 and 39-16-111, but excluding the distribution exclusively to counties under W.S.

39-15-111(b)(iii) made from an amount equivalent to one

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2 percent (1%) of the tax collected under W.S. 39-15-104, and 3 excluding the distribution exclusively to counties under 4 W.S. 39-16-111(b)(iii) made from an amount equivalent to one percent (1%) of the tax collected under W.S. 39-16-104; 5 6 7 (B) Arrange the counties in ascending order 8 by the per capita distribution calculated; 9 (C) Following the arrangement of counties 10 11 in subparagraph (B) of this paragraph, list the population 12 of each city and town within the county; 13 14 (D) Apply the appropriate adjustment factor 15 determined in subdivisions (I) through (V) of this 16 subparagraph for a county to each city and town within that

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county:

the adjusted population for each city or town as calculated 1 2 under subparagraph (D) of this paragraph; 3 4 (F) As used in this paragraph: 5 6 (I) A county's "incorporated population" means the population of all cities and towns 7 8 within the county; 9 10 (II) "Percentile" means that portion 11 of the incorporated population as listed in the arrangement 12 of cities and towns under subparagraphs (B) and (C) of this 13 paragraph. 14 15 [COUNTY DIRECT DISTRIBUTION ALLOCATIONS] 16 17 (c) Funds appropriated in paragraph (a) (ii) of this section are to be distributed to counties in two (2) equal 18 19 distributions on August 15, 2016 and on August 15, 2017. 20 From these distributions each county shall receive the 21 following:

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2 shall be applied to the remaining counties. 3 4 (E) From the adjusted population of a city or town as calculated in subparagraphs (A) through (D) of 5 this paragraph, subtract the actual population of the city 6 or town to determine the resulting population adjustment. 7 8 Distribute the funding under this paragraph in the 9 proportion which the population adjustment of the city or 10 town bears to the population adjustments of all cities and 11 towns in Wyoming as calculated under subparagraph (D) of 12 this paragraph; 13 14 (F) As used in this paragraph: 15 16 (I) A county's "incorporated population" means the population of all cities and towns 17 18 within the county; 19 20 (II) "Percentile" means that portion 21 of the incorporated population as listed in the arrangement 22 of cities and towns under subparagraphs (B) and (C) of this 23 paragraph.

1 2 [COUNTY REVENUE CHALLENGED ALLOCATIONS] 3 4 (e) Funds appropriated in paragraph (a)(iv) of this section are to be distributed to eligible counties in two 5 (2) equal distributions on August 15, 2016 and on August 6 15, 2017. The office of state lands and investments shall 7 8 calculate the amounts to be distributed to eligible 9 counties as determined by this subsection as follows: 10 11 (i) Multiply each county's total assessed 12 valuation for tax year 2015 by twelve mills (.012). This 13 amount shall represent the county property tax available; 14 15 (ii) Calculate the sum of the following to 16 determine the county funding need: 17 18 (A) One million two hundred thousand 19 dollars (\$1,200,000.00); plus 20 21 (B) The product of the county population 22 from zero (0) to five thousand (5,000) multiplied by one 23 hundred sixty dollars (\$160.00); plus

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(C) The product of the county population 2

3 from five thousand one (5,001) to twenty-five thousand

4 (25,000) multiplied by one hundred thirty dollars

5 (\$130.00); plus

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7 (D) The product of the county population

8 above twenty-five thousand (25,000) multiplied by one

hundred dollars (\$100.00). 9

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11 (iii) Calculate the property tax shortfall for

12 each county by subtracting the property tax available as

13 determined by paragraph (i) of this subsection from the

14 county funding need as determined by paragraph (ii) of this

15 subsection. If the amount is greater than zero (0), the

16 county shall be eligible for distribution of money under

17 this subsection;

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19 (iv) The amount distributed under this

20 subsection to each eligible county shall be in the

21 proportion that the county's property tax shortfall bears

to the total property tax shortfall of all counties 22

eligible to receive a distribution under this subsection. 23

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1 2 (f) For purposes of this section, population is to be 3 determined by resort to the 2010 decennial federal census 4 as reported by the economic analysis division within the department of administration and information and as defined 5 in W.S. 8-1-102(a)(xv). 7 8 (g) It is the intent of the legislature that the 9 funds distributed under this section shall not be used for salary adjustments, additional personnel or increased 10 11 personnel benefits. 12 13 Section 2. This act is effective July 1, 2016. 14
