## A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to driver's licenses; modifying when a

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8 **Section 1**. W.S. 31-7-117(c) is amended to read:

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10 31-7-117. Restricted licenses.

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- 12 (c) The division may issue a restricted class "C" or
- 13 "M" license, or both such licenses, to a person who is between
- 14 the ages of fourteen (14) and sixteen (16) years upon receipt
- 15 of application, payment of the proper fees, an and a sworn

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1 affidavit of extreme inconvenience signed by the parent or 2 <u>legal</u> guardian having custody of the applicant and a finding 3 by the highway patrol that extreme inconvenience actually 4 exists demonstrating an extreme inconvenience that justifies 5 the issuance of the restricted license. The applicant shall successfully pass the examination required by W.S. 31-7-114. 6 A license under this subsection may issue only upon the 7 8 highway patrol confirming that an extreme inconvenience 9 actually exists. The licensee may drive a vehicle only between 10 the hours of 5:00 a.m. and  $\frac{8:00}{11:00}$  p.m., within a fifty (50) mile radius of his domicile and only at the direction of 11 12 his parent or guardian. If any person while licensed under 13 this subsection, receives a citation for a moving violation, the division, upon receipt of the notice of conviction, shall 14 15 suspend the license and any other license or permit evidencing 16 that person's privilege to operate a motor vehicle. For purposes of this subsection "extreme inconvenience" includes 17 shall include the following circumstances: 18

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20 (i) The person must drive to school or drive an
21 immediate family member who resides with the person to school
22 and the person's residence is more than five (5) miles from
23 the school;

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2	(ii) The person must regularly drive to attend or
3	must regularly drive an immediate family member who resides
4	with the person to attend a school activity, an organized
5	youth sports activity, a religious activity or other social
6	activity that is more than five (5) miles from the person's
7	residence;

LO	five (5) miles from the person's residence;

L3	in his parent's parent or legal guardian's business; or

L5	(iv)(v) Any other circumstance which the highway
