The district shall include plans for maintaining any district building 21 or facility which is under a lease agreement, specifying 22 lease revenues available to the district for maintenance of 23

1 facilities to the level required by statewide adequacy 2 standards. No expenditures shall be made from the separate 3 account unless the repair or replacement of the building or 4 facility systems for which the expenditure is to be made is clearly specified within the district's facility plan or 5 otherwise approved by the department. In a manner and form 6 required by commission rule and regulation, each district 7 8 shall annually report to the department on the expenditures 9 from the separate account during the applicable 10 reporting period, separating account expenditures on a 11 building-by-building basis. The department shall annually 12 review account expenditures and shall report expenditures to the commission and the select committee on school 13 facilities and state capital construction established under 14 15 W.S. 28-11-301. The department shall compile reported 16 building-by-building expenditure information for 17 district and the district facility plan and include this information in its annual report to the select committee 18 19 pursuant to W.S. 21-15-121. If any district expends funds 20 within the separate account for purposes not authorized by 21 this subsection or by rule and regulation of the commission, the payments for that district shall be reduced 22 by the amount of the unauthorized expenditure in the school 23

11	commission under subsection (f) of this section. The state

2	session, the president of the senate shall appoint five (5)
3	voting members of the senate and the speaker of the house
4	shall appoint five (5) voting members of the house to a
5	select committee on school facilities and state capital
6	construction. Appointments of voting members to the
7	committee by each presiding officer shall reflect as nearly
8	as possible the percentage of the elected membership of the
9	majority and minority parties of each house, provided that
10	not more than four (4) voting members appointed by each
11	presiding officer shall be from the same political party.
12	The president and speaker shall appoint one (1) member from
13	each of their respective houses to serve as co-chairmen.

18	order to facilitate the committee's functions generally or

10 Section 3. The construction management division of 11 the state construction department shall conduct a study on 12 potential routine maintenance programs for facilities of 13 the community colleges and of agencies, boards, commissions and other instrumentalities of the state, including the 14 15 University of Wyoming. The department shall examine how to develop routine maintenance programs designed to increase 16 17 efficiency in buildings operations. This shall include an examination of potential maintenance standards, maintenance 18 19 reporting software, staffing and training requirements and 20 condition assessments. The department shall report the conclusions of its study to the select committee on school 21 facilities and state capital construction by September 1, 22

2 Section 4. There is appropriated thirty thousand 3 dollars (\$30,000.00) from the general fund to the 4 legislative service office for purposes of providing salary, mileage and per diem to voting and nonvoting 5 members of the select committee on school facilities and 6 7 state capital construction. This appropriation shall be 8 for the period beginning with the effective date of this 9 act and ending June 30, 2022.

Section 5. This act is effective immediately upon completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming Constitution.
