## A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to school facility projects; providing
- 2 appropriations for school facility projects for the
- 3 biennial period July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2018;
- 4 providing definitions; establishing a task force as
- 5 specified; requiring reports; providing appropriations for
- 6 task force duties; and providing for effective dates.

8 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

10 Section 1.

11

- 12 (a) This section shall consist of funds appropriated
- 13 for the 2017-2018 biennial school capital construction
- 14 appropriation.

15

16 (b) As used in this section:

2 (i) "Capacity" means building needs as measured

3 by criteria established by the school facilities commission

4 pursuant to W.S. 21-15-117(e);

5

6 (ii) "Condition needs index priority" means the

7 condition needs index priority used by the school

8 facilities commission in developing the remediation

9 schedule for the 2017-2018 biennial budget recommendation

10 in accordance with W.S. 21-15-117(a).

11

12 (c) The amounts appropriated from the school capital

13 construction account under this section are for the

14 biennial period commencing July 1, 2016 and ending June 30,

15 2018. As authorized under W.S. 21-15-119(a)(iii), the

16 school facilities commission shall submit a supplemental

17 budget request for the period beginning July 1, 2017 and

18 ending June 30, 2018, for any emergency or unanticipated

19 need, or for any refinement or modification of a project

20 funded under this section, subject to any constraints and

21 other requirements imposed by the governor under W.S.

22 9-2-1013.

(d) An estimated schedule for deploying projects 1 2 funded by amounts appropriated under this section and 3 projects funded by previous appropriations, as adopted by 4 the school facilities commission and as contained within the 2017-2018 biennial budget submitted by the commission 5 under W.S. 21-15-119, shall be used by the school 6 facilities department in quiding expenditure of 7 8 appropriated funds. The estimated schedule developed under 9 this subsection shall be based upon information, processes,

events and expenditures and shall not be binding upon the

department or the commission.

(e) Amounts appropriated under this section and previous appropriations shall not be construed to be an entitlement or guaranteed amount and shall be expended by the commission and department to ensure adequate, efficient and cost effective school buildings and facilities in accordance with W.S. 21-15-114(a)(vii).

20 (f) In addition to accounting requirements imposed 21 under W.S. 28-11-301(c)(iv), the school facilities 22 department shall report at least once each year, the 23 deployment of amounts to fund projects under this section

and previous appropriations in accordance with the 1 2 deployment schedule, depicting project progression and, if 3 applicable, the rationale for deviation from the estimated schedule. The reports, as approved by the commission, 4 5 shall be submitted by the department to the select committee on school facilities, the joint appropriations 6 committee and the governor. 7 8 9 (g) The following amounts are appropriated from the 10 school capital construction account to the 11 facilities commission for the biennial period commencing 12 July 1, 2016 and ending June 30, 2018, for the specified 13 purposes: 14 15 (i) For design projects: 16

In addition to the appropriation under 4 (D) 5 subparagraph (A) of this paragraph denoted with two (2) asterisks, six million six hundred ninety-eight thousand 6 seven hundred ninety dollars (\$6,698,790.00) as contained 7 8 2014 Wyoming Session Laws, Chapter 82, Section in 1(e)(iii)(B) for the construction of an elementary school 9 10 in Sweetwater County School District No. 2, is hereby 11 reappropriated for the purpose of addressing the elementary 12 school capacity issues as identified by the district and 13 the proposed reconfiguration of grade levels as approved by the director of the school facilities department and the 14 15 state superintendent pursuant to W.S. 21-13-309(m)(vi). The 16 school facilities commission, through the department, shall 17 provide for a separate accounting of those projects 18 receiving funds under this paragraph, and separately report 19 expenditures of those amounts to the select committee on 20 school facilities and to the joint appropriations 21 committee. In the event the cost of construction of the remedy or remedies identified under this subparagraph 22 23 exceed the total amount identified, no funds shall be

expended as appropriated under this subparagraph and shall 1

12 (iv) For unanticipated costs associated with the

13 design and construction of projects funded under this

14 section, up to four hundred fifty-nine thousand one hundred

seventy-four dollars (\$459,174.00). The school facilities 15

16 commission, through the department, shall provide for a

separate accounting of 17 those projects receiving

18 supplemental appropriations under this paragraph,

19 separately report expenditures of those amounts to the

20 select committee on school facilities and to the joint

1 In addition to the allowable expenditures  $(\nabla)$ law of amounts appropriated for 2 pursuant to 3 maintenance expenses under 2016 SF 0001, Section 2, Section 027, a school district may expend up to ten percent (10%) 4 of the amount distributed under the major maintenance 5 program for the period commencing July 1, 2016 and ending 6 July 1, 2018 for safety and security building and facility 7 8 needs. No expenditure shall be made under this subsection 9 without the approval of the director of the school 10 facilities department; 11 12 (vi) In addition to allowable expenditures 13 pursuant to W.S. 21-3-110(a)(x) for leases executed by 14 school districts, for the purposes of charter school 15 leases, up to four hundred thousand dollars (\$400,000.00) 16 is appropriated to the school facilities department, to 17 distribute to each school district with a charter school in the district, approved and operating during the 2014-2015 18

10 (a) There is created a task force to study public

11 school capital construction and operations, including

12 stable and reliable funding options, consisting of the

13 following members:

14

15 (i) A number not to exceed three (3) members of

16 the Wyoming senate to be appointed by the president of the

17 senate;

18

19 (ii) A number not to exceed three (3) members of

20 the Wyoming house of representatives to be appointed by the

21 speaker of the house;

22

1 (iii) Eight (8) members appointed by the governor not later than March 31, 2016 as follows: 2 3 4 (A) One (1) representative from the 5 governor's office; 6 7 (B) One (1) representative from the 8 department of education; 9 10 (C) One (1) representative from the school 11 facilities department; 12 13 (D) One (1) representative from the 14 department of revenue; 15 16 (E) Three (3) representatives from the 17 Wyoming business community, agriculture or mineral industry; and 18 19 20 (F) One (1) member who is employed by a Wyoming school district as a certified teacher or an 21 22 administrator or is serving as a trustee on a Wyoming 23 school district board of trustees.

2 The appointing authority for any member who (b) 3 vacates membership shall fill the vacancy. Any member 4 appointed to the task force who is not a legislator, an employee of a governmental subdivision or a member of a 5 political subdivision, board or commission shall receive 6 per diem and mileage from amounts appropriated under 7 8 paragraph (h)(ii) of this section. Legislative members 9 shall receive compensation as provided by and from amounts 10 appropriated under paragraph (h)(i) of this section.

11

12 (c) The cochairmen of the taskforce shall be
13 appointed by the president of the senate and the speaker of
14 the house, respectively.

15

16 (d) The legislative service office shall staff the
17 task force. The legislative service office may retain
18 consultants as necessary to staff and advise the task force
19 in executing responsibilities prescribed by this section.
20 The management council may expend funds appropriated by the
21 legislature for approved contractual agreements between the
22 council and professional consultants on behalf of the task

1 force. State agencies shall provide information and

2 assistance to the task force as requested.

3

4 (e) The task force shall study and make

5 recommendations for the implementation, management,

6 operation and ongoing development of long term reliable

7 funding sources for the operation and construction

8 necessities of Wyoming K-12 public schools. In making

9 recommendations under this subsection, the task force

10 shall:

11

12 (i) Conduct an extensive review of the school

13 foundation program account and the operational expenses for

14 Wyoming K-12 public schools. Specifically, the task force

15 shall:

16

17 (A) Assess all expenditures of school

18 foundation program account funds, including those allocated

19 by the operation of the education resource block grant

20 model and expenditures related to special programs, such as

21 national board certified teachers, summer school and

22 extended day and instructional facilitators. Review shall

1 include all state agencies appropriated school foundation

2 program account funds;

3

4 (B) Examine all current revenue generating

5 mechanisms contributing to the school foundation program

6 account and income potential of funds within the account.

7 The review shall include analysis of the current investment

8 of funds in the account and analysis of alternatives that

9 may yield a higher rate of return. The impact of increasing

10 the existing revenue generating mechanisms shall be

11 evaluated. The cash flow of the account shall also be

12 analyzed; and

13

14 (C) Analyze Wyoming school district reserve

15 accounts to determine the spending and saving patterns and

16 evaluate statutes and policies relative to district reserve

17 accounts to determine appropriateness and to make any

18 necessary recommendations relative to the operation and

19 management of these accounts.

20

21 (ii) Conduct an extensive review of the school

22 capital construction account and K-12 public school capital

1 construction needs of Wyoming school districts.

2 Specifically, the task force shall:

3

4 (A) Evaluate the policies, rules and regulations and statutes governing assessment of building 5 condition and capacity. The effort shall include review of 6 appropriate and relative literature, research and best 7 8 practices for public building construction and maintenance, including the definition of immediate need and appropriate 9 deployment schedules for building remediation relative to 10 11 building condition assessment scores. The effort shall 12 include review of appropriate measures to identify capacity 13 and overcrowding issues and identify appropriate means to rank facilities based upon varying degrees of overcrowding 14 15 and capacity needs, along with the appropriate remedy based 16 upon the severity of the overcrowding or capacity issue; 17 and

18

19 Identification of (B) current revenue 20 sources available for construction of K-12 public school 21 educational facilities and analysis of potential 22 alternative revenue generating mechanisms that may be

1 available, including but not limited to expansion of lease-

2 to-purchase options and bonding.

3

4 (f) The task force shall exist until December 31,

5 2017.

6

7 (g) The task force shall appear before the joint

8 appropriations committee and the joint education committee

9 to make recommendations not later than October 15, 2016 and

10 again, not later than October 15, 2017. Based on the

11 findings of the task force, the appropriate committee may

12 consider development of legislation for introduction during

13 the 2017 general session or the 2018 budget session.

14

15 (h) For the period beginning upon the effective date

16 of this section and ending June 30, 2018, there is

17 appropriated from the general fund to the legislative

18 service office:

19

20 (i) Twenty-two thousand five hundred dollars

21 (\$22,500.00) for payment of salary, per diem and mileage

22 for legislative task force members;

1 (ii) Eleven thousand five hundred dollars 2 (\$11,500.00) for payment of nonlegislative task force 3 members for per diem and mileage expenses as provided under 4 this paragraph. Any member appointed or serving on the task force who is not a legislator, employee of a governmental 5 subdivision or a member of a political subdivision, board 6 or commission shall receive per diem and mileage in the 7 8 manner and amount provided to state employees under W.S.

11 Section 3. In addition to the amounts appropriated 12 under Section 1 of this act, eighty million dollars 13 (\$80,000,000.00) is appropriated from the legislative stabilization reserve account to the school facilities 14 15 commission. This appropriation shall be for the period 16 beginning July 1, 2017 and ending June 30, 2018. 17 appropriation shall only be available for expenditure as specifically authorized by the legislature. As required 18 under W.S. 21-15-119(a), and not later than September 1, 19 20 2016, the school facilities commission shall proposed expenditures of the amounts appropriated under 21 this section, along with a prioritized list of projects 22 23 pursuant to W.S. 21-15-117 and the results of the condition

1 needs assessment to be conducted over the 2016 interim by

2 the school facilities department, to the select committee

3 on school facilities and the joint appropriations

4 committee.

- 9 section, this act is effective July 1, 2016.

- 11 (b) Section 2 of this act is effective immediately
- 12 upon completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become
- 13 law as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming
- 14 Constitution.
