Early childhood education.

A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to early childhood education; providing that the department of education shall administer early 2 3 childhood education services; transferring specified early childhood education programs and functions; mandating the 4 5 governor make necessary transfers; requiring planning; 6 requiring reports; transferring statutory authority 7 regarding early childhood education programs; repealing an inapplicable provision; and providing for effective dates. 8

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10 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

12 Section 1.

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(a) On July 1, 2019, the functions within the 1 2 department of family services, department of health and 3 department of workforce services that administer early 4 childhood education programs are transferred to the 5 department of education. Early childhood education programs transferred to the department of education shall include 6 services for children with developmental 7 preschool 8 disabilities administered by the department of health, any 9 early childhood education grant programs administered by 10 the department of health, department of family services or 11 department of workforce services and any department of 12 health, department of family services or department of 13 workforce service programs that coordinate the work of 14 early childhood education programs in the state. All positions, personnel, appropriations, property, equipment 15 16 and authority in programs transferred to the department of 17 education by this act are under the control of the 18 department of education.

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20 (b) Notwithstanding any conflicting provision of law,
21 on July 1, 2019, the governor shall transfer those
22 positions, personnel, appropriations, property and
23 equipment within the department of family services,

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department of health and the department of workforce 1 2 services to the department of education as necessary to 3 implement the provisions of this act. The governor shall report to the legislature not later than July 31, 2019 4 regarding positions, personnel, appropriations, property 5 and equipment transferred under this act. The department of 6 education, department of health, department of family 7 8 services and department of workforce services shall work collaboratively to develop recommendations to the governor 9 10 regarding which positions, personnel, appropriations, 11 property and equipment shall be transferred to implement 12 this act. The department of education shall report to the joint education interim committee regarding its 13 14 recommendations no later than November 1, 2018.

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(c) Additionally, no later than November 1, 2018, the department of education, department of health, department of family services and department of workforce services shall report to the joint education interim committee on:

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7	(d) All funds received by the state from the federal
8	government pursuant to section 619(c) and reserved by the
9	state pursuant to section 619(f) of the federal Individuals
10	with Disabilities Education Act shall be distributed by the

12	extent not prohibited by federal law, funds distributed
13	under this subsection shall be expended in a manner jointly
