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7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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- 9 Section 1. W.S. 21-2-301 as amended by 2013 Wyoming
- 10 Session Laws, Chapter 1, is amended to read:

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- 12 21-2-301. Election and appointment; election
- 13 districts established; meetings; chairman.

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- 15 (a) There is created a state board of education
- 16 composed of thirteen (13) members, eleven (11) voting

1 members, ten (10) of whom shall be voting appointed members with at least elected as provided by subsection (b) of this 2 3 section and one (1) member appointed from each appointment 4 district pursuant to W.S. 9 1 218. Appointments from each appointment district shall be rotated among the several 5 counties comprising the district by the governor in 6 accordance with this subsection. The remaining members of 7 the board shall be The state superintendent of public 8 9 instruction and the director of the state department of 10 education. The state superintendent and the director shall 11 be ex-officio members and shall not have the right to vote. One (1) The appointed member shall be appointed represent 12 the public at large, and shall be a certified classroom 13 teacher at the time of appointment. One (1) appointed 14 member shall also be appointed at large and shall be a 15 certified school administrator at the time of appointment. 16 17 Two (2) appointed members shall be appointed at large and shall be representative of private business or industry in 18 Wyoming. On and after March 1, 2013 and upon expiration of 19 20 their respective terms, the appointments of the two (2) 21 members previously designated to be representative of 22 business or industry shall be at large, one (1) a representative of Wyoming private business or industry and 23 24 one (1) a member of a school district board of trustees at

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the time of appointment. The first appointment to the term 1 of such member which expires on or after March 1, 2013, 2 shall be a school district board member at the time of 3 appointment. The remaining seven (7) appointed members of 4 5 the board shall be appointed from among the lay citizens of the state who are electors of the state, known for their 6 public spirit, business or professional ability and 7 interest in education. Not more than six (6) appointed 8 9 members of the board shall be from one (1) political party. 10 Members shall be appointed for six (6) year terms, except 11 those who may be appointed to fill unexpired terms. Members shall be appointed by the governor with be an elector of 12 13 the state, be known for his professional ability and 14 interest in education, be appointed for a six (6) year term and be subject to the approval of the senate. Vacancies 15 Any vacancy in the appointed member's seat shall be filled 16 17 by the governor without senate approval until the next session of the legislature. No The member is not eligible 18 19 to for reappointment, except any member unless appointed to fill an unexpired term of less than six (6) years, in which 20 21 case he may be reappointed for one (1) additional six (6) 22 year term. The appointed members of the board member may be removed by the governor as provided in W.S. 9-1-202. 23

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Any vacancy in any other elective office in the 4 5 state except representative in congress or the board of trustees of a school or community college district, shall 6 be filled by the governing body, or as otherwise provided 7 in this section, by appointment of a temporary successor. 8 9 The person appointed shall serve until a successor for the remainder of the unexpired term is elected at the next 10 11 general election and takes office on the first Monday of the following January. 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The county clerk receiving a nomination 10 (a) application shall determine whether the person seeking 11 nomination is a qualified candidate. If the application is 12 13 sufficient in all respects, the name of the person nominated shall appear on the official ballot for the 14 election specified in the application. In the case of a 15 school, state board of education election district or 16 17 community college district which crosses county boundaries, the clerk of the county in which a valid application is 18 filed shall certify the name of the person nominated to the 19 clerk of the other county or counties involved for 20 21 placement on the official ballot for the election specified

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in the application.

21 appointed to a term of office in accordance with W.S.

23 act and prior to the 2016 general election, shall be

24 appointed to a term of office that expires January 4, 2017.

The appointed member whose term does not expire on January 1 4, 2017 pursuant to this subsection shall continue to serve 2 on the state board for the remainder of the term of his 3 initial appointment and if otherwise qualified, shall fill 4 5 the membership of the appointed member under the state board as reconstituted under W.S. 21-2-301, as amended by 6 section 1 or 2 of this act, as applicable. Nothing in this 7 act shall prevent a state board member appointed to a term 8 9 of office that expires on January 4, 2017 under this

10 section, from seeking election to the state board pursuant

The service of the members elected at the 2016 general election shall begin on January 5, 2017. 18 Notwithstanding W.S. 21-2-301(b), as amended by section 1 19 of this act, the initial term of the elected state board 20 21 members from board of education election districts 1, 3, 5,

7 and 9 shall be for a term of two (2) years.

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9 (c) If a final order by the district court of Laramie County, Wyoming, is issued implementing without change the 10 final ruling of the Wyoming Supreme Court issued January 11 28, 2014, in the case of Kerry and Clara Powers, on behalf 12 13 of themselves and the citizens of Wyoming, and Cindy Hill, 14 on behalf of herself and as the Superintendent of Public Instruction v. State of Wyoming and Matthew H. Mead, 15 Governor, in his official capacity [Docket No. S-13-0052], 16 17 then upon expiration of time for appeal of that order, or if appealed, upon issuance of a final order or mandate of 18 the Wyoming Supreme Court confirming the district court 19 20 final order, the Governor shall certify the entry of the 21 district court final order.
