Wyoming Pharmacy Act amendments.

A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to professions and occupations; amending membership and duties of the state board of pharmacy; 2 amending the rate of compensation received by board members 3 4 as specified; amending requirements of the Wyoming Pharmacy Act as specified; providing for electronic pharmacist 5 examinations; allowing for electronic memorandum for 6 prescription records; repealing archaic provisions related 7 to the sale of poison by pharmacists; and providing for an 8 9 effective date.

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11 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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13 Section 1. W.S. 33-24-102(a), 33-24-103(d), 14 33-24-108(b), 33-24-117, 33-24-118, 33-24-120, 33-24-135(d) 15 and 33-24-136(a) and (b) are amended to read:

1 33-24-102. State board of pharmacy; generally. 2 3 There is created a state board of pharmacy whose (a) 4 duty is to carry out the purposes and to enforce the provisions of this act. The board shall consist of seven 5 (7) nine (9) voting members consisting of four (4) five (5) 6 pharmacists, one (1) physician, one (1) dentist or 7 8 veterinarian, and one (1) member of the public and one (1) 9 ex officio pharmacy technician, who shall be appointed by 10 the governor, by and with the advice and consent of the senate. Members of the now existing board of pharmacy shall 11 12 continue in office as voting members as if regularly 13 appointed under this act. Their terms shall expire 14 accordance with their original appointments and be filled 15 in accordance with the provisions of W.S. 28-12-101. The ex 16 officio member shall have no vote and shall have no part of 17 licensing procedures or license suspension or revocation 18 actions.

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3 The applicant shall pass a written and practical an 4 examination, which has been adopted by the board, in a manner satisfactory to a reasonable board. The written 5 examination shall be, so far as the board shall deem 6 practicable, on such subjects as are prescribed in the 7 8 curriculum and taught in the accredited colleges and universities which offer courses of study leading to the 9 10 degree above described and required, on the ethical and practical aspects of the practice of pharmacy which will 11 12 confront a successful applicant in the practice of the 13 profession in Wyoming, and on the laws and rules relating 14 thereto. The practical examination shall be held at a place designated by the board offered in the manner prescribed by 15 16 it the board.

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18 33-24-118. Registration of applicant; issuance of 19 license; contents of license or certificate of 20 registration.

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22 Upon an applicant passing the written and practical 23 examinations examination the board shall cause his name and

residence to be registered in a book-record kept by it for 1 that purpose; and if the application is complete and there 2 3 are no known grounds for denial of the license requested, 4 the board shall issue to the applicant a license as evidence of his eligibility to practice pharmacy. The 5 license, or certificate of registration shall contain, 6 along with the other advisory information, the name of the 7 8 person to whom issued, the date of issuance, and a special registration number designed by the board for exclusive 9 10 identification of the registrant. 11 12 33-24-120. Records as prima facie evidence. 13 14 The board shall keep a record book in which shall be 15 recorded the names and addresses and pertinent information 16 of all applicants and such other matters as shall afford a full record of its activities; the records or transcripts 17 18 therefrom, duly certified by the secretary of the board, 19 with the seal of the board attached, shall be prima facie 20 evidence before all the courts of this state of the entries 21 therein contained.

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23 **33-24-135**. Internship.

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2 (d) Each prospective intern shall be licensed by the board upon payment of a fee and shall register in writing 3 4 immediately upon beginning any period of service by 5 application giving the intern's name and address., address of the pharmacy at which service is undertaken and the 6 7 name, address and registration number of each preceptor at 8 that place. Upon terminating each period of service, the 9 intern shall immediately notify the board in writing. The 10 first notice of undertaking internship shall include a complete statement of the intern's qualifications therefor, 11 12 attested to under oath by the intern. Forms therefor will 13 be provided by the board. Under its regulations the board 14 may provide for consideration and acceptance of internship served in other jurisdictions. 15

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33-24-136. Filing memorandum of prescription; labels
 generally; prescription defined; counseling and patient
 profiles.

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(a) Every person who prepares, compounds, processes,
packages or repackages, dispenses, fills or sells or offers
for sale, at retail or in connection with operation of a

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health care facility, any prescription, shall place the 1 2 written memorandum or electronic record of the prescription 3 in a separate file marked and kept for that purpose, and 4 shall affix a label to the container in which the prescribed substance is dispensed bearing the name and 5 address of the pharmacy and initials of the dispensing 6 pharmacist, or of the preceptor if the dispenser is an 7 8 intern, the date on which the prescription is filed in the 9 pharmacy's files, the name of the person who prescribed the 10 substance, the name of the patient or customer for whom the prescription was made and directions for use by the patient 11 12 as directed on the prescription by the prescriber.

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14 (b) "Prescription" means an order for medication by a 15 person licensed and authorized by the state board of 16 medicine, the state board of dental examiners, the state board of nursing, the state board of registration in 17 18 podiatry, the state board of examiners in optometry or the 19 state board of veterinary medicine which is dispensed to or 20 for an ultimate user, but does not include an order for 21 medication which is dispensed for immediate administration 22 to the ultimate user. Each prescription memorandum record 23 shall be maintained and open-available for inspection by

1 agents of the board for a period of two (2) years from the 2 date it is filed. 3 4 Section 2. W.S. 33-24-137 and 33-24-138 are repealed. 5 6 Section 3. This act is effective July 1, 2015. 7 8 (END)
