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1	(a) The professional teaching standards board shall
2	by rule department of education may enter into an agreement
3	with a nonprofit entity to establish a program under which
4	school districts shall reimburse no more than fifty (50)
5	the department or the nonprofit entity will administer a
6	program to assist educators in earning a national teaching
7	certification. The agreement shall provide for biennial
8	reporting requirements by the nonprofit entity to the
9	department. The program may provide professional
10	development and mentoring specific to national
11	certification, along with other activities related to
12	national certification. Additionally, the program may make
13	payments directly to an organization that provides national
14	teacher certifications on behalf of teachers and certified
15	or licensed service providers employed by Wyoming school
16	districts for up to fifty percent (50%) of the actual cost
17	of receiving national certification <u>.</u> τ <u>Certification fee</u>
18	payments by the program shall not to exceed fifty percent
19	(50%) of the applicable national certification fee
20	established by the national board for professional teaching
21	standards. for the applicable year certification was
22	received, provided Payments by the program shall only be
23	<pre>made if:</pre>

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1 2 (i) The teacher or service provider has 3 completed at least three (3) years of teaching; in the 4 state of Wyoming; 5 (ii) The teacher or service provider, as 6 applicable, was successful in receiving his national 7 8 certification timely pays the teacher's or service provider's portion of the certification fees and timely 9 10 completes progress toward certification as required by the 11 program; and 12 13 (iii) The teacher or service provider agrees to 14 mentor at least one (1) other teacher employed in the state of Wyoming through the national certification process 15 16 reimburse the program for any certification fee payments 17 made by the program on behalf of the teacher or service provider in the event the teacher or service provider fails 18 19 to formally withdraw from the process or to submit an entry 20 that can be scored, as determined by the program. 21 22 (c) A school district The legislature may apply for

23 an innovative program grant under W.S. 21-22-106(a)(iii) to

1	recover amounts reimbursed to teachers and service
2	providers under subsection (b) of this section appropriate
3	funds to implement subsection (a) of this section so long
4	as the nonprofit entity equally matches appropriated state
5	funds and makes those matching funds available for purposes
6	of implementing subsection (a) of this section. The program
7	shall ensure state funds and funds provided to the program
8	by the nonprofit entity shall not be comingled and shall be
9	accounted for separately.

11	(f) In addition to reimbursement of the cost of
12	national board certification the program established under
13	subsection $\frac{(b)}{(a)}$ of this section, and to promote
14	employment of national board certified teachers by school
15	districts, each district employing a national board
16	certified teacher shall be reimbursed for payments to these
17	teachers subject to the following:
