The 10 listing shall specifically identify and prioritize those buildings in need of building construction or renovation and 11 12 the estimated costs of required construction or renovation 13 during the current fiscal year and during the succeeding four 14 (4) fiscal years. The listing shall be provided to the select committee on school facilities and state capital construction 15 16 on or before July 1 of each year. 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1 Amounts distributed under subsection (b) of this (e) 2 section shall be deposited by the recipient district into a 3 separate account, the balance of which may accumulate from 4 year-to-year. Except as specified under subsection (f) of 5 this section, expenditures from the separate account, including any interest earnings on the account, shall be 6 restricted to expenses incurred for major building and 7 8 facility repair and replacement as defined in subsection (a) 9 of this section and shall be in accordance with the district's 10 facility plan under W.S. 21-15-116. 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1 specifying lease revenues available to the district for 2 maintenance of facilities to the level required by statewide 3 adequacy standards. No expenditures shall be made from the 4 separate account unless the repair or replacement of the 5 building or facility systems for which the expenditure is to be made is clearly specified within the district's facility 6 plan or otherwise approved by the department. In a manner and 7 8 form required by commission rule and regulation, each 9 district shall annually report to the department on the 10 expenditures made from the separate account during the 11 applicable reporting period, separating account expenditures 12 on a building-by-building basis. The department shall 13 annually review account expenditures and shall report expenditures to the commission and the select committee on 14 school facilities and state capital construction established 15 16 under W.S. 28-11-301. The department shall compile reported 17 building-by-building expenditure information for each district and the district facility plan and include this 18 19 information in its annual report to the select committee 20 pursuant to W.S. 21-15-121. If any district expends funds 21 within the separate account for purposes not authorized by this subsection or by rule and regulation of the commission, 22 23 the payments for that district shall be reduced by the amount

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1 of the unauthorized expenditure in the school year following 2 the year in which the expenditure was discovered or the school 3 year in which notification was provided by the department, 4 whichever first occurs. 5 б 21-15-114. School facilities commission powers and 7 duties. 8 (a) The school facilities commission shall: 9 10 11 (xv) With prior consultation with the select 12 committee on school facilities and state capital 13 construction, promulgate necessary rules and regulations to 14 administer and implement this act. 15 16 21-15-115. Statewide standards for school building and 17 facility adequacy; adequacy assessment. 18 19 (c) The commission shall not less than once every four 20 (4) years, review and evaluate the building and facility 21 adequacy standards established under subsection (a) of this section. Review and evaluation of the standards shall include 22 the identification of local enhancements to buildings and 23

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1 facilities during this review and evaluation period, and 2 based upon criteria and procedures developed by the 3 commission, a determination as to whether and how any local 4 enhancements should be incorporated into the statewide standards. The review and evaluation under this subsection 5 shall extend to components of the annual evaluation of school 6 buildings, the facility remediation schedule and the needs 7 prioritization process established by the commission under 8 9 W.S. 21-15-117. Findings and recommendations pursuant to this 10 subsection shall be reported to the select committee on school 11 facilities and state capital construction before the next 12 convening date of the legislative session immediately 13 following completion of the review and evaluation, and shall 14 specifically address any need to expand the needs assessment, to conduct a reassessment of building and facility adequacy 15 16 or to modify the needs prioritization process.

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(c) In determining the most cost effective method inmeeting capital construction needs in order to deliver

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1	quality educational services, the commission in consultation

3	capital construction, may recommend consolidating educational
4	facilities within, between or among school districts. The
5	legislature shall approve any consolidation of educational
6	facilities between two (2) or more school districts.

11	(a) Notwithstanding W.S. 9-2-1012, the commission shall
12	annually, not later than September 1, develop and submit a
13	recommended budget for projects and school capital

The report shall be incorporated 12 into the proposed budget submitted to the select committee 13 under W.S. 21-15-119 and shall include:

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(a) As part of its administrative functions, the community college commission shall identify community college building needs and develop a prioritized list of community college capital construction projects. The prioritized community college capital construction projects shall be reported by the commission to the state construction

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1 department in accordance with subsection (g) of this section. 2 Following review, analysis and study, the state construction 3 department shall forward recommendations for community 4 college capital construction projects to the state building 5 commission and to the select committee on school facilities and state capital construction. The state construction 6 department shall also submit major maintenance budget 7 8 requests for college buildings to the legislature in 9 accordance with this section. Major maintenance budget 10 requests shall be based upon the square footage submitted by 11 the commission under subsection (f) of this section and upon 12 a formula adopted by the state building commission, and upon 13 forms and in a format specified by the budget division of the department of administration and information. 14 College 15 building maintenance budget requests submitted by the state construction department to the legislature and capital 16 17 construction budget requests forwarded by the state building commission to the legislature shall include only necessary 18 19 building square footage:

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(g) Upon prioritizing community college construction needs under subsection (d) of this section, the commission shall not later than June 1 of each year, report the

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1 prioritized list to the state construction department. In 2 accordance with W.S. 9-5-108(a)(ii), the state construction 3 department shall review, analyze and study construction needs 4 prioritized under subsection (d) of this section and conduct 5 necessary value engineering analysis, schematic design review, safety and security assessments and other analysis 6 and review prior to submission of recommendations to the state 7 8 building commission. The department's recommendations shall 9 be submitted to the select committee on school facilities and 10 state capital construction at the same time. In consultation with the select committee, the state building commission 11 12 shall consider and incorporate prioritized construction needs 13 recommendations into legislation requesting necessary 14 funding, developed under W.S. 9-5-108(a)(ii)(J), for submission to the legislature for review, authorization and 15 16 approval. The legislation shall also include a separate 17 for contingency costs associated appropriation with 18 recommended construction projects and а separate 19 for administrative costs of the appropriation state 20 construction department for management of the recommended 21 construction projects as required by subsection (j) of this 22 section. The state construction department shall submit a 23 separate budget request for project design and planning funds

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1 to be available to assist community colleges with costs 2 incurred in developing and providing necessary plans, designs 3 and other information to the state construction department 4 for purposes of this subsection. This request shall also 5 include funds for major maintenance for the square footage reported by the commission under subsection (f) of this 6 section. 3	identified needs through development of projects as
4	undertaken by the state building commission and state
5	construction department pursuant to W.S. 9-5-107 and 9-5-108;

7	(C) The development, prioritization and
8	recommendations for funding community college facility needs
9	by the state construction department and the state building
10	commission pursuant to W.S. 21-18-225;
11	
12	(D) The development, administration and
13	enforcement of maintenance programs and maintenance standards
14	of the state construction department for state facilities,
15	school facilities commission for school facilities, the
16	community college commission for community college facilities
17	and any other state agency for state facilities managed
18	independently of the state building commission;
19	
20	(E) The construction plans and activities of
21	any other state agency for state facilities managed
22	independently of the state building commission.

1	(iv) Develop knowledge and expertise among its
2	members regarding issues pertaining to state building
3	commission, school facilities and commission and state
4	construction department programs and procedures to maintain
5	statewide facility adequacy for schools and to address state
6	facility and community college facility needs;
7	
8	(vi) Consult with the state building commission
9	regarding budget recommendations and proposed legislation for
10	state facility needs as provided in W.S. 9-5-108 and for
11	community college facility needs as provided in W.S.
12	<u>21-18-225;</u>
13	
14	(vi)(vii) Review <u>school facilities</u> commission <u>and</u>
15	state building commission proposals for rules and regulations
16	and provide recommendations to the pertinent commission
17	concerning the proposed regulations.

19	(c) The state construction department shall:

21	(i) Provide the select committee with notice of
22	all school facilities commission and state building
23	<pre>commission meetings;</pre>

1 2 (ii) Provide the select committee with school 3 facilities commission and department reports and studies 4 pertaining to school building and facility maintenance and 5 remediation projects, state facility projects and community college facility projects; 6 7 8 (iii) Provide information to the select committee 9 upon request to assist the select committee in monitoring 10 progress under paragraph (b)(iii) of this section and in 11 reviewing budget recommendations under paragraph paragraphs 12 (b)(v) and (vi) of this section; 13 14 (d) The select committee may review the budgets: 15 (i) Prepared by the school facilities commission 16 17 for each separate project contained within the total budget request submitted under W.S. 21-15-119 and may request 18 19 additional documentation associated with the development of 20 the project for inclusion within the budget request *i*. 21 (ii) Prepared by the state building commission and 22 the state construction department for state facility projects 23

2	facility projects under W.S. 21-18-225;
