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2 Based upon ADM computations and identified (V) 3 school configurations within each district pursuant to paragraph (iv) of this subsection, compute the foundation 4 5 program amount for each district as prescribed by the education resource block grant model adopted by the Wyoming 6 legislature as defined under W.S. 21-13-101(a)(xiv), as 7 contained within the spreadsheets and accompanying reports 8 9 referenced under W.S. 21-13-101(a)(xvii), on file with the 10 secretary of state and maintained by the superintendent pursuant to W.S. 21-2-202(e).
