16	ARTICLE 1

CAREER AND TECHNICAL TRAINING GRANTS 1 2 27-15-101. Definitions. 3 4 5 (a) As used in this article: 6 (i) "Approved career and technical training 7 provider" means: 8 9 10 (A) Wyoming community colleges, the University of Wyoming, boards of cooperative educational 11 services, private post secondary educational institutions 12 and private schools or organizations providing career and 13 technical training in Wyoming which are licensed or 14 registered under W.S. 21-2-401 through 21-2-407; 15 16 (B) Training facilities and 17 entities registered with the office 18 approved by and of apprenticeship, United States department of labor. 19 20 21 (ii) "Career and technical training" means 22 training through an approved training career and technical training provider that develops or enhances the skills of 23 an individual for specific careers that are based on the 24

workforce needs of the state as identified by the 1 2 department; 3 4 (iii) "Career readiness score" means qualifying 5 scores on a multilevel career readiness preinstructional assessment tool, preapproved by the department, to qualify 6 an individual's level of proficiency in the following 7 measurable work-ready skills: 8 9 Reading for information; 10 (A) 11 12 (B) Applied mathematics; 13 (C) Locating information; 14 15 (D) Any additional skills necessary to meet 16 business and industry skill demand. 17 18 19 (iv) "Department" means the department of 20 workforce services. 21 27-15-102. Career and technical training grants 22 established. 23 24

(a) The department shall, by rule and regulation, 1 establish and administer a program to provide training 2 grants for the training of persons participating in a 3 4 career and technical training program.

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The purpose of the career and technical training 6 (b) grant program is to provide career and technical training 7 grants to develop or enhance the skills of Wyoming's 8 9 workforce based on current, projected or emerging labor 10 shortages in the Wyoming economy.

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(c) The department is authorized to promulgate rules 12 13 and regulations for the purpose of implementing this article. All rules and regulations shall be promulgated in 14 consultation with training providers and employers. 15 No grants shall be awarded under this article until adoption 16 17 of final rules pursuant to this subsection.

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donations 19 (d) The department may receive from 20 foundations or other private sources. Any such funds 21 received shall be deposited into a separate account and are 22 continuously appropriated to the department, which may distribute those funds in accordance with the provisions of 23 this article. 24

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1 2 (e) The following shall not be reimbursed under this article: 3 4 5 (i) Services eligible to be paid for by another public or private program; 6 7 (ii) Services historically paid for by another 8 9 program or from another source; 10 (iii) Continuing education training 11 in an applicant's current trade. 12 13 27-15-103. Career and technical training grants; 14 15 eligibility. 16 17 (a) Under the career and technical training grant program, subject to availability of funds as determined by 18 the legislature, the state shall provide a grant pursuant 19 20 to this article to any trainee who has been accepted by and 21 enrolls in an approved training program, and who meets the following qualifications: 22 23

1 (i) The trainee has demonstrated twelve (12)2 Wyoming residence defined months as in W.S. 3 22-1-102(a)(xxx); 4 5 (ii) The trainee has: 6 (A) Graduated from high school or has 7 obtained a general equivalency diploma in accordance with 8 9 rules adopted by the department of education pursuant to 10 W.S. 21-16-1308(b)(iv); and 11 12 (B) the baseline Has earned career 13 readiness score as preapproved by the department under this 14 article for the type of training to be undertaken. However, the department may provide by rule and regulation 15 for an application and approval process using alternative 16 17 criteria that are the functional equivalent of the career readiness score. 18 19 20 No trainee shall be eligible for a grant under (b) 21 this article for more than the equivalent of two (2) years. 22 No trainee shall be eligible for a grant under this article

23 for any period commencing after four (4) calendar years
24 following the trainee's initial eligibility. For purposes

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1 of this subsection, a trainee's initial eligibility shall 2 be deemed to commence on the program start date identified 3 on the application or the date the program actually begins, 4 whichever is earlier. The department shall by rule and 5 regulation establish exceptions to this subsection for military service, religious service and other good cause 6 7 shown. 8 9 (c) A trainee is not eligible for a grant under this article if he: 10 11 12 (i) United States citizen or Is not а а 13 permanent resident alien who meets the definition of an eligible noncitizen under federal Title IV requirements or 14 requirements of a subsequent similar federal enactment; 15 16 17 (ii) Has not complied with United States selective service system requirements for registration, if 18 the requirements are applicable to the trainee; 19 20 21 (iii) Is in default on a federal Title IV education loan. Nothing in this paragraph prohibits a 22 trainee who is otherwise eligible for a grant under this 23 article and has fully repaid a defaulted loan or is no 24

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longer in default, from receiving a grant after the default
 is cured;

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4 (iv) Owes a refund under a federal Title IV 5 trainee financial aid program or a subsequently enacted similar federal student financial aid program, or a student 6 financial aid program administered through the state. 7 Nothing in this paragraph prohibits a trainee who is 8 9 otherwise eligible for a grant under this article and has fully paid the refund owed, from receiving a grant after 10 paying the refund owed; 11

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13 (v) Is incarcerated;

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15 (vi) Is not eligible to hold a license or is 16 otherwise disqualified to be employed in the occupation for 17 which the training is sought;

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(vii) Has been the recipient of more than two
(2) semesters of any Hathaway scholarship under W.S.
21 21-16-1301 through 21-16-1310 during the five (5) year
period before the date of application; or

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(viii) Does not otherwise qualify under this
 article for a grant.

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4 (d) The department shall pay the cost of an eligible
5 applicant's initial career readiness tests. Any retesting
6 to improve an applicant's score shall be at the applicant's
7 expense.

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9 27-15-104. Career and technical training grants; 10 agreement; remedies upon breach; technical assistance.

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(a) Grant payments shall be made directly to 12 an 13 approved career and technical training provider. Grantees shall enter into a contract with the department providing 14 that the trainee shall work in Wyoming in the trade for 15 which the trainee receives training for the period provided 16 17 in the department's rules. Commitment duration shall be based on the value of the training opportunity, shall be 18 commensurate with the magnitude of the grant and shall not 19 20 be less than the length of the grantee's training program 21 or two (2) years, whichever is less. For purposes of this 22 subsection, "work in Wyoming" means that the grantee is employed for at least eighty percent (80%) of the grantee's 23

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1 paid work hours in the trade for which the grant was 2 awarded.

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(b) If a trainee breaches the agreement required by 4 5 subsection (a) of this section, the trainee shall repay that portion of all funds for the corresponding contract 6 period provided on behalf of the trainee under 7 the agreement, together with costs of collection and attorney 8 9 fees. The department shall by rule and regulation 10 establish exceptions to this subsection for military 11 service, religious service and other good cause shown.

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(c) The department shall provide technical assistance
to prospective trainees in the application and reporting
requirements established by department rules.

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5 Section 2.

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is appropriated five hundred thousand 7 (a) There (\$500,000.00) from the general fund to the 8 dollars 9 department of workforce services. This appropriation shall 10 be for the period beginning with the effective date of this 11 act and ending June 30, 2012. This appropriation shall only be expended for the purpose of the career and 12 13 technical training grants established under W.S. 27-15-102 14 created by this act. Grants shall not exceed one thousand six hundred dollars (\$1,600.00) per year per eligible 15 grantee. Upon the award of a career and technical training 16 17 grant, the department shall set aside and encumber the full amount and cost of any grant awarded for the entire period 18 of the grant. The department shall establish by rule and 19 regulation when an awarded grant shall terminate. 20 Upon 21 termination of a grant, any unexpended portion of the grant 22 shall be available to fund additional grants as provided under W.S. 27-15-102 created by this act. Notwithstanding 23 24 any other provision of law, this appropriation shall not be

transferred or expended for any other purpose and any 1 2 unobligated funds unexpended, remaining from this 3 appropriation shall revert as provided by law on June 30, 4 2012. Any obligated funds shall revert after June 30, 2012 5 upon the termination of the grant which encumbered those funds. 6

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(b) There is appropriated fifty thousand dollars 8 9 (\$50,000.00) from the general fund to the department of workforce services. This appropriation shall be for the 10 period beginning with the effective date of this act and 11 ending June 30, 2012. This appropriation shall only be 12 13 expended for the purpose of administering the career and technical assistance grant program established by this act, 14 including initial career readiness testing and promotional 15 and technical assistance activities for the program. 16 any other provision of 17 Notwithstanding law, this appropriation shall not be transferred or expended for any 18 any unexpended, unobligated funds 19 other purpose and remaining from this appropriation shall revert as provided 20 21 by law on June 30, 2012.
