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1	(b) All rules, regulations and proceedings of the								
2	division shall be promulgated and conducted in compliance								
3	with the Wyoming Administrative Procedure Act. The rules								
4	and regulations prescribed and adopted may not be								
5	implemented until submitted to the Wyoming legislature for								
6	review and approval under procedures as the legislature may								
7	prescribe.								
8									
9	(d) The division shall prescribe reasonable rules and								
10	regulations which provide for the conditional licensure of								
11	applicants who have satisfied all licensing requirements								
12	adopted under this act except any requirements related to								
13	criminal history screenings and fingerprinting. A								
14	conditional license shall not be issued without a sworn								
15	statement from an applicant, on a form prepared by the								
16	division, establishing all facts and circumstances which,								
17	if true, would fully qualify the applicant for licensure.								
18	The division may refuse to issue a conditional license to								
19	any applicant whose application or sworn statement reveals								
20	the existence of any fact upon which licensure could be								
21	denied. A conditional license shall be revoked or not								
22	issued at any time the division gains reasonable knowledge								

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1	of	any	fact	that	would	disqualify	the	applicant	from		
2	licensure.
