## A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to oil and gas; modifying surety provisions
- 2 for seismic activities; modifying rule requirements;
- 3 conforming provisions; and providing for an effective date.

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5 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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- 7 **Section 1.** W.S. 30-5-104(d)(v)(A) and 30-5-404(b) and
- 8 (c) are amended to read:

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- 30-5-104. Oil and gas conservation commission; powers
- 11 and duties; investigations; rules and regulations.

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13 (d) The commission has authority:

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15 (v) To adopt rules and regulations to:

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2	(A) Regulate the plugging, sealing of
3	capping of seismic shot holes, and to require, and fix the
4	amount of, a surety bond or other guaranty to ensure
5	compliance with regulations governing all geophysical
6	operations and to ensure compliance with W.S. 30-5-401
7	through 30-5-410. When oil and gas operations as defined in
8	W.S. 30-5-401(a)(iv) involve seismic activities, the rules
9	shall require a surety or other guaranty which is
LO	sufficient to protect the interests of the surface owners
L1	affected by the activities and which, in all events, shall
L2	be in an amount of not less than five thousand dollars
L3	(\$5,000.00) for the first one thousand (1,000) acres or
L4	portion thereof per surface owner for which access is
L5	sought for seismic activities and not less than one
L6	thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) for each additional one
L 7	thousand (1,000) acres or portion thereof per surface owner
L8	for which access is sought for seismic activities;

30-5-404. Surety bond guaranty; approval; 20 or objections; release of surety bond or guaranty. 21

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(b) The surety bond or other guaranty shall be in an 23 amount of not less than two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00) 24

per well site on the land unless the operations involve 1 2 seismic activities. If the operations involve seismic 3 activities, the surety bond shall be as provided in W.S. 4 30-5-104(d)(v)(A) and shall only be accepted from and 5 posted by the oil and gas operator who has a valid lease or posted by a person who is an agent of, under contract with, 6 7 or is the assignee of the lessee of a valid lease. No person shall be authorized to conduct operations involving 8 9 seismic activities who is not an operator with a valid lease or a person who is an agent of, under contract with, 10 11 or the assignee of the lessee of a valid lease. At the request of the oil and gas operator, after attempted 12 consultation with the surface owner the commission may 13 establish a blanket bond or other quaranty in an amount 14 covering oil and gas operations on the surface owner's land 15 as identified by an oil and gas operator in the written 16 Neither 17 notice required under W.S. 30-5-402(e). minimum amount of the per well site bond or other quaranty 18 specified or referenced in this subsection nor a blanket 19 bond or other guaranty established by the commission is 20 21 intended to establish any amount for reasonable and 22 foreseeable damages.

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1 Within seven (7) days following receipt of a per 2 well site surety bond or other quaranty or the establishment of a blanket bond or other guaranty specified 3 4 or referenced in this section, the commission shall notify 5 the surface owner of receipt of the per well site surety bond or other guaranty or the establishment of a blanket 6 bond or other guaranty based on the oil and gas operator's 7 written notice required under 8 request and the 9 30-5-402(e). The commission's notice shall also include a 10 description of the amount and the type of the bond or 11 guaranty received or established and provide to the surface the statement required under 12 owner a copy of 13 30-5-403(a). If, at the expiration of thirty (30) days 14 after receipt of the commission's notice by the surface owner, he makes no objection to the amount or the type of 15 the surety bond or guaranty, the commission shall approve 16 the surety bond or guaranty. If the surface owner objects 17 in writing to the amount or the type of the surety bond or 18 guaranty, the commission shall give immediate consideration 19 20 the surety bond or guaranty objected to and the 21 accompanying papers filed by the oil and gas operator in 22 support of the surety bond or guaranty amount and the type of surety bond or guaranty submitted or established, and 23 the surface owner's objections, and the commission shall 24

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render a final decision as to the acceptability of the 1 amount and type of the surety bond or guaranty and shall 2 3 notify the parties of the decision. Proof of any 4 additional surety bond or guaranty required by the 5 commission shall be filed with the commission within thirty days of the commission's final decision. 6 (30) Any aggrieved party may appeal the final decision of the 7 commission to the district court in accordance with the 8 9 Wyoming Administrative Procedure Act.
