## A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to the administration of government;
- 2 specifying accounts from which state budget recommendations
- 3 may be directed; specifying statutory budget reserve
- 4 amounts apply to supplemental and emergency budgets;
- 5 specifying that agency budget requests shall be utilized to
- 6 interpret and implement provisions of the appropriations
- 7 bill as specified; and providing for an effective date.

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9 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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- 11 **Section 1.** W.S. 9-2-1012(e), 9-2-1013(d)(ii) and
- 12 28-1-113(a), (c) and by creating a new subsection (d) are
- 13 amended to read:

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9-2-1012. Duties of budget division; transmittal of standard budget and manual; return of completed exception and expanded budgets; submission to governor; disposition of excess general fund appropriations; submission of selected budget information to joint appropriations interim committee.

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8 preparing the overall state budget (e) In for 9 distribution to the legislature, including any supplemental 10 or emergency changes to the budget, the governor shall recommend to the legislature that not less than five 11 12 percent (5%) of estimated general fund receipts for the 13 next biennial budget period shall be appropriated from the 14 general fund to the budget reserve account within the earmarked fund. This appropriation shall be in addition to 15 16 any fund balance within the budget reserve account. At the 17 each biennial budget period, general fund of appropriations for the biennium in excess of expenditures 18 19 including encumbrances during the biennium, as identified 20 by the state auditor in accordance with the provisions of W.S. 9-2-1008 and 9-4-207, shall be transferred into the 21 budget reserve account. All funds in the budget reserve 22 23 account shall be invested by the state treasurer and

- 1 earnings therefrom shall be credited into the general fund.
- 2 Appropriations to the account shall not lapse at the end of
- 3 any fiscal period. Expenditures from the budget reserve
- 4 account shall be by legislative appropriation only.

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- 9 (d) In addition to the items contained in subsection
- 10 (a) of this section and notwithstanding any other
- 11 recommendations made by the governor, the state budget
- 12 shall also include the governor's recommendations for
- 13 appropriations for the ensuing two (2) years, or if a
- 14 supplemental budget request, the remainder of the budget
- 15 period, subject to the following:

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- 17 (ii) The total recommended appropriations under
- 18 this subsection for any two (2) fiscal year budget period
- 19 shall not exceed the total estimated revenues for that two
- 20 (2) year period. The total estimated revenues computed
- 21 under this paragraph shall not include increases in
- 22 existing revenue sources which would be available to the
- 23 state only after enactment of legislation in addition to

existing law, but shall include the unencumbered balances 1 2 in all other accounts in all other expendable funds subject 3 to this section, and as further provided herein, as those 4 funds are identified in accordance with standards promulgated by the governmental accounting standards board, 5 but specifically excluding pension funds, nonexpendable 6 trust funds, debt service funds and intragovernmental 7 8 funds, that would be available for that budget period. 9 Funds within the permanent Wyoming mineral trust fund 10 reserve account created under W.S. 9-4-719(b), the common 11 school permanent fund reserve account created under W.S. 12 9-4-719(f) or funds within five percent (5%) of estimated 13 general fund receipts for the next biennium to be 14 appropriated to the budget reserve account as required by W.S. 9-2-1012(e) shall not be included in total estimated 15 16 revenues computed under this paragraph;

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28-1-113. Joint meetings of 18 legislative standing 19 committees; introduction and passage of budget bill.

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21 (a) The joint appropriations interim committee shall 22 sit in open sessions while considering the budget and shall 23 begin meetings not less than twenty (20) days prior to the

convening of the budget session. The joint committee may 1

2 cause the attendance of the heads or responsible

3 representatives of the departments, institutions and all

4 other agencies of the state to furnish information and

5 answer questions as the joint committee requires.

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(c) The joint committee shall cause the general 7 8 appropriation bill or bills known as budget bills, to be 9 introduced in whole or in part in the house 10 representatives or the senate, or both. When a budget bill 11 has passed the house of origin, the bill shall be referred 12 to the standing appropriations committee of the opposite house which shall meet and consider those amendments to the 13 14 budget bill which were adopted by the house of origin and 15 shall not propose other amendments to any original joint appropriations interim committee budget bill.

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(d) To the extent not inconsistent with any enacted law, each agency's budget request as recommended by the governor to the joint appropriations interim committee and any other budgetary explanatory material submitted to the joint appropriations interim committee by the governor shall guide the interpretation and implementation of

appropriations contained within the general appropriations
bill or bills appropriating funds to be expended for the
operation of a state agency, including programs, purposes
and number of employees specified within each agency.

Section 2. This act is effective July 1, 2015.
