6 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

- 10 (a) The Wyoming spending and government efficiency
 11 commission is created to review issues related to
 12 efficiencies in Wyoming state government. The commission
- 12 CITICICIES IN WYOMING State government. The commission

shall consist of not more than six (6) members. Three (3)

- 14 members shall be appointed by the management council of the
- 15 legislature of whom one (1) shall be from the private

- 1 sector and one (1) each from the senate and house of 2 representatives. Two (2) members shall be appointed by the
- 3 governor, of whom one (1) shall be from the private sector.
- 4 One (1) member shall be appointed by the chief justice of
- 5 the Wyoming supreme court but shall be a nonvoting member.
- 6 No member of the commission shall be a state employee. The
- 7 commission shall elect a chairman from among its two (2)
- 8 legislative members.

- 10 (b) Members who are not legislators shall receive per
- 11 diem and travel expenses in the same manner and amount
- 12 provided under W.S. 28-5-101.

- 14 (c) The commission shall meet at the call of the
- 15 chairman or the governor as necessary to complete the
- 16 duties specified by this section.

- 20 (i) Review the current configuration of the
- 21 Wyoming state government and the duties and
- 22 responsibilities of state agencies including identifying
- 23 any potential areas of overlap and any programs that have

accomplished their original objective or have otherwise 1 2 become obsolete; 3 4 (ii) Identify current opportunities for 5 increasing efficiency and reducing costs through executive 6 action or legislation; 7 8 (iii) Identify areas for further including a recommendation of specific areas with a high 9 likelihood for potential savings; 10 11 (iv) Consider development and implementation of 12 a program to incentivize the identification of potential 13 efficiencies by state employees; 14 15 16 (v) Examine the opportunities for savings in the Medicaid program subject to the following: 17 18 19 The examination shall determine the (A) 20 error rates in Medicaid enrollment through the Medicaid 21 eligibility system, error rates in continuing enrollment in

Medicaid and the costs of these error rates;

(B) The commission is authorized to cause 1 2 an audit of a sample of Medicaid enrollees to determine the 3 error rates in enrollment and continued enrollment and the 4 potential savings from correcting the error rates. The 5 audit may be done by state personnel or through a contract with a private firm, or both; 6 7 8 (C) The examination shall include a review 9 of the Medicaid system to detect and correct errors in 10 billing for Medicaid services; 11 12 (D) The examination shall inquiry concerning how the Medicaid program could reduce 13 expenditures by reducing unneeded utilization of Medicaid 14 15 services. 16 (e) The commission shall report the results of the 17 review under this section and any recommendations to the 18 19 governor and the management council of the legislature not 20 later than November 30, 2017. Recommendations under this

subsection may include:

1 (i) Legislation necessary to implement current opportunities for increasing efficiency and reducing costs 2 3 in state government; 4 (ii) Recommendations to continue the commission 5 for additional review of issues related to efficiencies in 6 Wyoming state government or to assign review to another 7 8 group; 9 (iii) Opportunities related to the use of 10 11 consulting services to assess the operations of state 12 government in order to increase savings, provide operational efficiencies and maximize state revenues 13 including identifying the amount of annual savings that 14 could be achieved. 15 16 17 (f) The commission may contract with such experts as necessary to fulfill its duties under this act. 18 19 20 (g) The commission shall exist until December 31, 2017. 21

There is appropriated seven thousand eight 7 (a) 8 hundred dollars (\$7,800.00) from the legislative stabilization reserve account to the legislative service 9 10 office. This appropriation shall only be expended for the purpose of providing reimbursement for members of 13 the Wyoming spending and government efficiency commission 14 appointed by the management council. Notwithstanding any 15 16 other provision of law, this appropriation shall not be 17 transferred or expended for any other purpose and any 18 unexpended, unobligated funds remaining from this 19 appropriation shall revert as provided by law on June 30,

This 4 appropriation shall only be expended for the purpose of providing reimbursement for members of the Wyoming spending 5 and government efficiency commission appointed by the 6 governor. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, this 7 8 appropriation shall not be transferred or expended for any other purpose and any unexpended, unobligated funds 9 10 remaining from this appropriation shall revert as provided 11 by law on June 30, 2018.

There is appropriated five hundred thousand 13 (C) dollars (\$500,000.00) from the legislative stabilization 14 15 the governor's office. reserve account to This 16 appropriation may be expended by the governor to secure 17 contracting to implement and realize cost savings and efficiencies in areas identified in the report by the 18 commission under section 1 of this act. 19

Section 4. This act is effective immediately upon completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming Constitution.
