A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to education; requiring passage of an examination on the principles of the constitutions of the 2 3 United States and Wyoming to receive a high school diploma, associate degree or baccalaureate degree; specifying 4 5 examination requirements and composition; providing legislative findings; and providing for an effective date. 6 7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 8 9 Section 1. W.S. 21-9-102 is amended to read: 10 11 12 21-9-102. Instruction in state and federal 13 constitutions required; satisfactory examination а 14 prerequisite to graduation; composition of examination. 15

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1 <u>(a) The state of Wyoming finds that the study of</u> 2 <u>American civics encompasses what it means to be a good</u> 3 <u>citizen, fosters an understanding of how government works</u> 4 <u>and informs citizens on how they can participate and</u> 5 <u>influence their government.</u>

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(b) All schools and colleges in this state that are 7 8 supported in any manner by public funds shall give instruction in the essentials of the United States 9 constitution and the constitution of the state of Wyoming, 10 11 including the study of and devotion to American institution 12 and ideals., and no student shall receive a high school 13 diploma, associate degree or baccalaureate degree without 14 satisfactorily passing an examination on the principles of 15 the constitution of the United States and the state of 16 Wyoming. The instruction shall be given for at least three 17 (3) years in kindergarten through grade eight (8) and for 18 one (1) year each in the secondary and college grades.

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20 (c) No student shall receive a high school diploma,
21 associate degree or baccalaureate degree without
22 satisfactorily passing an examination on the principles of

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the constitutions of the United States and the state of 1 2 Wyoming. 3 4 (d) Beginning school year 2018-2019, the examination 5 required to receive a high school diploma shall consist of 6 one hundred (100) questions identical to the questions the United States citizenship and immigration services may ask 7 8 an individual during the application process for United 9 States citizenship in accordance with 8 U.S.C. § 1423. To 10 pass the examination, a student shall answer correctly not 11 less than sixty percent (60%) of the examination's 12 questions. A student may take the examination as many times 13 as necessary to pass it. 14 15 This section is subject to a student's (e) 16 individualized education program under the federal Individuals with Disabilities Education Act, as amended. 17 18 19 Section 2. W.S. 21-2-304(a)(iv), as amended by 2016 20 Wyoming Session Laws, Chapter 113, Section 1, is amended to 21 read: 22 23 21-2-304. Duties of the state board of education.

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1 2 (a) The state board of education shall: 3 4 (iv) In consultation with local school 5 districts, establish requirements for students to earn a high school diploma as evidenced by course completion and 6 passage of an examination on the principles of the 7 8 constitutions of the United States and the state of Wyoming 9 in accordance with W.S. 21-9-102, and as measured by each 10 district's assessment system prescribed by rule and 11 regulation of the state board and required under W.S. 12 21-3-110(a)(xxiv). Once every five (5) years and on a 13 staggered basis, the state board shall through the 14 department, review and approve each district's assessment 15 system designed to determine the various levels of student 16 performance as aligned with the uniform state standards and 17 the attainment of high school graduation requirements as evidenced by course completion and passage of 18 an 19 examination on the principles of the constitutions of the 20 United States and the state of Wyoming in accordance with 21 W.S. 21-9-102. In addition and following review, refinement and revision of student content and performance standards 22 23 adopted under paragraph (a)(iii) of this section and

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1	reviewed under subsection (c) of this section, the board
2	shall establish a process to ensure district assessment
3	systems are aligned with the refined and revised standards
4	within three (3) full school years following adoption of
5	revised standards;
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7	Section 3. This act is effective July 1, 2017.
